

TOWN BOARD MEETING

FEBRUARY 14, 1938

The minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

Mr. DeGraw and Mr. Lang appeared before the Board in regard to fixing Pierce Street in Nanuet.

Mr. Blauvelt advised them to submit a petition, after which the Supt. of Highways will look over the road and make a report to the Board.

Mr. Blauvelt said that Chief Liebert and he had met with Mr. Bennett in Nanuet in regard to the speed signs. The signs have been cut down to 25 miles per hour, and Mr. Bennett says that nothing less than 30 miles per hour can remain on a State highway. The State will remove the signs if the Board so desires.

Mr. Baker moved that the State Department of Public Works be notified to take down the signs.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Assemblyman Murray in regard to school tax money and the reduction of dog licenses.

Mr. Blauvelt said that he had received a letter from the Association of Towns in regard to the lowering of the dog licenses. They say that it will mean a lowering of the revenue, and for that reason is not good legislation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that these resolutions be spread upon the minutes of the Town Council of the Town of Clarkstown and that a copy be sent to the family of Judge Tompkins.
