

TOWN BOARD MEETING
September 25th, 1958

Town Clerk's Office

3:00 P.M.

Present; Messrs. Coyle, Renken, Jeffrey, Welchman.

Absent: Mr. Danko.

Supervisor Coyle called the meeting to order.

On Motion made by Councilman Renken, seconded by Councilman Welchman and carried, the minutes of the meeting and hearing on September 11th and the minutes of the special meeting on September 15th, 1958 were approved and accepted.

Mr. Nicholas Lopes, attorney, appeared in connection with dedication of roads in Cherry Hill Homes, stating all requirements had been met and asking acceptance by the Town Board. The Town Attorney reported that all papers in connection therewith were in order and approval had been submitted in writing by the Highway Superintendent.

Mr. Renken moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that deed dated June 11, 1958 from Nyack Development Corporation to the Town of Clarkstown, dedicating 480 lineal feet of Cherry Hill Road, 320 lineal feet of Split Rock Court and 3520 lineal feet of Foxwood Road, as shown on subdivision map of Cherry Hill, East Section, West Nyack, together with drainage easement from George Robert Eifrig and Lois Eifrig, his wife, to the Town of Clarkstown bearing date September 11, 1958, be accepted, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be directed to record the instruments and that the said roads be included in the Town Highway System,

Seconded by Mr. Welchman.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

Supervisor Coyle read a proclamation designating the week October 5th through 11th, 1958 as National Business Women's Week.

Chief Wiebicke made a report to the Board in connection with the July 29th 1958 request of Chestnut Grove School P.T.A. for crossing guards. The Clerk was directed to advise the Chairman of the Safety Committee that preparations were being made in the 1959 budget to include a Crossing Guard for the intersection of New Valley Road and North Middletown Road.

Mr. Renken moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Mrs. Mary Reimer of Lake Road, Rockland Lake, be appointed School Crossing Guard at the intersection of Route 303 and Lake Road, Congers, at \$6.00 per day, and Alfred Riffard of Maple Ave., West Nyack, be appointed School Crossing Guard at the West Nyack Elementary School entrance on Route 59A, West Nyack, at \$4.00 per day, effective October 1, 1958.

Seconded by Mr. Welchman.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

NAYES: None

The Supervisor read a letter from Garrett E. Miller calling attention to the traffic hazard caused by bushes obstructing view at Old Mill Road and Kings Highway, Valley Cottage. Chief Wiebicke reported there was an obstruction and that he was prepared to send an order to the owner of the property but thought a survey should be made as to the width of right-of-way of road. The matter was referred to the Highway Superintendent.

The Supervisor read a letter from Chief Wiebicke advising that the services of Patrolman Robert Lagatella and Roger Grahn have proven satisfactory through their probationary period and recommending permanent appointment.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has reported to this Board that the services of Patrolmen Robert Lagatella and Roger Grahn have proven satisfactory during their probationary period,

BE IT RESOLVED, that Robert Lagatella and Roger Grahn be appointed Police Patrolmen on a permanent basis on October 16, 1958.

Seconded by Mr. Renken.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

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In connection with requests made to the State Traffic Commission for traffic signals, Chief Wiebicke reported that Mr. Cox of the Commission had been checking accidents at Route 59 and Grandview Avenue, Nanuet as well the Route 304 intersection with Ludvigh Road and Bardonia Road, Bardonia and the intersection of Waldron Avenue and Route 59, Central Nyack. The matter was held in abeyance for the October 9, 1958 meeting.

The Supervisor read a letter from the State Traffic Commission with respect to new orders on Traffic Signals No. 57, 58 and 59 on Route 303 and Thruway access roads.

A letter dated September 16, 1958 from the State Traffic Commission advising of order for Stop sign at new Rose Road intersection with Route 59 was read to the Board.

The Clerk was requested to ask the State Traffic Commission how soon the traffic signal will be installed at the intersection of Smith St. and Route 59 and also if a survey could be made of the possibility of installing a caution light at the intersection of College Ave & Route 59.

Chief Wiebicke asked permission to send Detective Dwight Eisgrau to Investigator's School.

Mr. Renken moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Detective Dwight Eisgrau be authorized to attend the Investigator's School at Valhalla, New York from October 20, 1958 to October 31, 1958 and that all necessary expenses incurred in attendance be charged to the Town. Seconded by Mr. Welchman.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

Chief Wiebicke asked the Board to advertise for bids for four patrol cars, 3 sedans and 1 station wagon, for 1959.

Mr. Renken moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Clerk be directed to advertise for sealed bids for the furnishing of four (4) patrol cars for the year 1959 in accordance with specifications furnished by Chief Wiebicke, to be received on October 23, 1958 and opened at 3:30 PM. Seconded by Mr. Welchman.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

Chief Wiebicke reported he had a vacancy of Sergeant on the force and asked that Detective Dwight Eisgrau be appointed to serve without compensation for the balance of the year. The matter was held over for the October 9, 1958 meeting to enable the Supervisor to procure the latest Civil Service Eligible List.

A petition in this matter for the extension of the NANUET WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT of the Town of Clarkstown having been duly presented to the Town Board, and an order having been duly adopted by the Town Board on the 14th day of Aug. 1958, for the hearing of all persons interested in the matter on the 11th day of September, 1958, at 8:30 P.M., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, at the office of the Town Clerk, 16 South Main St., New City, New York, and a hearing by the said Board having been duly held at such time and place, and it having been duly resolved and determined following such hearing that the petition herein was signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law and otherwise sufficient, that all the property and property owners within the proposed extension were benefited thereby, that all property and property owners benefited were included within the limits of the proposed district, and that it was in public interest to grant in whole the relief sought, and it having been then and there further duly resolved that the creation of such extension as proposed be approved; it is hereby

ORDERED, that the NANUET WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT of the Town of Clarkstown be extended in the said Town of Clarkstown, Rockland County, New York, to include lands in the said Town described as follows:

BEGINNING at the point of intersection of the prolongation southerly of the center line of Hickory Drive and the present northerly boundary line of the Nanuet Water Supply District and running thence (1) northerly along the prolongation southerly of the center line of Hickory Drive and along the center line of Hickory Drive and along the center line of Hickory Drive to a point distant easterly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Birch Drive, thence (2) running northerly along a course parallel to and distant easterly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Birch Drive about 1,400 feet to a point in the southerly line of said unnamed street to a point distant easterly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Middletown Road; thence (4) running northerly along a course parallel to and distant easterly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Middletown Road about 900 feet to a point distant northerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the prolongation easterly of the center line of Central Drive; thence (5) running westerly along a course parallel to and distant northerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the prolongation easterly of the center line of Central Drive and from the center line of Central Drive 900 feet to a point; thence (6) running northerly at right angles to the fifth course about 300 feet to a point distant northerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Lake Shore Drive; thence (7) running westerly along a course parallel to and distant northerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Lake Shore Drive to a point distant westerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Cottage Place; thence (8) running southerly along a course parallel to and distant westerly 500 feet measured at right angles from the center line of Cottage Place to a point in the center line of Smith Road; thence (9) running westerly along the center line of Smith Road; about 250 feet to a point in the westerly line of lands of Dr. Maxwell S. Hefter; thence (10) running southerly along the westerly line of lands of Dr. Maxwell S. Hefter 1,305 feet to a point in the southerly line of lands of Dr. Maxwell S. Hefter; then (11) running easterly along the southerly line of lands of Dr. Maxwell S. Hefter about 900 feet to a point in the present westerly boundary line of the Nanuet Water Supply district; thence (12) running in a general northerly direction along the westerly boundary line of the Nanuet Water Supply District about 300 feet to a point in the northerly boundary line of the Nanuet Water Supply District; thence (13) running easterly along the present northerly boundary line of the Nanuet Water Supply District about 2,840 feet to the point or place of beginning.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that EDWARD P. ARBOGAST, P. E. of the Town of Clarkstown be and he hereby is appointed TOWN ENGINEER for the Town of Clarkstown for the term beginning October 1st, 1958.

The Clerk reported redeipt of executed contract between the Village of Spring Valley and Town of Clarkstown covering the Pascack Park Sewer District and that same had been filed.

A letter from Melvin E. Knapp of New City, dated September 16, 1958, advising of rent increases effective as of January 1, 1959 - Supervisor's Offices from \$140.00 to \$150.00 per month; Welfare Offices from \$65.00 to \$70.00 per month and Zoning Inspector's Office from \$185.00 to \$190.00, was read to the Board and ordered filed.

Supervisor Coyle advised he had received a letter from William J. Dobbin, Rockland County Historian, dated September 13th, 1958, asking for information on the keeping of the Town's records, the said information being desired by the Division of Archives and History of the University of the State of New York, He stated he had answered the letter and informed Mr. Dobbin that when the new Town Hall is completed there will be fireproof storage for all Town records, but that at present only the Assessor and Supervisor have fire-resistive filing cabinets.

The Supervisor read a letter dated September 21, 1958 from the Chairman of the Clarkstown Democratic Committee which advised that Democratic Inspectors of Election had been assigned to the wrong districts in Election Districts No. 10 and 21 through misunderstanding and asking correction.

RESOLVED, that resolutions with respect to appointment of Democratic Inspectors of Election Districts No. 10 and 21, Town of Clarkstown, be amended as

RESOLVED, that Minnie Stern and Evelyn Rudman be appointed Democratic Inspectors of Election District No. 21, Town of Clarkstown, and Helen Blauvelt and Harold Raup be appointed Democratic Inspectors of Election District No. 10, Town of Clarkstown.

The Highway Superintendent reported on investigation of Third St., Congers, a paper street, in connection with request for a building permit under Section 280-A made by Edward P. Copy of a letter addressed to the Commissioners of the Congers Fire District by Supervisor Coyle under date of September 17, 1958, explaining at length procedure relating to hydrant installation, was read to the Board.

The Highway Superintendent reported on the Grando drainage matter and stated the Town culvert had been cemented shut; also that a subdivision was going in to the north of the Grando property in Nanuet. The Town Attorney stated he would report on the matter at a later date.

Supervisor Coyle read a letter dated September 8, 1958 from Cherry Hill Home Owners Association, Inc. advising they favored a survey being conducted for the purpose of securing Federal funds for a sewerage study by an engineering firm. The Clerk was requested to advise that the Board is now negotiating for such a study.

The Town Attorney reported that he had deeds from the Water Company for Goebel and Old Mill Roads but they were not acceptable at this time.

The Highway Superintendent reported that there was a drainage matter to be taken care of before Rosewood Drive, New City, would be acceptable for dedication to the Town
