Mr. Wexler told the Board that Mrs. Pedersen is working on the deeds for rights of way in New City Park. He said she had put a great deal of time and effort into this work. On the matter of Town ordinances, Mr. Wexler reported to the Board that he had been able to secure copies of ordinances from various townships, and that he had gone into the matter in detail with Chief Liebert. He recommended that a committee be appointed to sit in with Chief Liebert, Mr. Klein and himself to go into the matter.

Mr. Blauvelt appointed the entire Town Board to act as a committee on the matter of Town ordinances, the committee to meet on Friday, Sept. 15th, 1944 at 2:30 P.M.

Upon inquiry of Chief Liebert regarding the Sanitary Code, Mr. Wexler said he felt that the provisions of the Sanitary Code should be included in the new ordinances to be prepared.

A letter from Glenn C. Miller was ordered placed on file.

Chief Liebert brought to the attention of the Board the old Becker property in West Nyack which still continues to be a dangerous hazard. In this connection, Mr. Klein said that the Fire Commissioners in West Nyack had gone on record as recommending that this building be torn down.

Mr. Blauvelt told the Board that he understood the property had changed hands and that it no longer belonged to the Becker Est.

The Board then requested Mr. Liebert to take up this matter with the new owner.

Chief Liebert reported on the Miller Dump in West Nyack. He said that it is in much better condition, and that Mr. Miller is cleaning it up. There is only one entrance to this dump, and only a limited number of

people are permitted to use the dump. A list of these people had been given to the police department.

Mr. Dickenman moved that the Board adjourn to go into Board of Health Meeting.
