Superintendent of Highways, Town of Clarkstown

55 Miles of Town Roads have been surface treated.

The following roads have been rebuilt from 18 feet to 24 feet in width with penetration and plant mix:

Pascack Road from Town Ramapo Line, Spring Valley to Smith Road.

Klein Avenue from West Street to 49-A, West Nyack.

Rockland Avenue from Lake Road north 700 feet.

New Crusher Road from Snake Hill Road to the Old Crusher Road.

Chemically treated 20 miles of road-side weeds.

12,000 feet snow fence erected.

420 trees were removed from Town right of ways.

Corrugated pipe and catch basins were installed where needed to correct drainage conditions.

39 miles of Town Roads white lined.

The new roads accepted total 6.19 miles, giving the Town 121.06 miles of Town Highways to maintain.

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ADDRESS BY JOHN W. COYLE  
SUPERVISOR

It is with a deep feeling of pride and satisfaction that the members of the Clarkstown Town Board meet with you for the dedication of this beautiful building.

This structure will result in more efficient operation of your town

government. It will bring together in one place the various officials and offices with whom the members of the public transact official business.

In viewing this edifice we can draw parallels with the local town government which has performed during the past two years for the benefit of the Town of Clarkstown.

To illustrate:

It is a sound, sturdy structure. Your town Board has functioned on a sound basis and its sturdy stands on all issues are well known. Neither threats nor favors have swayed it in its decisions which, in all instances, have been rendered on the basis of the general welfare of the town.

It is unpretentious. Your town board has acted without fanfare or ostentation. Although its actions have been featured in minute detail in the press and on the radio such publicity was not sought by our members or other town officers.

It is well lighted by windows. Your town board has endeavored to appraise you of all town business despite press reports to the contrary.

It includes space for future growth. Your town board has looked to the future in all its actions - recreation, parks, sewers, planning and zoning, highways, garbage disposal, public safety, health, drainage, engineering and even the designing and construction of this building have been constantly in mind and in progress.

It is functional rather than ornamental. Your town board has endeavored to bring to you all the benefits required in this day and age commensurate with your ability to pay for them. The town portion of the tax rate for 1960 purposes has been reduced 15% over that for 1959. Your town board believes that this tax level can be maintained. We believe that town costs should be met by current revenues rather than by recourse to bond issues mortgaging the future and adding heavy interest costs to the tax bill.

It was the intention of this town board to pay the cost of this building before the issuance of bonds was necessary. Against the total borrowed debt of \$175,000 we have already paid \$50,000 from accumulated savings effected thru economical governmental operation during 1959 and have provided for \$10,000 more in reduction of that debt in the 1960 budget. All this despite a tax rate reduction of 15%.

It is an attractive building. The members of your town board are substantial citizens in their respective communities. Those who know them personally like and respect them for their qualities. In spite of accusation and innuendo and regardless of political fortunes, the sound, sober residents of Clarkstown know that the members of the present Clarkstown Town Board are completely honest and have served them well.

Those of us who are leaving the town government will pass on the torch of progress to those who continue and follow us.

The Highway Superintendent requested the Board's permission to purchase a sand, salt and chip spreader as two had broken down and he considered it an

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emergency because of the weather.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Highway Superintendent be authorized to purchase from the H. O. Penn Machinery Company of Poughkeepsie, N. Y. a sand, salt and chip spreader at a cost not to exceed \$3250.00, because of an emergency, Seconded by Mr. Danko.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

AYES: Messrs. Renken, Danko, Jeffrey, Welchman, Coyle.

Mr. Welchman moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that a record of outgoing elected officials and the Town Attorney be spread on the minutes and that copies be furnished to the outgoing Board Members, the Town Attorney and the Town Clerk. Seconded by Mr. Danko.

On roll call, the vote was as follows:

AYES: Messrs. Renken, Danko, Jeffrey, Welchman, Coyle.

NAYES: None.

Councilman Jeffrey stated he would like to make a statement for the record and continued as follows: "At the past two meetings of the Clarkstown Planning Board I have been disturbed by what I consider hasty and ill-advised action."

"For the past four years I have observed and sat in on the meetings of the Planning Board; as liason for the past two years, I personally have agreed overwhelmingly with their decisions."

"However, at these past two sessions I am gravely concerned by two particular actions taken by the Board, namely:-

- 1 - The recommendation to this Board to permit the construction on half acre plots in the dead center of New City, the County and Town seat of government, a multitude of houses. To this I have already voiced my objection publicly. Perhaps a compromise of allowing the bottom of southern half of this plot, namely, Squadron "A" to be developed to a commercial use and the northern half for housing would be appropriate. It is extremely short-sighted to go ahead with the present plan, especially in the light of the State Highway Department's proposal to go through this site with the new Route 304.
- 2 - The other objection I have is to the recommendation of the Board that we grant one large section of Clarkstown to be re-zoned to an M-2 use, the lowest category of zoning, in the vicinity of the Spring Valley Air Park. This could allow by right the establishment of junk yards, auto wrecking yards, stone crushers and incineration of waste materials."

"I do not think the people of Clarkstown are in favor of these useages, at least, not for the present time."

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Supervisor Coyle called attention to the fact that for the past two years the Board had been careful not to establish development in the site of the proposed realignment of 30 4, stating it was a very costly project and that if stumbling blocks were put in the way of the State it might decide to put the matter off to the future and go elsewhere where people make it more feasible for them to carry out plans. He further pointed out that if this took place it might be necessary for the Town to build a road because of the rapid growth. Mr. Coyle told those present that the re-routing of Route 45 was marking time and it would be eight or ten years before it was done because of stumbling blocks in the State plan a few months ago.

On motion made by Mr. Renken, seconded by Mr. Danko and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.
