

TOWN BOARD MEETING

JANUARY 9, 1939

Present: Mr. Eberling

Mr. Blauvelt called the meeting to order.

Mr. Blauvelt explained that representatives from the Nanuet, New City and West Nyack Election Districts had been requested to meet with the Board to discuss the creation of a new election district. He further stated that the Board had been requested to create this new district, due to the fact that it is almost impossible to vote the large enrollment in the Nanuet Election District within the time specified. Mr. Blauvelt read the law and explained that a new district could be created where the convenience of the voters in the district would be best served.

Mr. Joseph Lynch of New City, and Election Inspector, said that he had not had the opportunity to discuss this matter with the other election officials and committeemen and suggested that the matter be postponed until such time as the opinions of these men could be obtained.

Mrs. Jensen appeared and said that she would like to see the district created in Bardonia, as she felt this would help the community. She also felt that many people registered in the Nanuet district would not go to vote, because they had to wait so long in line before casting their vote, as they have to vote the people at the rate of almost 100 per hour. She also said she would not like to see the new district affect any other present district, but urged the splitting of the Nanuet district.

Mr. Clarence Brown, an Election Inspector at the Nanuet pole, said that the vote cast at the last election in his district was approximately 1050, and that the inspectors found it very difficult to get the votes in within the time allotted.

Mr. Arthur Evans said he felt that some adjustment could be made without the creation of a new district, and he felt that he would like to discuss the matter with other inspectors and committeemen.

Mr. Komonchak, a committeeman of the West Nyack District, said that it had been the opinion of those in this district that a new district should have been created a long time ago. He further added that there would be no infringement upon the West Nyack District, if the school district line were followed in the formation of the new district.

Mr. Blauvelt advised those present that the cost of the proposed district had not yet been determined. He said, however, that he believed a voting machine would cost about \$1000. and there would be additional charges for polling places and services of election officials.

Mr. John Elliott, a committeeman of the New City District, said that the entire committee were opposed to taking any part of the New City district. He said he felt it would be well to have available the cost of what the creation of the new district would be before anything is decided. He mentioned the fact that there might have to be 3 maps made as well as three surveys before the district can be formed.

Mrs. Jensen said she felt that the new district would not take anything from New City, but possibly a part of West Nyack, and thus the cost might not be quite so much.

Dr. Gilchrest suggested that those present - committeemen and inspectors - get together and talk the matter over and report at the next meeting of the Board on February 13th, 1939. The use of the Town Clerk's office was granted to this group for their meeting.

Mr. Romaine of Rose Rd., Spring Valley, appeared before the Board and requested that approximately 150 feet of road near his residence be taken over by the Town and paved.

Mr. Blauvelt advised Mr. Romaine the qualifications of a road required before it can be taken over by the Town.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the matter be referred to Supt. Emil Klein for his attention, and that he report at the next meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling

Mrs. Buchenau read the minutes of meetings held on December 12th, December 15th and December 28th.

Mr. Baker moved the minutes be adopted as read.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the 1% fee on State, County and Town taxes be omitted for the first 30 days.

Mr. Blauvelt advised that the deed of Mrs. Fischer Williams had been referred to an attorney, and that counsel had advised sending it back to the Erie Railroad for some corrections.

Mr. Eberling brought up the question of a condition on Smith St. in Nanuet, where water flowing on the street from either a septic tank or overflowing well had frozen and caused injury to a man.

Mr. Klein reported that this matter was up to the owners of the property on this street and not an obligation of the Town.

Mr. Eberling moved that Mr. Blauvelt's bonds as Supervisor, namely, General, Highway and School be accepted.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Frank C. Moore, Executive Secretary of the Association of Towns, in regard to the Annual Meeting of that association.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that Mr. Blauvelt attend the Association Meeting and represent the Board, his expenses to be paid by the Town, and that any other members of the Board who wish to join him go also.

Mr. Eberling moved that the Town Clerk address a letter to the Association of Towns advising them that the Town Board of Clarkstown favors the proposed four-year term for the Town Clerk and Supervisor in addition to that of Supt. of Highways.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the Chief of Police be authorized to purchase two emergency kits, one for each police car, and that the kits be replenished and brought up to date when needed, and that he also purchase a Lux extinguisher.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that an ordinance be drawn up licensing junk dealers and junk yards in the Town of Clarkstown, and that it be presented at the next Town Board meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling Carried

Mr. Baker moved that an ordinance licensing pin ball machines in the Town of Clarkstown be drawn up and presented at the next Town Board meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Jacobsen Carried
