MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS

Approximately nineteen thousand (19,000) calls were received at Headquarters.

A total of eighty seven (87) vacant houses were posted and checked by cars while on patrol.

A total of one hundred and twenty five (125) fire calls were received and various Fire Departments notified through our Headquarters and patrol cars.

A total of three hundred and twenty five (325) warning summons were issued for various violations.

A total of six hundred and fifty (650) ambulance calls were received at Headquarters and ambulance dispatched on same.

A total of nine hundred and eighty seven (987) Tax and Zoning notices have been posted in the Township for the Receiver of Taxes and Zoning Board.

A total of two hundred and ten (210) Mail, Express and Bank Escorts.

A total of one hundred and twenty two (122) emergency were received whereby the Resuscitators of the Department were used one hundred and five (105) times.

A total of two thousand and two hundred and thirty two (2,232) Motor Vehicle and Criminal cases were brought before the Town Justices of the Peace.

There was twenty six thousand and three (26,003.00) dollars in property stolen.

There was eleven thousand nine hundred and eighty nine (11,989.00) dollars of the stolen property recovered.

The police patrol cars traveled three hundred fifty eight thousand four hundred and seventy three (358,374) miles.

In conclusion, as head of the Police Department, it is my sincere belief that our high standard of efficient and courteous service was maintained during this past year.

I wish also to convey to you, Mr. Supervisor, and members of the Town Council, my sincere appreciation for your support and understanding of the Police Department's needs.
