

TOWN BOARD MEETING

APRIL 11TH, 1938

The minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

Mr. Blauvelt read a communication from the Civic Board of Clarkstown in regard to the extension of gas mains in the Town of Clarkstown by the Ramapo Gas Corporation.

Mr. Baker moved that the attention of the Civic Board be called to the letter of January 31, 1938 from the Rockland Gas Co., Inc. and Mrs. Buchenau's letter of February 16th, 1938 to Mrs. Vivian M. Knapp.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Mr. Werner Boecklin in regard to the upkeep of Congers Station Plaza Park.

Mr. Edward wells spoke relative to the origin of this park and the work accomplished there so far, and urged that the Board do everything possible towards its upkeep.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, confer with Mr. Werner Boecklin and ascertain just what hs to be done in the matter of upkeep, and if the cost is within reason, to proceed with the work.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Amy Eckhart, Secretary of the Forest Glen Garden Club in regard to the upkeep of the plaza at the Valley Cottage Railroad Station.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, confer with Mrs. Eckhart and ascertain just what has to be done in the matter of upkeep, and if the cost is within reason, to proceed with the work.

Mr. Blauvelt read a resolution from the Clarkstown Land & Home Owners' Association in regard to the relocation of Route #59 at West Nyack.

The Board accepted the resolution and ordered it placed on file.

Mr. Blauvelt said that he had seen Mr. Davidson in the matter of the survey of the Town line at Centenary, and there has been no report made as yet.

Mr. Blauvelt read a communication from the New Jersey and New York Railroad Company in regard to a piece of property owned by them in Nanuet, which residents of Nanuet desire to convert into a park. The railroad desires more definite information relative to the piece in question.

It was decided that Mr. Blauvelt get in touch with Mr. Harry Knapp in regard to the matter and report at the next meeting of the Board.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Henry Steinmann, thanking the Board for the action taken in regard to giving relief orders to Clarkstown merchants.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Rockland Co. Good Roads association in regard to the dangerous intersection of Pascack Rd. and the Old Nyack Turnpike.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the letter be referred to Mr. Walter Liebert, Chief of Police.

Mr. Blauvelt read a communication from the Central Nyack Welfare Association in regard to the meetings of the Town Board.

Mr. Baker moved that the Central Nyack Welfare Association be advised that, if they will communicate with the Board when they wish to bring matters of importance to its attention, the Board will be glad to arrange an evening meeting convenient to all concerned.
