Mr. Dillon called the meeting to order, explaining that it had been called to consider the application of Patrolman John Jackomin to transfer from the Clarkstown Police Department to the Police Department of the Village of Upper Nyack.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that the application of Patrolman John Jackomin of the Clarkstown Police Department to transfer from the Clarkstown Police Department to the Police Department of the Village of Upper Nyack, be and the same is hereby approved, and will become effective as of March 31, 1951.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

Mr. Dillon said that he had received the list of eligibles from the Civil Service Commission for the position of Patrolman. He stated that the only name on the list was that of John Westervelt of Rockland Lake who was now acting on a provisional basis.

Mr. Eberling moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that John Westervelt, Rockland Lake, New York be permanently appointed Patrolman to the Clarkstown Police Department at an annual salary of \$2,700.00, the appointment to become effective March 30, 1951.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

Mr. Dillon informed the Board that he had received a letter from Frederick Rohloff of Haverstraw requesting an appointment to the Clarkstown Police Department. Mr. Rohloff said that if he was appointed he would move to Clarkstown.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:-

RESOLVED, that Frederick Rohloff be provisionally appointed as Patrolman to the Clarkstown Police Department at an annual salary of \$2,700.00, the appointment to become effective as of April 1st, 1951.

Seconded by Mr. Eberling.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

NOES: None.

Mr. Dillon said that he had received a letter of resignation from Patrolman Lester Weser of the Police Department. Patrolman Weser stated in his letter that he did not feel there was sufficient opportunity for advancement in the Department and the salary was insufficient for his means.

Mr. Eberling moved that Patrolman Weser's resignation be accepted.

Seconded by Mr. Welchman.

On roll call, the vote of the Board was as follows:-

AYES: Messrs. Schmersahl, Welchman, Eberling, Dillon.

NOES: None.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Eberling moved adjournment.

Seconded by Mr. Schmersahl.
