

## TOWN BOARD MEETING

MAY 9, 1938

The minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

Mr. Baker moved that the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion be informed that they are allowed \$50.00 for Memorial Day observance, and that they submit the bill they incur to the Town Board for payment.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling Carried

Mr. Eberling moved that Stanley Russell of Congers be appointed Fire Policeman for the Congers Fire District in the place of Edwin Swartwout.

Seconded by Mr. Jacobsen Carried

Mr. Baker moved that William North of Valley Cottage be appointed Republican Inspector of Election for District #8, Town of Clarkstown in place of James Hartwick previously appointed.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling Carried

Mr. Jacobsen moved that the cemeteries in the Town be properly cared for, and that the Supervisor employ whatever assistance is required for this work.

Seconded by Mr. Baker Carried

Mr. Blauvelt said that the three certificates of indebtedness have been paid, and that the Town is now entirely out of debt. The amount of money saved by prepaying these certificates is \$239.42.

Mr. Crippen appeared before the Board and read a letter from the Hillside Scenic Protective Association, urging that the Town of Clarkstown be zoned as soon as possible. He further urged that

something be done by the Board towards appointing a Chairman of the Zoning Board, providing one has not already been named by the Zoning Board itself.

Mr. Baker informed Mr. Crippen that he had received a letter from Mr. Harold S. Deming, a member of the Zoning Board, which indicates that the Board has almost finished preparing its report, and that as soon as more information is received from experts now touring the town, the report will be forthcoming.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that Mrs. Buchenau write Miss Natalie Couch and ask if she will give the Board some information relative to drawing up an ordinance in regard to Boarding Houses in the Town and the right of the Board to control them, this of course to be without legal charges.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Rockland Gas Corp. in regard to the extension of gas mains in Clarkstown, and in which they say that the extension will be made at once.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Civic Board of Clarkstown in regard to the installation of street lights in Clarkstown.

Mr. Baker moved that two tax refunds be paid, one to Percy Coyle in the amount of \$2.78 and the other to Alfred Bathel in the amount of \$2.60.

Mr. Victor Smith appeared before the Board in regard to the Deming property and the establishment of the line between the townships of Clarkstown and Ramapo. Mr. Smith said that no petition has ever been

presented to the Town of Clarkstown requesting the moving of the Town line and placing the Deming property in Ramapo.

Mr. Smith was requested by the Board to retain the Deming property on his books until the matter is definitely straightened out.

There was no report on the pin ball machines or the peddlers licenses.

Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, reported on the Valley Cottage Station Plaza and the Congers Station Plaza. He said that the work had been accomplished at very little cost and that most of the work was being taken care of by the Highway department.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the school books be called in by at least the close of the school year, thus enabling the School Districts in securing funds at an earlier date, so it will not become necessary for them to borrow.

Mr. Jacobsen reported that a comment had been made at the Conservation Dinner, complimenting the manner in which the minutes and records of the Town Board are kept.

Mr. Klein offered figures on a new grader.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that Mr. Klein make his own decision in purchasing the new grader with all equipment.
