Mr. Dillon called the meeting to order.

Mr. Dillon presented to the Board the Annual Reports of the year 1950 of the following Town Officers and Departments:-

Emil Klein, Town Supt. of Highways, then came before the Board and requested permission to receive bids for a new sand spreader for the Highway Department. Mr. Klein said that another sand spreader was needed during the winter months to sand icy roads and could also be used during the summer months for spreading gravel.

Mr. Eberling moved that the Supt. of Highways be granted permission to receive bids for a new sand spreader.

Councilman Eberling informed the Board that he and Councilman Welchman had visited the Receiver of Taxes office recently in an effort to determine whether or not she needed an extra clerk in her office during the period when taxes were collected. He stated that both he and Mr. Welchman had gone over all phases of her work and that neither he nor Mr. Welchman felt that the extra clerk was needed.


Mr. Dillon then said that in the event that the Receiver of Taxes was permitted to hire an extra clerk, the clerk should be hired only for the period for which she was actually needed and no longer. Mr. Dillon also said that the \$700 which had been excluded from the Receiver of Taxes budget was entirely too much, and that if a clerk was hired for a shorter period of time, \$400 should be sufficient.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Eberling moved adjournment.

Seconded by Mr. Welchman.
