

## TOWN BOARD MEETING

JUNE 9, 1941

Town Clerk's Office

3:00 P. M.

Mr. Blauvelt called the meeting to order, and requested the reading of the minutes.

Mrs. Buchenau read the minutes of the Town Board meeting held May 12th, 1941.

Dr. Gilchrest moved that the minutes be adopted as read.

Seconded by Mr. Goebel

Mr. Goebel told the Board he wanted it known that he had been specifically appointed as a Committee to look into the matter of garbage and its disposal and that the minutes of the Town Board show his appointment. He said that the newspaper had reported Mr. Edwards as saying that he had no authority to act, and that Mr. Jacobsen was the only one appointed by the Board to work out the garbage situation. Mr. Goebel further added that the Stone property on Congers Rd. had been opened for the dumping of garbage with the consent of Mr. Blauvelt and Mr. Eberling. He said that the dump was well back from the road, that it was only temporary and was not understood to be permanent.

Mr. Jacobsen told the Board that he did not know of this dump until he received petitions from residents of Congers opposing it, and that neither he nor Dr. Gilchrest had been consulted about the opening of the Stone property for dumping purposes. He said he had visited this property and found it in a bad condition. He indicated that he felt no dump should be created in Residence A district.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Spring Valley Water Works & Supply Co. regarding a fire hydrant on Nyack Turnpike east from College Ave. in Nanuet, in which they advise that 528 feet of pipe will be required to reach the point designated, and that there is not sufficient business to warrant the proposed extension.

Mr. Eberling told the Board he felt it would be too expensive to install the hydrant and that it would not be fair to the rest of the district.

Mr. Eberling moved that a letter be written to Mr. Theodore Warner of Nanuet, explaining the matter, and advising the reasons why the Board does not feel justified in installing the hydrant.

Seconded by Dr. Gilchrest

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from the Civil Aeronautics Administration at Washington, regarding the inspection of the Garrett Miller property at West Nyack and other properties in the Town suitable for commercial development, and advising that the matter had been referred to the Regional Manager.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from W. Reginald Herdman, Chairman of the Board of Appeals, regarding the appointment of a member of the Board of Appeals to take the place of David I. Edwards whose term of office expires June 19th, 1941, the effective date of his resignation.

Mr. Jacobsen told the Board that in view of Mr. Edwards' resignation, he would like to bring before the Board for consideration the name of Fred F. Rockwell of West Nyack, who is connected with the New York Times.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that Fred F. Rockwell be appointed a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals for a term of five years, effective June 19th, 1941 and expiring June 19th, 1946.

Mr. Blauvelt read a letter from Louis Barberis asking why he did not receive any consideration when appointments were made to the police force, inasmuch as he headed the Civil Service list.

Mrs. Buchenau was directed to write a letter to Mr. Barberis advising that appointments are made in accordance with the recommendations of the heads of departments, and to further advise that Chief Liebert made recommendations, and the Board made the appointments accordingly.

Mr. Jacobsen gave a report on the meeting he had with the Village of Nyack Water Commissioners regarding the extension of the Central Nyack Water District. He said that the proposed extension will entail quite a bit of expense, about \$1000., but that the Water Company wants to cooperate in every way possible.

Mr. Eberling moved the Town Board Meeting be adjourned to go into Board of Health Meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Jacobsen

After discussing matters pertaining to health in Board of Health Meeting on motion of Mr. Goebel seconded by Dr. Gilchrest the Board reconvened into regular Town Board Meeting.

The Board discussed the purchase of a Monroe Calculating Machine at length, and it was finally decided to look at a few other machines before making the final decision.
