

TOWN BOARD MEETING

AUGUST 15, 1938

The minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

Mr. Blauvelt reported that he had consulted an attorney on the peddlers licenses but no definite action had yet been taken in regard to drawing up an ordinance in this regard.

Mr. Paul Wolf appeared before the Board and presented additional petitions in regard to zoning, with the request that they be placed on file.

A proposed ordinance, a copy of which is hereinafter set forth, licensing plumbers, which had been recommended by a petition signed by nine plumbers residing and doing business in the Town of Clarkstown, was read to the Board, and on motion of Councilman CHARLES EBERLING, seconded by Councilman NORMAN R. BAKER, it was

RESOLVED, that a public hearing on said proposed ordinance be held at the next regular meeting of the Board on September 12th, 1938, at 2:00 P. M., and it was further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is directed to give notice of a public hearing by publishing the same in The Journal-News, a daily newspaper circulating in the Town of Clarkstown, on the 22nd day August, 1938, which is at least ten (10) days prior to the date specified for such hearing, which notice shall specify the time when and the place where such public hearing will be held and shall contain a copy of the said proposed ordinance.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE LICENSING PLUMBERS

IN THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN

ARTICLE I

The Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, County of Rockland and State of New York, hereby ordains, enacts and publishes as follows:

Section 1. The doing of any plumbing or plumbing work in the Town of Clarkstown by any person, firm or corporation, is hereby prohibited, except by or through persons holding a license issued by the Town Board of the

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Town of Clarkstown, certifying that the holder is competent to do and perform such work within said Town.

Section 2. All applicants for such license must appear in person before the Town Board and submit such proof by documentary evidence, by an oral or written examination, or otherwise, as will enable the Town Board to determine the fitness and competency of the applicant to receive such license.

Section 3. A license fee of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars per annum is hereby imposed, which must be payable in advance. All licenses shall expire on December 31st of each year. Where the license is issued subsequent to January 1st of any year, the license fee will be prorated in accordance with the length of time that the license has to run.

ARTICLE II

Penalty

Section 1. All persons violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars for each day that such violation exists. The doing of plumbing or plumbing work on each day shall constitute a separate violation of this ordinance.

Section 2. The Town Board hereby also ordains that a violation of this ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct and that any person violating the same shall be deemed a disorderly person. The Town Board also may enforce obedience to this ordinance and restrain the violation thereof by injunction.

ARTICLE III

In Effect

Section 1. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE LICENSING PLUMBERS IN THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN

ARTICLE I

The Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, County of Rockland and State of New York, hereby ordains, enacts and publishes as follows:

Section 1. The doing of any plumbing or plumbing work in the Town of Clarkstown by any person, firm or corporation, is hereby prohibited, except by or through persons holding a license issued by the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown certifying that the holder is competent to do and perform such work within said Town.

Section 2. All applicants for such license must appear in person before the Town Board and submit such proof by documentary evidence, by an oral or written examination, or otherwise, as will enable the Town Board to determine the fitness and competency of the applicant to receive such license.

Section 3. A license fee of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars per annum is hereby imposed, which must be payable in advance. All licenses shall expire on December 31st of each year. Where the license is issued subsequent to January 1st of any year, the license fee will be prorated in accordance with the length of time that the license has to run.

ARTICLE II

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Section 2. The Town Board hereby also ordains that a violation of this ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct and that any person violating the same shall be deemed a disorderly person. The Town Board also may enforce obedience to this ordinance and restrain the violation thereof by injunction.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that at the conclusion of said public hearing, the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown will vote upon the enactment of said ordinance.
