## TOWN BOARD MEETING

MAY 13, 1949

Mr. Dillon called the meeting to order.

Mr. Welchman moved that the minutes for the last regular meeting be approved and that the reading of same be dispensed with.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl

Carried

Mr. Lester Banta of Nanuet appeared regarding the taxi parking stands in Nanuet. He told the Board that since the new set-up went into effect giving the bank six hours parking, only two depositors have gone to the bank. He further told the Board that he cannot work with his competitor, and he asked them to change the present rules.

The Board then advised Mr. Banta that they would consider the matter further and advise him of their decision.

Mr. Charles Orlando then appeared and asked the Board to postpone decision on the Weinberg application for a change of zoning until the next Board meeting, which will be held on June 10th, 1949.

The Board advised Mr. Orlando that they would hold up final decision on Mr. Weinberg's application until the next meeting.

Mr. Jerome Trachtenberg appeared and told the Board that a few people from West Nyack wished to speak to the Board regarding the splitting of the West Nyack Election Dist.

Mr. William Vines told the Board that the people in West Nyack have been in a hullabaloo ever since the last Board meeting when the West Nyack Election Dist. was split, as they feel they have one of the finest polling places in Clarkstown. They want to know not only why the district was split but they also are present to request that the Board rescind the resolution.

Mr. Harry Schek then told the Board that he could talk from experience on this matter, as he was a former Republican Committeeman in West Nyack. He stated that he and Mr. Dillon sat in on a proposal to split the district two

years ago, and at that time the matter was brought to the attention of both parties and also the council was represented. It was decided that there was no reason to split the district, as the voters were comfortably accommodated in their polling place. Mr. Schek told the Board that if a change was contemplated, he felt that some of the people should have been consulted, or at least somebody's attention called to the proposed change before an official action was taken. He said that insofar as he knew this was not done, and he was a member of the Republican Committee for a long time. Mr. Schek further told the Board that he observed from being at the polling place during election days that no one ever complained. He then read a petition signed by over 400 people, asking that the resolution to split the district be rescinded. He then said that he personally feel there is no necessity for the change.

Mrs. Olive Goetschius then told the Board that she was responsible for obtaining a good many of the names on the petition, and that she had been asked by the people why the split was made. She said that the people also told her that they were never inconvenienced at the firehouse. Mrs. Goetschius then asked the Board why the election district was changed if everyone is satisfied. She then asked who suggested the change.

Mr. Fibble then told Mrs. Goetschius that he had been asked to appear before the West Nyack Civic Association regarding this matter, and that he would like to wait until after Monday night before explaining the reasons for the change.

Mrs. Goetschius then told the Board that she didn't think the matter should wait until after Monday night, and that the people had come before the Board for an explanation as to why the district was split.

Mr. Dillon then told the Board that he saw no reason for waiting to discuss the matter, since the Council had passed the resolution to change the district.

Mrs. Goetschius then asked Mr. Schmersahl where the request to change the district came from, as he had discussed the matter with her earlier in the evening, and she wanted him to repeat what he had told her.

Mr. Schmersahl then told Mrs. Goetschius that the request to change the district came from the Chairman of the Republican Town Committee.

Mrs. Goetschius then asked the Board to consider their action and rescind the resolution.

Mr. Ed Harring appeared and told the Board that he was on the committee for the past twenty-five years, but that he isn't a committeeman anymore. He

told the Board that he did not agree that the district should be changed, as they have the best poll of any in the Town. If there is a large district, Mr. Harring asked if it wouldn't be possible to apportion some of the voters into another district. He said that some of the people could go to Bardonia much easier than to West Nyack. If they put a polling place in the West Nyack School, the school would have to be closed on election day. In this regard, he told the Board that he has heard the school trustees do not know anything about the poll being placed in the school. He told the Board that any change has always been brought to the attention of the two committees, and it was not done in this case. He said that he did not think this was fair.

Mr. Trachtenberg then told the Board that the people were present because they are interested and also on behalf of the people whose names appear on the petition. He told the Board that a district is split when it serves the convenience of the voters. He said he questioned whether this has been carefully surveyed. He told the Board that West Nyack has the best voting poll in the county, as there is ample room, light, heat, ventilation and parking space. People who desire may purchase their lunch and dinner there also, as the Ladies Aux. of the Fire Company serves both downstairs. He said that the people expect some courtesy from the Board as to whether they want to split the poll. He told the Board that he had seen something happen here where a person appeared before the Board and asked a question of one of the Councilmen and was denied answer. He then stated that if people couldn't ask the Board a question, who could they ask. Mr. Trachtenberg further told the Board that the people in West Nyack are of the opinion that something was being foisted upon them that they didn't want. Last year when it was a presidential election, Mr. Trachtenberg stated, approximately 856 votes were cast. He then asked the Board to rescind the resolution.

Mrs. Goetschius then told the Board that she had heard that one polling place would be upstairs in the firehouse and the other polling place downstairs. She inquired if this were true.

Mr. Dillon advised Mrs. Goetschius that it was his opinion the resolution was presented without any idea as to where the polling place would be.

Mr. Theodore Johnson appeared as a representative of the West Nyack Civic Association, and he requested that the Town Board defer action on this matter until the Civic Association has had an opportunity to study it.

Mr. Vines then told the Board that at the last meeting of the Civic Association there were about 28 people present, and over 25 of these people are on the petition asking that the resolution be rescinded.

Mr. B. Otto Jacobsen appeared and told the Board that he was a member of the Republican Committee in West Nyack, and that he knew nothing about the change. He said he regretted the splitting of the district and wished the Board would rescind the resolution.

Mr. Harring then told the Board that he felt something should be done.

Mr. Eberling then moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that the resolution to split Election Dist. #3, West Nyack, be rescinded.

Mr. Trachtenberg then told the Board that he felt they were putting the cart before the horse, and that they should rescind the resolution.

Mr. Schek then inquired of the Board what further information they required. He told them that he was under the impression that before the resolution was passed the matter was studied. He stated that the people have proved their case and he asked why any further time was needed to meditate and think the matter over. He then asked Mr. Fibble, who presented the resolution, why he needed further time.

Mr. Fibble then told Mr. Schek and the group present that he wanted more time to study the matter. He told them that he had been invited to appear before the West Nyack Civic Association on Monday evening regarding the splitting of the West Nyack Election Dist. and that he wanted to wait until then to explain the splitting of the district.

Mrs. Goetschius then told the Board that there will not be 400 people at the meeting as there are on the petitions presented tonight. She again asked them to give the matter their consideration.

Mr. Harring then told the Board that he went to the two ladies on the committee and they told him they were never asked if they approved of the change. He further told the Board that the women were called one day before the resolution was presented and were told the district would be split. At the time, Mr. Harring stated, the women objected to the change and said so.

Mr. Fibble then told the group that he acted in good faith and that he presented the resolution for the West Nyack Republican Committee.

Mr. Schek then informed Mr. Fibble that this was not true.

It was again brought out that the request to change the West Nyack Election Dist. came from the chairman of the Republican town committee.

Mr. Stanley Partridge then told the Board that if anyone went out in West Nyack with petitions to split the district, they couldn't get any signatures. He told them that the resolution should be rescinded, as the people do not want the district.

Mr. Dillon then told the group that the Board would consider the matter further.

Mr. William Furno then appeared regarding the parking signs in West Nyack. He told the Board that he has been checking and that he found only a small portion of the day when there is congestion. He told them further that he has been in West Nyack for 27 years and that he has been losing \$150.00 per month because of the signs. He asked the Board to consider the matter further and see if something cannot be done about the signs.

Mr. Stanley Partridge then inquired regarding the petition before the Board to widen the road.

Mr. Dillon advised Mr. Partridge that Mr. Klein, Supt. of Highways, will start work on the road very shortly.

Mr. Frank Kemmer, President of Nanuet Fire Company, appeared and requested permission to close off Prospect St. in Nanuet from July 11th to July 16th inclusive.

Mr. Eberling moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that Prospect St. in Nanuet be closed off from July 11th, 1949 to July 16th, 1949 inclusive.

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Mr. Roepe and Mr. Fred Engels appeared regarding an ordinance for boarding houses and nursing homes where aged and infirm people are dwelling. They stated that a meeting was held last week with representatives of the Rockland County Volunteer Firemens Association, and five points were agreed upon as the least requirements they should have. They are as follows:-

1. In buildings where there is not adequate fire protection, there shall be an outside exit for every story above the first floor.
2. There shall be one fire extinguisher for every three rooms.
3. Kitchen and cellar shall be equipped with carbon dioxide extinguisher.
4. Over every exit, there shall be an exit light.
5. All exit doors shall be at least 3 feet wide and open outward and shall be equipped with a panic bar.

Mr. Engels then told the Board that the program was promulgated by the Rockland County Volunteer Firemens Association, as they are aware of the danger that exists in the nursing homes. Most of the places are buildings that are not equipped for a rescue or other means of livesaving. Mr. Engels told the Board that at the present time there are no restrictions on any buildings, and that because of recent disasters, it was thought there should be some control. He asked the Board to give it consideration.

Articles XVII and XVIII of the Town Ordinances adopted December 18th, 1945,  
and as amended and renumbered are hereby renumbered as Articles XVIII and  
XIX respectively, and a new Article XVII added to said ordinances, as follows:

Article XVII - DOGS

Section 1. - No person owning or harboring a dog shall permit such dog  
to run at large within the unincorporated portions of the Town.

Section 2. - Any peace officer may seize and confine any dog running  
at large in violation of this Article.

Section 3. - Any person violating this Article shall be subject to a  
penalty of twenty-five dollars for each such violation to be recovered  
in a civil action in the name of the Town.

This ordinance shall become effective upon publishing and posting as  
required by law.

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and that the people are well taken care of. He informed the Board that he would not recommend a change in the present rules.

The Town Clerk was requested to advise Mr. Banta that the rules regarding taxi stands in Nanuet will remain as they are at the present time.

Bills Nos. 359 to 451 on Warrant No. 5, amounting to \$11,965.11 were audited and ordered paid.

There being no further business, Mr. Eberling moved adjournment.
