

TOWN BOARD MEETING

November 9, 1950

Mr. Dillon called the meeting to order.

Mr. Welchman moved that the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting be dispensed with.

Seconded by Mr. Fibble.

Carried.

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board an application for a change of zoning from Mr. A. C. Goebel of New City.

Mr. Fibble moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, A. C. Goebel, has petitioned the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown that the Building Zone Ordinance of the said Town be amended by redistricting property of the said petitioner and in said petition described from "Residence A." to "Residence B.",

BE IT RESOLVED, that a public hearing pursuant to Sections 265 and 264 of the Town Law be had at the office of the Town Clerk, Main Street, New City, New York, on the 8th day of December, 1950, at 8:30 P.M. in the evening relative to such proposed amendment, and it is,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney prepare notice of such statutory hearing and that the Town Clerk cause the same to be published as aforesaid and file proof thereof in the office of the said Clerk.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

AYES: Messrs. Schmersahl, Fibble, Welchman, Eberling, Dillon.

NOES: None

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board a petition from a group of residents on Strawberry Lane in West Nyack. The petition stated that Strawberry Lane in its present condition constituted a health and fire hazard, since it was impassable in wet weather and during the winter months. The petitioners asked the Board to take over the street as a Town Highway and assume responsibility for its repair, snow removal and upkeep.

The matter was referred to the Town Superintendent of Highways.

Mr. A. M. Pantol of Congers came before the Board and requested a change of zoning of his property in Congers. Mr. Pantol presented to the Board a map of the property, but did not have a description or petition.

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Mr. Dillon informed Mr. Pantol that a written petition and a description and survey of the property must be submitted to the Board before any action could be taken on this matter.

Mrs. Elsie Monneret, Receiver of Taxes for the Town, came before the Board and asked why the \$700 for an extra clerk had been excluded from her budget for 1951. She explained that the extra clerk was very necessary in order that her work could be finished on time and the returns made to the County Treasurer.

Mr. Welchman informed Mrs. Monneret that the Board was under the impression that the Addressograph, which had recently been purchased for use in her office, would reduce the amount of work that had to be done and that the new tax bills which were being used had simplified the system so that an extra clerk was no longer necessary.

Mrs. Monneret informed the Board that although the system had been simplified by the machine, it had not reduced the amount of work at times when the tax returns were received. She asked that the funds for the hiring of the extra clerk be included in her budget.

Mr. Dillon told Mrs. Monneret that since the budget had already been adopted, it could not be increased. He suggested that she petition the Board at such time that the clerk was necessary and the matter would be decided at that time.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from the New Jersey and New York Railroad concerning the grade crossing on Prospect St. in Nanuet. The letter stated that the crossing was private property and that the public had no right to use it. The letter went on to say that the situation would be investigated to see if any action should be taken by the railroad.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from the New York Central System concerning the condition of the grade crossing in Valley Cottage. The letter stated that the matter would be called to the attention of the Division Engineer for correction.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from Mr. N. F. Ronan, County Assistant Engineer of the Department of Public Works, concerning the condition of the road shoulders along Route 303 in Congers. Mr. Roman stated in his letter that a road crew was working on the highway from Valley Cottage north along 303, and that any repairs necessary would be made.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from Mrs. Katherine Piscitelli of New City. Mrs. Piscitelli asked the Board to consider her for the appointment of Dog Enumerator.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that Charles Draudt, Valley Cottage, New York, be appointed Dog Enumerator for the Town of Clarkstown.

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Seconded by Mr. Fibble.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

Mr. Dillon read a letter from the New City Business Men's Association. The letter stated that the re-alignment of Scratch-Up Road should be paid for by the New York Trap Rock Company and not by the taxpayers.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from Mr. Irving G. Kennedy, Attorney for the Town in the matter of DuPlantier vs. the Town of Clarkstown. Mr. Kennedy stated in his letter that he had submitted an answering affidavit to the Court Clerk, Mr. Wadsworth, as directed by the Court, but had not as yet received the reply papers from Lexow & Jenkins. Mr. Kennedy went on to say that he hoped to have pictures taken of the Miller area for use at the trial and that he appreciated the cooperation and courtesies extended him by Town Clerk August Hansen and Deputy Town Clerk Charles Adams.

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board a petition from a group of 35 residents on Rose Road in Nanuet. The petition asked that the East Nanuet Water District be extended to take in Rose Road.

Mr. Dillon explained to the Board that the cost of such a project was prohibitive to the taxpayers in this section and he did not think that the Water Co. would extend the water line through Rose Road. Mr. Dillon informed the Board that he would contact the petitioners and have them appoint a committee to appear before the Board at the next meeting.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from the Nanuet Fire Engine Company concerning the low water pressure in the Grandview Ave. section of Nanuet. The Fire Company asked that the water pressure be increased from 20 lbs. to 40 lbs.

The Town Clerk was instructed to send a copy of the letter to the Spring Valley water Company.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from the State Department of Agriculture and Markets explaining the duties of the Dog Enumerator.

The Town Clerk was instructed to send the letter to Mr. Draudt for his information.

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board the monthly reports of the following Town Officers and Departments:-

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The Board then adjourned from Town Board meeting to a public hearing to consider a petition for the improvement of Hughes St. in Congers.

Mr. Carl Winkleman and Mr. John Welisch of Hughes St. came before the Board to testify in favor of the proposed improvement.

No one appeared before the Board in Opposition.

Mr. Fibble moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that the deed of Leland F. and Doris Stone, Susie Welisch, Maria Boca, Anna Winkleman, Antonio and Anna Silva, Anna Hilgarth, and Charles and Fanny Haas, to the Town of Clarkstown dedicating Hughes Street in Congers as a public highway, be and the same is hereby accepted, and the said road be included in the Town Highway system.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling.

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board a deed for Fenner Lane in Nanuet, from John Fenner to the Town of Clarkstown.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that the deed of John Fenner to the Town of Clarkstown, dedicating Fenner Lane in Nanuet as a public highway, be and the same is hereby accepted, and the said road be included in the Town Highway system.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

Mr. Dillon read to the Board a report from Emil Klein, Supt. of Highways, in which Mr. Klein stated that Judith and Fredric Streets in Denis Acres were acceptable as Town highways, but that Charles Street should not be taken over by the Town since there were no houses on it.

Mr. Dillon read a letter to the Board from Pesner and Bloom, Attorneys for Celia Denis, asking Mr. Roepe, Town Attorney, to strike out the description of Charles Street in the Deed and Certificate of Title since it would not be accepted by the Town.

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Mr. Fibble moved the following resolution:-

WHEREAS, a written petition dated August 4, 1950, was duly filed with this Board requesting the improvement of Hughes Street in said Town, beginning from the intersection of West View Ave. and Hughes Street to the end of said Hughes Street at the southerly line of lands now or formerly of Congers Park Realty Company, by paving with oil top or macadam in accordance with the Town Specifications as contained in Resolution of the Town Board of March 14, 1947, and whereas, said petition was duly signed by owners of real estate owning real estate to the extent of at least one-half of the entire frontage or bounds on both sides of said Hughes Street and also by resident owners owning not less than one-half of the frontage owned by resident owners residing in or along Hughes Street between the points aforesaid, and whereas the said petition was duly acknowledged or proved as to each signer in the same manner as required of a deed to be recorded and whereas, at a meeting of said town board duly called and held on October 10, 1950, an order was duly adopted by it and entered in its minutes, reciting the filing of such petition, the improvement proposed and the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the improvement as stated in the petition, to wit, the sum of \$1,000, and specifying that the said Board would meet to consider the petition and hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, at the Town Clerk's Office at Main Street, New City, in the said Town of Clarkstown on the 9th day of November, 1950, at 9:00 o'clock in the evening; and whereas, the said order, duly certified by the Town Clerk, was duly published and posted as required by law, to wit, a duly certified copy thereof was published in the Journal News, the official newspaper of this town, on October 25, 1950, and copies of such order posted on October 25, 1950, conspicuously in five public places within the district to wit, on telephone poles numbers 7, 51, 52, 53, on the said Hughes Street, and on an electric light pole at the end of Hughes Street, and whereas, a hearing was duly held by this Town Board at the place and on the date and time hereinbefore mentioned, and at such place and time, the said Town Board did duly consider the said petition and hear all persons interested, NOW THEREFORE, after such hearing and upon evidence given thereat and pursuant to the provision of Section 200 of the Town Law of the State of New York, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that this Board does hereby determine that it is in the public interest to make the improvement petitioned for, to wit, by paving with oil top or macadam in accordance with the Town Specifications as contained in Resolution of the Town Board of March 14, 1947; and it is further,

RESOLVED, that E. C. Getty, a civil engineer, who is hereby employed for that purpose, shall prepare definite plans and specifications and make a careful estimate of the expense, and with the assistance of Edward G. Roepe, Esq., the Town Attorney shall prepare a proposed contract for the execution of the work; and that such plans and specifications, estimate and proposed contract shall be presented to this board as soon as reasonably possible, and it is further,

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RESOLVED, that E. C. Getty, a civil engineer who is hereby employed for that purpose, shall survey the portion of the said highway proposed to be improved, and establish the lines and grades thereof, marking out upon the ground the side lines of the lands owned or held by this Town for highway purposes; and that he shall place such survey and a profile of the grade of such highway upon blueprints; that there shall be at least three complete sets of blueprints prepared showing such survey and a profile of the grade, one of which shall be filed in the Town Clerk's office, and the remaining two of which shall be delivered to this Board; and that the sum of \$50.00 is hereby appropriated from the contingent fund to pay the cost of making such survey and of preparing such blueprint.

WHEREAS, this Town Board has met at the time and place specified in the notice of public hearing on the Preliminary Budget and heard all persons desiring to be heard thereon; now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that such Preliminary Budget be and hereby is adopted as the Annual Budget of this Town for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1951, and that such Budget as so adopted be entered in detail in the minutes of the proceedings of this Town Board, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of this Town shall prepare and certify in duplicate, copies of said Annual Budget as adopted by this Town Board, together with the estimates, if any, adopted pursuant to Section 202-a, subd. 2, of the Town Law, and deliver one copy thereof to the Supervisor of this Town to be presented by him to the Board of Supervisors of this County.

After returning to a Town Board meeting, Mr. Dillon read a letter from the Zoning Board of Appeals concerning an application for a Trailer Camp Permit received from Mrs. Madeline Keahon of Congers. FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the New York State Traffic Commission.

We would like to have an oil burner installed, but we know if we should run out of oil, the delivery man will not drive in to us.

Q. What is your name?

A. John Welisch.

Q. Where do you live?

A. Hughes St., Congers, New York

A. I do.

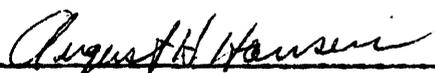

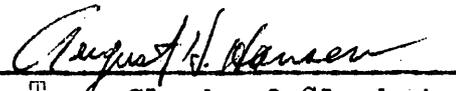
