LEAF PICK-UP & DROP-OFF 2017

KEEPING CLARKSTOWN CLEAN



Dear Resident:
Fall is here and the beautiful picturesque landscape around us will soon lead us to raking leaves in our yards.

The Highway Department wants to help you keep your properties clean and attractive. We will provide curbside loose leaf pick-up for Town residents (except in the Village of Spring Valley and the Village of Upper Nyack) between October 30 and November 30, 2017.

Please help us by following the dates and rules outlined in this brochure.

Be sure to have all loose leaves curbside no later than November 30th to ensure that they are picked up before our leaf pick up collection ends. There is no leaf pick up after December 18, as we have to remove leaf pick up equipment from our trucks to prepare for snow removal.

LOOSE LEAF PROGRAM RULES

Loose Leaf Pick-Up Program

Clarkstown Highway Department:
845.623.7500

- › Pile loose or biodegradable bagged leaves on your lawn or curbside no earlier than October 30 and no later than November 30, 2017.
- › Plastic bags are not acceptable.
- › Pick-up of yard waste including brush, twigs, branches, and logs is suspended until April 2018.
- › A tarp or mesh container helps to keep loose leaves in place.

Loose Leaf Drop-Off Program

Residents may bring their leaves to the Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority, Rt. 303, West Nyack, NY 845.358.0759

- › This drop-off site is for residents only, no commercial vehicles.
- › Residents must use the designated entrance on Rt. 303.
- › Twigs, branches, and logs must be separated from leaves and grass.
- › Plastic bags are not acceptable.

SAFETY REMINDER

Please pile all loose or bagged leaves on the lawn. For the safety of our children, school bus drivers, and the population-at-large, do not pile leaves in the street (pursuant to the

NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law, Section 1220), at an intersection, at school bus stops, near fire hydrants, or over storm drains.

BIODEGRADABLE BAGS

Collection of biodegradable leaf bags is a separate operation for the Highway Department as it is faster, easier, and requires less manpower and heavy equipment. During the leaf season and throughout the winter, we will pick up biodegradable bags filled with leaves. Yard waste pick-up of twigs, branches and logs will resume in April 2018.
