

1. New York Trap Rock Corporation vs. Town of Clarkstown:

In this action the plaintiff was successful in vacating notice of examination before trial which was served in 1943 and which had been held in abeyance until return of Mr. Sterling Tomkins to this country. This action should be disposed of in 1946. The file contains in addition to correspondence a copy of the petition of New York Trap Rock Corporation dated June 7, 1939; the objection of New York Trap Rock Corporation to the proposed zoning ordinance dated March 30, 1939; the printed petition of New York Trap Rock Corporation dated October 14, 1942 for a certificate of occupancy for quarry purposes; summons and complaint in the action dated and verified June 19, 1943; stipulation extending the defendant's time to answer; original and copy of the answer verified September 29, 1943; original notice of examination before trial dated November 17, 1943; copy of order to show cause dated November 27, 1943 and affidavit of the same; the defendant, Town of Clarkstown's notice before trial; stipulation adjourning indefinitely the motion to vacate defendant's notice of examination; miscellaneous memorandum and editorials and resolution of the Town Board; vicinity map of Huntington property compiled by Palisades Interstate Park Commission; blueprint of the survey of New York Trap Rock Corporation's property dated December 1, 1928; original and copies of stipulation of substitution of attorneys; original and copy of affidavit of Lester D. Stickles sworn to October 11, 1945 in opposition to the motion to vacate notice of examination before trial and memorandum in connection therewith; copy of order of Justice Mortimer B. Patterson made November 20, 1945 granting plaintiff's motion and vacating the notice of motion of examination before trial.

III. Application of Miller, Schek and Besso for Change of Zoning Map, West Nyack, New York;

I enclose application of Garret Miller dated August 10, 1945; letter of Jerome Trachtenberg, Esq. dated September 14, 1945 on behalf of Ned A. Besso and application of Harry Schek dated September 14, 1945; letter of Kate Buchenau, Town Clerk dated September 18, 1945; miscellaneous correspondence together with map furnished by applicant Miller and sketch of Besso property; I have been holding this matter pending a more satisfactory description of the parcel South of Route 59.

IV. New City Park Corporation.

In accordance with the offer I made some months ago I have furnished to Mr. Roald Hall on behalf of the property owners on Lindbergh Lane, New City Park, the proposed deeds to be executed conveying a 5 foot strip for street purposes adjoining Lindbergh Lane as presently laid out. None of these deeds have been returned. The following instruments are hereby returned:

King and Betty King and Charita Collins dated May 3, 1945 (not acknowledged); Nora T. Hansen and Gertrude K. Burtenshaw (not dated and acknowledged); Daniel D. Pedersen, Reinhard Hall, Knut J. Olsen, Lillian E. Selb and Ethel Lockman dated April 12, 1945 (not acknowledged); New City Park

Corporation dated October 7, 1945 and acknowledged December 5, 1945; undated and unacknowledged deed of Ruth Wilkinson and Esther H. Nelson; Gurine Eriksen and others not dated and not acknowledged; Tobias B. Opsal and others dated March 13, 1945 (not acknowledged); with respect to the missing deeds which were delivered to the Town conveying a 5 foot strip for road purposes on Hanson "venue, Roosevelt Place and Nansen Court, I regret to advise that no progress on this has been made. You will recollect that Mrs. Thomas Pedersen agreed to furnish file copies of these deeds from which new deeds were to be made up and also that this lady agreed to assist in having the proposed new deeds executed. No file copies of the missing deeds nor any other information was submitted to me and the Town of Clarkstown is presently in the anomalous position of having acquired these streets for road purposes without any record evidence of its interest.

V. In addition, I attach original tracing of Forest Glen Road which was turned over to me by my predecessor, (property of Thomas R. Bierds), and letter of N.F. Ronan, Department of Public Works, County Assistant Engineer for Rockland County together with Building Zone Map and blueprint therein referred to.

VI. Map entitled "Preliminary Plan Memorial Park, Spring Valley, Rockland County, N.Y. dated June, 1945 by O. G. Aselin, Engr.

Van Orden; Correspondence file in connection with the matter of Herman Jaede, an inmate of the County Home; Correspondence file in connection with Glen C. Miller claim relative to fees for building permit; Correspondence file in connection with William C. Eliminated the very bad turn on Mt. View Avenue, Valley Cottage from 12' to 21' and subbased the roadbed with 1½" stone with a 3" road mix top for a distance of 450'.

Eliminated the island on Park Place, Nanuet and built a 21' - 1½" stone asphalt penetration job.

Rebuilt Burda Avenue for a distance of .70 miles from 12' to 18' wide, subbased the shoulders with 1½" stone and put a 4" road mix top on.

Hansen Avenue, Roosevelt Place and Nansen Court in New City Park, a distance of .30 miles have been covered with a 3/4" asphalt penetration job.

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Numberous bridge abutments which were undermined by the heavy July flood have all been replaced.

14,300 feet of snow fence have been erected.

Sixty-two miles of Town Highways have been surface treated.

Bad turns and soft shoulders have been eliminated.
