

TOWN BOARD MEETING

JUNE 13TH, 1938

The minutes of the previous meeting and special meetings were adopted as read.

Mr. Thomas Blanche appeared before the Board and requested that street signs be placed in the Clarkstown section of Spring Valley, in order that residents there may be able to have carrier mail service.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, procure the 19 street signs required and that he also erect the required number of cedar posts for the signs.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Naurashank Post No. 794 of the American Legion, in which the Legion requested the Town to take care of the maintenance of the Legion Park in Nanuet.

Mr. Blauvelt read the letter of Mrs. Buchenau to Attorney General A. J. Bennett dated May 11th and his reply of May 12th, also a letter of July 7, 1937 with reference to the fees of a doctor for

examining people arrested while intoxicated.

Mr. Liebert, Chief of Police, reported on this matter and said that this same question was brought up two years ago, and that Major Warner of the State Police had ruled that no town would have to pay this charge, when the arrest is made by a trooper, since the State maintains a budget for this charge. He further indicated that all bills should be sent to Lieutenant Reilly in charge of the Monroe barracks for payment.

Mr. Eberling suggested that the doctors be notified to send all bills to the proper State authorities, where arrests of drunken drivers are made by the State Police, and that the State troopers be notified accordingly.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that Mr. Ronan, Dist. Engineer, concrete the business section of New City.

Mr. Baker moved that the Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized to purchase under Section 142 of the Highway Laws from H. O. Penn Machinery Co., Inc. with approval of the County Superintendent of Highways:

one #10 "Caterpillar" Diesel Auto Patrol, equipped with "V" scarifier, enclosed cab, lights, and "V" type Snow Flow, tandem drive

for a total price of \$5950.00 delivered at New City, N.Y.

The terms of payment are as follows:

Trade-in allowance on Gallion Grade, pneumatic tires \$600.00. The balance or net price in amount of \$5350.00 to be paid by four Certificates of Indebtedness as listed below:

First:	\$1337.50	Payable	March 14th, 1939
Second:	\$1337.50	Payable	March 14th, 1940
Third:	\$1337.50	Payable	March 14th, 1941
Fourth:	\$1337.50	Payable	March 14th, 1942

Certificates to bear interest at 4%; interest to be payable annually.

Certificates and interest payable at Nanuet National Bank and the Supervisor and Town Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to issue

The Board discussed informally the proposed change of speed limit through Nanuet from 25 miles per hour to 30 miles per hour and said they thought it best to leave the speed limit as it is at present.

Mr. Blauvelt said that he had taken up the matter of the extension of water through Church St. and Smith St. in Nanuet with the Hackensack Water Company. The water company figures that it will cost about \$2000. to replace the paving if the water mains are put through, and they cannot pay this amount and also extend the mains.

It was decided to hold this matter up until Mr. Eberling can make a further investigation and report at the next Board meeting.

Mr. Kleckner appeared before the Board and asked that the Surplus Store be included in the Accident Insurance policy of the Town.

Mr. Baker read a letter from Harold S. Deming relative to zoning, and also a draft resolution.
