

SPECIAL TOWN BOARD MEETING
May 5, 1964

Town Hall

5:00 P.M.

Present: Councilmen Holbrook, Frohling, Supervisor Mundt.

Supervisor Mundt called Special Town Board Meeting to order at 5:00 P.M.

(189) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Town of Clarkstown hereby request the Rockland County Board of Health to inspect and certify all individual sewage disposal systems and their repair in the Town of Clarkstown.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook

All voted yes.

(190) Councilman Holbrook moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Rockland Electric & Supply Corp. be awarded the bid to supply the Town of Clarkstown with traffic signals and controllers for the year 1964 at a price of \$306.00 and \$260.00 each respectively.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

All voted yes.

(191) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Town of Clarkstown is hereby authorized to purchase two traffic signals and two controllers from Rockland Electric & Supply Corp. for installation at Little Tor Road, New Hempstead Rd., New City, and Congers Road-Old Haverstraw Road, Congers, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Highway Supt. be authorized to install same, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$1500 be transferred from CURRENT SURPLUS-GENERAL to TRAFFIC SIGNALS AND SIGNS ACCOUNT.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

All voted yes.

Town Board signed Order setting date of Public Hearing in the matter of the construction or installation of sanitary sewers and sewer crossings in the right-of-way of State Highway Route 304 in the Town of Clarkstown, Rockland County, New York - 5/18/64 at 8:45 P.M.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, in the County of Rockland, New York, has heretofore duly caused to be prepared a plan for the construction and installation of sanitary sewers and sewer crossings in State Highway Route 304 and an estimate of the cost thereof, which plan and estimate have been duly completed and are to be filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the said Town of Clarkstown for public inspection; and

WHEREAS, said Town Board has determined to proceed with the construction and installation of said sanitary sewers in State Highway Route 304 pursuant to Section 202-f of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of said sanitary sewers and sewer crossings as hereinabove described is \$60,000.00 which is planned to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of said Town of Clarkstown, and the cost thereof shall be a Town charge and shall be assessed, levied and collected in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges provided, however, that the Town may authorize the use of such improvements installed or constructed by any sewer district or extension thereof hereafter established in the Town and said improvements shall become a part of such

district or districts or extension thereof and the entire cost of such improvement including the expense of maintenance thereof, shall be a charge against such district or districts or extension thereof and shall be assessed, levied and collected in the same manner as other charges against such district or districts or extensions thereof, now therefore, be it

ORDERED, that a meeting of the Town Board of said Town of Clarkstown be held at the Town Hall, 10 Maple Avenue, New City, New York, in said Town on the 18th day of May, 1964, at 8:45 P.M. (E.D.T.) to consider the proposed improvements, being the construction of sanitary sewers and sewer crossings in State Highway Route 304 as herein referred to, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, and for such other action on the part of said Town Board with relation thereto as may be required by law, and be it

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Town Clerk publish at least once in "THE ROCKLAND COUNTY CITIZEN" a newspaper published in New City, New York, and the official newspaper of said Town, and post on the sign-board of said Town maintained pursuant to subdivision six of Section 30 of the Town Law, a copy of this order, certified by said Town Clerk, the first publication thereof and said posting to be not less than ten nor more than twenty days before the day designated herein for said public hearing as aforesaid.

(192) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Town Engineer be authorized to apply to the New York State Department of Public Works for a permit to construct sanitary sewers in the right-of-way of Route 304.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

All voted yes.

(195) Councilman Holbrook moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney has requested the services of a typist to type the final draft of the Fire Code and to type stencils of it so that it can be mimeographed for distribution, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Josephine Robinson be and she is hereby appointed as Typist for a period not to exceed ten working days, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the temporary appointment for a period not to exceed ten working days, of Josephine Robinson, 231 Van Houten Fields, West Nyack, N.Y., to the position of typist at a salary of \$1.80 per hour effective May 6, 1964.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

All voted yes.

(194) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Kenneth Ward be and he is hereby appointed to the position of Laborer for the Sewer Districts, and further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the temporary appointment until September 4, 1964, of Kenneth Ward, 16 Denarest Ave., New City, N.Y. to the position of laborer, at a salary of \$1.75 per hour effective June 23, 1964.

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Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

All voted yes.

(195) Councilman Holbrook moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Douglas Crowe be and he is hereby appointed to the position of Laborer for the sewer districts, and further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the temporary appointment until September 4, 1964, of Douglas Crowe, 21 Demarest Avenue, New City, N.Y. to the position of laborer at a salary of \$1.75 per hour, effective June 23, 1964.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

All voted yes.

(196) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Hubert Pfingst be and he is hereby appointed to the position of laborer in the Town Engineer's Office, and further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the temporary appointment until September 4, 1964, of Hubert Pfingst 14 Hogenkamp Avenue, Nanuet, N.Y. to the position of laborer at a salary of \$1.75 per hour effective June 8, 1964.

(197) Councilman Holbrook moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that William Katt be and he is hereby appointed to the position of laborer in the Town Engineer's Office, and further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the temporary appointment until September 4, 1964, of William Katt, 115 Germonds Road, New City, N.Y. to the position of laborer at a salary of \$1.75 per hour, effective June 8, 1964.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

All voted yes.

(198) Councilman Frohling moved the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute contract with the Village of Spring Valley for Sewer Service for District #25, provided the Spring Valley Hotel Corp. first agrees by contract with the Town of Clarkstown to install a dry sewer line per instructions of the Town Engineer for an ultimate connection with adjacent Town Lateral District.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

All voted yes.

On resolution made by Councilman Holbrook, seconded by Councilman Frohling and unanimously adopted, Special Town Board meeting was adjourned.
