

TOWN BOARD MEETING

June 14th, 1946

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Dillon, who requested the reading of the minutes.

The Town Clerk then read the minutes for the last regular meeting held on May 10th, 1946. The reading of the minutes for the special hearing held on May 10th were dispensed with.

Mr. Eberling moved that the minutes for the last regular meeting be approved and adopted.

Seconded by Mr. McIntyre

Mrs. Edgar Polhemus appeared before the Town Board as spokesman for a group of New City people, and requested the Board to take some action in regard to a road south of New City near the former Johnson Stand. She informed the Board that the road was 33 feet in width and of the dirt type, also that it had been there for a number of years.

Mr. Dillon advised Mrs. Polhemus that the Town requires a 50 foot right of way before any road can be accepted.

Mrs. Polhemus then inquired if the road could be accepted if the people residing along said road were to buy the necessary property to make the fifty foot right of way, and then have the people deed it to the Town.

Mr. Dillon then said that the question of a 50 foot right of way was now being taken up with the State, and that as soon as a definite reply was received, he would contact her.

Mr. Garrett Miller of West Nyack appeared before the Board regarding a change of his property in West Nyack from Residence A to Business B. He told the Board that he had submitted his application for this change last fall, but that no action was taken at that time. Mr. Miller also presented a petition of Wilbur Van Dorn for a change in the zoning of his property,

Mr. Edward Roepe appeared before the Board, representing a group of Central Nyack people, regarding the establishment of a sewer district in Central Nyack. He told the Board that in the formation of a sewer district, an

engineering survey must be prepared first, and that up to July 1st, 1946 the Post-War Planning Commission will pay up to 50% of the cost of such a survey. He said that Mr. William Yuda, a Pearl River engineer, had been retained to work on the proposed sewer district, and that a map had been prepared. He then presented a map of the proposed district.

Mr. Yuda explained to the Board the course of the proposed district, stating that possibly some changes would have to be made where they are believed necessary. He repeated Mr. Roepe's statement that the Post-War Planning Commission will pay up to 50% of the cost of an engineering project up to July 1st, and he further informed the Board that he understands the State is giving a great deal of consideration to water and sewer projects. He also stated that a survey would have to be submitted to the State Dept. of Health.

Mr. Roepe then introduced the group from Central Nyack who appeared with him, and Mr. Haring, Vice-Chairman of the group, acted as spokesman. He told the Board that the situation as far as sewerage is concerned is terrible in Central Nyack, and that the sewer district is urgently needed. He said that a recent canvass of the sentiment of the community indicated that about 99% of the people favored the sewer district. He said he hoped the Board would approve the engineering survey.

Mr. Dillon then told the Board that the group wanted the Town Board to request the Post-War Planning Commission to grant an application for an engineering survey. Since it was estimated the cost of such a survey would be approximately \$1,000. it was his understanding the State would pay 1/2 of the cost, and the Town would pay the other 1/2, the Town's share to become a part of the cost of the district when formed.

Mr. Roepe then concluded his remarks by telling the Board that the sewer district was desperately needed from a health standpoint, and that he hoped the Board would give it their immediate consideration.

Mr. Eberling moved the following resolution, which was seconded by Mr. Schmersahl and on roll call unanimously adopted:-

WHEREAS, the State of New York has indicated, pursuant to Chapter 660 of the Laws of 1943, that it will contribute 50% of the cost of the plans of approved municipal projects within the limits set by such chapter, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Clarkstown wishes to make application for a grant towards the cost of the preparation of the plans for the Central Nyack

Sanitary Sewerage System and Sewerage Treatment Plant in behalf of the Hamlet of Central Nyack; Now, Therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Clarkstown submit this project for consideration by the New York State Postwar Public Works Planning Commission with the request that an allocation be granted by such Commission for 50% of the cost of the preparation of the plans of such projects, and be it further

RESOLVED, that when and if such Commission approves any or all of this project, and when and if such Commission allocates one-half of the cost of the preparation of the plans of such approved project, the Town of Clarkstown will make available a sum equal to that allocated by the Commission

Mr. Eberling moved the Board adjourn to go into Board of Health Meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl Carried

After discussing matters pertaining to health in Board of Health Meeting, on motion of Mr. Eberling, seconded by Mr. McIntyre and unanimously carried, the Board reconvened into regular Town Board meeting.

Mr. Chelleni of Nanuet, representing a group of garbage collectors, appeared before the Board, and asked for permission to dump garbage in the Town of Clarkstown, since the dumps in Orangetown where they have been disposing of their collections have been closed down to them. He said that the people want their garbage removed, but that there is no place for them to dump it.

Mr. Dillon then informed the group that there was nothing the Town Board could do, as there is an ordinance which forbids the dumping of garbage anywhere in the Town.

Mr. Stahl then asked if the Board could not give the men some assistance, giving them a temporary permit until they can find a place to dispose of their garbage.

Mr. Dillon again repeated that the Town Board had no authority to give permission to dump garbage in the town. He said that the Board could not tell the collector what they could do; they were telling them what they couldn't do.

Mr. Dillon then reported that thus far he has been unable to get an appraisal on the Irion property. He said that he would like to suggest the Board consider as a site for the Town Hall the piece of property now owned by the County where the old Highway Garage was located. He said that the garage is now being torn down, and that the County may be willing to sell the property to the Town at a figure far below those now being considered.

In connection with the proposed Town Hall, a sketch was shown of a piece of property 144' x 350', owned by Mr. Henry Schriever, south of New City, which he would sell to the Town for approximately \$5,000.

Mr. Schmersahl moved that the Supervisor be authorized to get an estimate from the County for the piece of property on New Hempstead Road, which has been the site of the County Garage.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling

The Board decided to table the site for the Town Hall until a price can be obtained from the County on its property on New Hempstead Road.

Mr. Trachtenberg told the Board that he had secured a copy of the suggested fire ordinances, but that he hadn't had an opportunity to study them. He told the Board that he would report on this matter at the next meeting.

Mr. McIntyre and Mr. Eberling reported to the Board that they had investigated the awning on the Receiver of Taxes office and it was their recommendation that the Town give the awning to Mr. Leo.

Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, asked the Board if they would be agreeable to an increase for his highway men to take effect July 1st, He said that he had sufficient money in his account to take care of it.

The Board told Mr. Klein that they were agreeable to his granting an increase in pay to his men.

Mr. Trachtenberg told the Board that he had received word from the State Traffic Commission that Signal Light #21 in Valley Cottage at the Four Corners would be reconsidered. As soon as he receives word from the State, he will submit a report to the Board.

In regard to the New City Park roads, Mr. Trachtenberg advised the Board that there may be a way of taking over the roads without the extra five feet. He said that his letter to the Attorney General was referred to the Dept. of Public Works. He has been advised that if the Town Board applies to the Supt. of Public Works for a certificate approving the dedication under Section 171 of the Highway Law, it may be possible to take over the roads as they are. He said he wondered if it might not be best for the Town to apply to the Supt. of Public Works and clear up the New City Park roads.

The Board requested Mr. Trachtenberg to look further into the matter and see what can be done about the roads.

Mr. Trachtenberg reported that he met with the Zoning Board of Appeals, and they are anxious to know how the Building Code is progressing.

In regard to a Planning Board, Mr. Dillon and Mr. McIntyre had candidates to offer. However, the other members of the Board did not have any names to present, so it was decided to hold this matter over until the next meeting.

Mr. Trachtenberg then told the Board that the Town is being sued for damages arising out of an accident last fall with a Highway Truck.

The Board requested Mr. Trachtenberg to turn the papers over to the insurance agent.

Chief Liebert then told the Board that about a year ago the Nanuet Civic Association asked for a parking limit in Nanuet between Flamik's Corner and the Four Corners. He told the Board that approximately 300 buses pass through Nanuet each day. He said that he felt a one hour parking limit would be a good thing, and that Mr. Ronan was agreeable to such a limit as far as the State was concerned.

The Board expressed themselves as approving such a parking limitation, but requested Mr. Trachtenberg to check the law, as the Highway is a State road, and proper resolutions will have to be drawn.
