Mr. Blauvelt called the meeting to order, and requested the reading of the minutes.

Mr. Lombardi appeared as spokesman for various men who collect garbage and refuse in the Town of Clarkstown. He told the Board that these men had been dumping their refuse and garbage in Haverstraw, but that Haverstraw will no longer allow this. Neither Ramapo nor Clarkstown will permit any dumping, and so they are faced with the problem of no place to dump the garbage and refuse collected. He asked the Board to create a dump. He indicated that it was his opinion that some property could be found in Clarkstown suitable for such a thing, that would not be near a highway or a stream.

The Board then discussed the matter at length, and Mr. Blauvelt advised Mr. Lombardi that if he could find a suitable place, the Board would be willing to call a special meeting.

Mr. Blauvelt then appointed Mr. Goebel as a committee to meet with the garbage collectors to work out this problem.

The matter of taking over Oak Street, Pine St. and Sunrise Ave. in New City as a Town Road was brought to the attention of the Board.

Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, reported that he found the roads met all requirements of town roads.

Mr. Eberling moved that Oak St., Pine St. and Sunrise Ave. in New City be accepted as town roads in accordance with a deed dated Sept. 25, 1940, providing the Town Attorney has found the same in order.

The Board then witnessed another demonstration of the Monroe Calculating Machine.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Mr. George M. Edsall regarding burglary and robbery insurance and advising that it is now legal to purchase such insurance.

The matter was referred to the insurance committee.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Civic Board of Clarkstown, opposing a building code for the Town of Clarkstown.

Mr. Jacobsen suggested that the Town Clerk write a letter to Vivian M. Knapp, Secretary, Civic Board of Clarkstown, and advise that the matter of a building code for Clarkstown had been recommended by the Zoning Board of Appeals, but that the Town Board had rejected their recommendation.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the New York Telephone Company recommending the grouping of all town officials under four sections, namely, New City, Nanuet, Congers and Nyack.

After discussing the matter at length, the Board decided to lay the matter on the table for the present.

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Mr. Blauvelt reported that the Congers Station Plaza and the Valley Cottage Station Plaza had been taken care of.

Mr. Blauvelt advised the Board that he would take care of the cleaning up of the cemeteries in Clarkstown.

Mr. Klein reported on Green Road in Van Houten Field development. He reported that Mr. Smith wants \$500. for the right of way. He said that the property in question was almost 2 acres.

After discussing the matter, the Board decided to lay it on the table.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that the Highway Supt., Emil Klein, get three bids for a new grass cutter, and that he be authorized to purchase the cutter inasmuch as he has enough money in his road machinery and equipment account.

Mr. Blauvelt appointed Mr. Jacobsen as a committee of one to meet with the water commissioners at their convenience.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Zoning Board of Appeals in which they request that they be permitted to function under the rules adopted at the organization meeting, at which time a secretary and chairman was appointed.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that in accordance with the letter received from the Zoning Board of Appeals that the resolution adopted April 28th, 1941 appointing Gustave Winko as Chairman of the Board of Appeals

be rescinded, and that Reginald Herdman be appointed Chairman of the Board of Appeals for a period of one year.
