Section IV. Any person who is proven to have violated this ordinance shall be subject to a fine, not in excess of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).

Section V. All ordinances or regulations heretofore adopted relating to the owning, boarding, harboring, keeping or having custody of a dog, male or female, and whether licensed or not, except as set forth in the Building Zone Ordinance of the Town of Clarkstown as amended, are ~~hereby repealed~~.

No person shall locate radios or similar devices or amplifiers thereof so as to, or that may project sound into highways or neighborhoods for commercial advertising or business purposes; and no person owning, occupying or having charge of any building or premises or any part thereof in the Town shall cause, suffer or allow any loud or excessive noise in the operation or use of any radio, phonograph or other mechanical or electrical or reproducing device, instrument or machine.

Any person violating this section of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine, not in excess of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).

The tax maps, zoning map, road map and all special district maps were revised during the year. Of the new tax map being prepared under the direction of Mr. Nelson W. Hall, P.E. seventy-one (71) sheets or 50% of the total are on file and in use.

3. Plans and specifications for several sidewalk locations were prepared and a contract with Cyler & Schuck Inc. for 9,338 lineal feet of sidewalk was executed and work is in progress.

4. A total of 7.67 miles of streets have been added to the town highway system to date this year.

5. Phase 1 of the study of sewerage and sewage treatment being made by Nussbaumer, Clarke & Velzy, was completed this year and phase 2 is in progress. A study of lateral sewer districts by the same firm was initiated.


