

## TOWN BOARD MEETING

April 8th, 1940

Present: Dr. Gilchrest

Mr. Goebel

Mr. Jacobsen

Mr. Blauvelt called the meeting to order.

Mrs. Buchenau read the minutes of the previous meetings held March 11th, 1940, March 29th, 1940, and a Public Hearing held March 29th, 1940.

Mr. Jacobsen moved the minutes be adopted with a slight change in the meeting of March 11th, 1940 as follows: "Railroad to move the station and not build a new station".

Seconded by Mr. Goebel

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Civic Board of Clarkstown enclosing a resolution opposing the expenditure of any money by the Town to improve the West Nyack Station grounds.

Mr. Jacobsen defended the improving of the West Nyack Station grounds and said it would be a benefit to the entire town, since commuters from every part of Clarkstown and even the county used the station.

Mr. Blauvelt then read another letter from the Civic Board of Clarkstown opposing the licensing of peddlers and bringing up the question of a tax for buses.

Dr. Gilchrest defended the licensing of peddlers. He pointed out that action had been taken in this matter only after a request had been made by various merchants in the town requesting relief from outside peddlers.

Dr. Gilchrest moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, application has been made by Albert E. Frost to refund the sum of seventy eight cents, being the amount of the taxes illegally levied in the year 1919, and paid by him on real



Dr. Gilchrest moved the following resolution:

On motion of Councilman J. T. Gilchrest, seconded by Councilman B. Otto Jacobsen, it was

RESOLVED from and after the adoption of this ordinance that a parking space for two (2) passenger busses be reserved on the west side of Main Street in New City, New York, approximately opposite the Office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Clarkstown and that appropriate signs be erected to indicate that the space between them is reserved for the parking of passenger busses only, and that after the erection of such signs, no vehicles except passenger busses shall be permitted to park within the space thus reserved.

FURTHER RESOLVED that all vehicles parking on either side of Main Street in New City, New York, between First Street and Congers Road shall at all times park parallel to the curb and so that the nearest wheels are not more than four inches therefrom and between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A. M. and 7:00 P. M. no vehicle shall park for a longer period of time than one hour except Sundays and holidays for which days no parking limit is established.

FURTHER RESOLVED that a violation of any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance shall be and hereby is declared to be a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of one (\$1.00) dollar for the first offense and by a fine of not to exceed ten (\$10.00) dollars or imprisonment in the County Jail for not to exceed five (5) days for the second and each subsequent offense.

FURTHER RESOLVED that a public hearing on said ordinance be held in the Clerk's office, New City, New York at 3:00 o'clock P. M. at the next regular meeting of the Board on the 13th day of May, 1940.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be, and she hereby is directed to give notice of such public hearing on said ordinance by publishing the same once in the Journal-News, a daily newspaper published in the Village of Nyack and having a general circulation in the Town of Clarkstown, which publication shall be at least ten days before such hearing.

Mr. Tellefsen appeared as a representative of the New City Business Mens Club and requested the Town Board to put up street signs in New City from Laurel Road to New Hempstead Road.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that Emil Klein, Supt. of Highways, be appointed as a committee of one to confer with the New City Business Mens Association and erect signs as they designate not to exceed \$125.00.
