Supervisor Dillon opened the meeting.

On motion made by Mr. Schmersahl, seconded by Mr. Welchman and carried, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved and accepted.

Mr. Dillon read a letter from Mr. Elmer DeFlaun of Central Nyack having reference to the petition for Annexation of a portion of Central Nyack to the Village of Nyack.

After considerable discussion the Board signed the following:

CONSENT OF TOWN BOARD TO ANNEXATION TO  
VILLAGE OF NYACK

WE, the undersigned, IRVIN F. DILLON, Supervisor, FRED SCHMERSAHL, JOHN H. RENKEN, JOSEPH WELCHMAN and ALASTAIR JEFFREY, Councilmen, constituting and comprising all the members of the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, County of Rockland, New York, do hereby and herewith consent that the lands and premises hereinafter described, and which are adjacent to and adjoining the corporate limits of the said Village of Nyack, New York, may be annexed to the said Village of Nyack, and we formally consent accordingly.

The lands and premises to be so annexed are bounded and described as follows:

DECISION OF TOWN BOARD CONSENTING TO  
EXTENSION OF BOUNDARIES OF VILLAGE

WHEREAS, a petition on the application of Alfred J. Elish and others for the annexation of certain territory to the incorporated Village of Nyack, as more fully appears in the petition, was filed with Irvin F. Dillon, Esq., the Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown on the 26th day of November, 1957, and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor, pursuant to statute, did on the 6th day of December, 1957, execute and cause to be duly posted a notice of hearing in the matter to be held at the Central Nyack Congregational Church in said territory proposed to be annexed, said meeting to be held on the 20th day of December, 1957, at 8:30 o'clock in the evening, and

WHEREAS, proof of the posting of said notice has been duly filed, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Irvin F. Dillon, Mr. Fred Schmersahl, Mr. John H. Renken, and Mr. Alastair Jeffrey, all of the qualified members of the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, did attend in a body at the Central Nyack Congregational Church at the time specified in said notice for the purpose of holding a public hearing, as required by statute, and

WHEREAS, there appeared before said Town Board Daniel T. Brucker, Esq., as attorney for the petitioners in favor of the petition, and John E. Boeggeman, Attorney appearing on behalf of objecting resident taxpayers of the Town of Clarkstown, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has examined said petition, as required by law,

NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned, being all of the members of the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, qualified to act in this proceeding, do hereby consent that

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the territory hereinafter described be annexed to the Village of Nyack, Rockland County, New York, to wit the following territory:

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At the request of George Vivino, Esq., petitioner's attorney, the Board agreed to adjourn hearing on petition of Nyack Development Corporation for the extension of the New City-West Nyack Water Supply District to Jan. 9th, 1958 at 8:15 P.M.

Supervisor Dillon read to the Board a letter from Central School District No. 1 with respect to application for a zoning change made by Harry M. Coyle and Fred J. Seeger as well as request of Deerwood Park for conversion from an RA-1X to an R-1 district.

Stephen G. Doig, Jr., Esq. appeared before the Board with regard to dedication to the Town of West Palmer Avenue, Nanuet. Upon being questioned by the Board, Highway Superintendent Klein reported it would cost about \$150.00 to finish up grading of the street. The Board decided to hold the matter over until the next regular Board meeting.

Mr. John Eberling, Motor Equipment Operator at the Clarkstown Sanitary Fill reported to the Board that William Wolf had submitted a sample of fill which he rejected and thereafter brought in another sample which was excellent. Mr. Eberling further reported that Mr. Wolf had not furnished any fill to date although he had promised to and that it was sorely needed.

Hall, Engineer for the Improvement of Sherwood Drive, Nanuet, reporting that the said road had been constructed in accordance with plans and specifications except for restoration of three lawns and clean up of area used in laying storm drain to Freedman Avenue.

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Mr. Hall suggested payment to the contractor for the work completed to the total amount of the contract less \$1000.00 to be withheld until clean up and restoration work had been done.

Town Attorney Roepe advised the Board that he would prepare a serial bond resolution and companion resolution delegating power to the Supervisor to issue bond anticipation notes, covering the Improvement of Sherwood Drive, Nanuet.

A letter from the Town Attorney, Edward G. Roepe, forwarding letter from the New York Trap Rock Corporation with respect to escrow arrangements expiring Dec. 31, 1957 and suggesting a 60-day extension on the Hale, Bray and New York Trap Rock properties.

Letters of resignation from Lola Krauser of the Receiver of Taxes office and Helen M. Westcott of the Assessor's office were read to the Board and ordered filed.

Supervisor Dillon read a letter from the Town Clerk of Ramapo enclosing copy of a letter from Robert D'Avino of 22 Mallory Rd., Hillcrest, Spring Valley, with respect to a swamp to the rear of Mallory Homes development.

Copy of a letter from the Town Clerk of Ramapo enclosing copy of proposed Comprehensive Amendment of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ramapo and notice that a public hearing would be held on Jan. 6, 1958 at 8:00 P.M. in the Ramapo Town Hall, was read to the Board.

Mr. Dillon read letter from the Department of Public Works transmitting certified copy of Official Order No. 531 - discontinuance of maintenance of portion of State Highway No. 689 (Route 59A).

The Highway Superintendent reported that he and Mr. Cayot had met with Mr. Sweet of the Village of Nyack and that the water condition at Mr. Cayot's property would be taken care of by Mr. Sweet and the State.

A letter from County Treasurer S. J. Ciancimino, enclosing statement of all money paid by the County Treasurer to the Supervisor and/or Highway Department and/or Town for the year 1957 was read to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Dillon read Certificate of Final State Equalization Rate dated Dec. 19, 1957, establishing the rate for Clarkstown as 39%. The Board directed same placed on file.

Where a lot line of a lot not located in a R district or SC district lies within 25 ft. of the boundary of an R district or SC district, the required yard and building height requirement along such lot line shall conform to the minimum regulations of said R district or SC district; or, of more restrictive, the regulations for the use actually applied for."
