Supervisor Mundt called Town Board meeting to order.

(234) Councilman Brenner offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that minutes of two (2) public hearings and regular Town Board meeting held on 3/15/67; regular Town Board meeting held on 3/31/67; one (1) public hearing and regular Town Board meeting held on 4/5/67 and special Town Board meeting held on 4/11/67.

Seconded by Councilman Damiani.

Councilman Brenner noted that due to error in bid submitted by low bidder for Police Uniforms, which were awarded by the Town Board on 4/5/67, bid was awarded to Merson Uniform, next lowest bidder, who conformed with specifications.

(236) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on April 5, 1967 bids were received by the Town of Clarkstown for the construction of lateral sewer systems within Sewer Districts 24 and 27 in Nanuet, and West Nyack, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board requested consulting engineers, Charles R. Velzy Associates to ascertain the low bidders, check on the completeness and accuracy of their proposals, make inquiries as to their experience, competency to perform the work and financial status, and to make recommendations for the awarding of the contract to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 1967, the firm of Charles R. Velzy Associates recommended to the Town Board that the contracts be awarded to A. Cestone Company, 710 Bloomfield Avenue, Glen Ridge, New Jersey, based upon their finding that said company was the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney, on April 19, 1967, reviewed the proposals and determined that the bids of A. Cestone Company were in all respects legal and in conformance with existing laws and regulations and said Town Attorney concurred in the award of the contracts to A. Cestone Company;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute a contract with A. Cestone Company for the construction of lateral sewer systems within Sewer Districts 24 and 27 subject to prior concurrence by HUD.

First Deputy Town Attorney Murray N. Jacobson informed Town Board that informal petition received for road improvement district (Stanley, Wells, and Louis Roads); Inquired if Town Board would like to proceed as they did on Roosevelt Avenue improvement or have formal petition submitted. Supervisor advised that majority should be obtained -will try to obtain same by the 4/28/67 Town Board meeting.

(237) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to advertise for bids for furnishing material for sanitary fill project - said bids to be opened 5/3/67 - 8:05 P.M.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

All voted Aye.

Mr. George Morganstern - re data processing: \$18,000.00 total cost as one-time only cost, pro-rated share \$7,000.00 for Clarkstown.

Payroll: Also wants to do in County. Prorates share to Clarkstown- Has submitted two contracts to Town Attorney: 1 - \$7,000.00 - as participating in tax roll program; 1 - \$4,000.00 as participant in payroll program. This would be one-shot investment - Total: \$11,000.00. Supervisor stated that town will have saved in first year \$10,000.00. \$3-5,000.00 could be subtracted from budget we now have for same. There would be \$2,000.00 charges by the county on top of \$11,000.00 in this year.

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(238) Councilman Frohling offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown has determined the need for a computer based system for, the purpose of automating the Town payroll and to service the clerical needs of the Tax Assessor's Office, and

WHEREAS, Decisions Systems, Inc. is willing to render a computer based system for such purposes;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is authorized to execute agreements with Decisions Systems, Inc. providing for a computer based system for the purpose of automating the Town payroll and to service the clerical needs of the Tax Assessor's Office.

WHEREAS said New City Library has requested that the Town of Clarkstown blacktop the parking area and approaches to the library owned by said New City Library on Main St., New City, New York, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the cost of blacktopping said property would be maximum of \$2400.00, and

WHEREAS, Section 256 of the Education Law of the State of New York provides that towns may grant aid to free association libraries;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Sec. 256 of the Education Law of the State of New York (1) the Highway Superintendent of the Town of Clarkstown is authorized to blacktop the parking lot and approaches to the New City Library, Main St., New City, New York and (2) the sum not to exceed \$2400.00 be transferred from Current Surplus-General to Town Highway Account - Item No. 4.

Seconded by Councilman Damiani.

(242) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that upon request made by The Shade Tree Committee, the amount of \$100.00 is hereby transferred from Current Surplus -General to Shade Tree Account. said amount to be used for landscaping plan for library and execution of same.

RE snow removal on school sidewalks; Councilman Holbrook suggested town employes do - get together with School Board to discuss - wait until after next School Board meeting. Highway Superintendent stated \$13,000.00 this year - cost to clean school sidewalks - this year, more. Councilman Frohling suggested 2-3 men full-time from Highway Department- Highway Superintendent stated that would need 14/15men. Councilman Damiani suggested using construction works; advised Highway Superintendent to let him know if he could not get men for this snow removal job.

Merton E. Rawson, Chairman of the Planning Board notified Town Board that subdivision regulations call for sidewalks; builder often requested that this be waived - that homewoners do not want. Town Board will discuss.

(245) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, a vacancy has occured in the position of School Crossing Guard due to the resignation of George Armstrong,

NOW THEREFORE, upon recommendation of Ernest Wiebicke, Chief of Police, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to execute the necessary Civil Service form for the permanent appointment of Mary Eileen Terrible, 7 Ivy Lane, New City, New York to the position of School Crossing Guard, at a salary of \$6.00 per day effective immediately.

Seconded by Councilman Frohling.

Letter received from Board of Water Commissioners, Village of Nyack, confirming town's request for installation of hydrant on south side of Route 59 to service the Shop Rite Shopping Center. Estimated cost of this installation is spproximately \$562.00. Upon completion of the installation, they will advise Town Clerk's Office in order that this hydrant may be added to contract.

(246) Councilman Brenner offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that upon recommendation of Councilman Brenner, Orange and Rockland Utlities is hereby authorized to install five (5) street lights (4000lu) as follows: 1 on Pole #4, Klein Ave., West Nyack; one (1) on Pole No. 33, Demarest Mill Road, West Nyack; one (1) on Pole No. 7, Birchwood Terrace, Nanuet; one (1) on Pole No. 85 Route 303, Congers; and one (1) on Pole No. 1, Forest Glen Road, Valley Cottage at cost to town of \$234.00 annually; \$19.50monthly

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Letter from Seymour Rapkin re proposed zoning map- New City area; forwarded to Mr. Emanuel.

Request for road sign and street light, New Valley Road and Burda made by a Mrs. Parmet. (light on Pole #25). Referred to Police Chief for recommendation of sign - Councilman Holbrook will check on light on New Valley Road.

(247) Councilman Frohling offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on April 26, 1965 the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown approved bonds of the Aetna Casualty and Surety Co. for the installation of sanitary sewers in the amount of \$3500.00 and subdivision improvements in the amount of \$16,000.00 to be constructed in Valley Cottage Heights, Section III, Block E, Lots 6-9 and Block D, Lots 5-9, and

WHEREAS said bondshaving expired on March 6, 1967, and

WHEREAS, no building development except for the erection of some foundations, has taken place in said Section III, Valley Cottage heights and

WHEREAS, Marvroy Realty Corp. has requested that performance bonds of the Republic Insurance Company for the installation of sanitary sewers, Bond No. 900421 in the amount of \$3500 and bond for subdivision improvements, Bond No. 900420 in the amount of \$16,000 be submitted for said bonds of the Aetna Casualty And Surety Co.; and

WHEREAS, the said bonds for Republic Insurance Company have been approved as to form by the Town Attorney and as to sufficiency by the Town Engineer;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the Town Board, Town of Clarkstown, held on March 31, 1967, at 2:00 P.M., it was resolved that a formal resolution be submitted to said Town Board at a regular meeting, in order to perfect the requirements of an industrial street to be constructed on the southerly 60 feet of Lots 5.05 and 5.06 Block A, Map 128, situated on the west side of Route 303, 1 mile north of Lake Road, Congers, New York, and

WHEREAS, "Congers Industrial Park", Orange 65 Realty Corp., desires to create an industrial subdivision on 56 acres on the west side of Route 303, 1 mile north of Lake Road, Congers, and

WHEREAS, said industrial area should have no access from the residential area to the south of said proposed industrial park, and to effectuate this, a portion of Wells Avenue is to be abandoned, and

WHEREAS, said industrial park should have access from a major road to provide independent access at a reasonable distance from the residential area;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that Orange 65 Realty Corp. be given permission to construct a commercial street to be dedicated to the Town of Clarkstown, a minimum of 205 feet north of the southerly property line of said property running west a distance of 1000 feet plus or minus ending in a turnaround, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to obtain an appraisal on the portion of Wells Ave. which is to be abandoned by the Town pursuant to a restrictive covenant dated November 9, 1965.

Mr. James Vincent appeared before Town Board as spokesman of Steering Committee of Clarkstown Civic Associations and stated that in their opinion, meetings with Town Board were unsatisfactory. Supervisor informed Mr. Vincent that meeting which was scheduled for the 21st called off due to religious holiday; Town Attorney will set another date.

Letter received by Town Clerk from Saint Agatha Home for Children requesting installation of street lights along Duryea Lane, Nanuet. Councilman Holbrook requested to have recommendation in time for the Town Board meeting which will be held on Friday, April 28th.

Mr. Jacob made report to Town Board on "Chinese Wall" on Route 59. He was in touch with Mr. Sinacori and has hopes that state will have another way to solve problem at four corners in Nanuet.

Approval of Reduction in amount of Bonds for Subdivision known as Thronwood Hills tabled for 4/28 Town Board meeting. Town Clerk instructed to invite Mr. Sidney Kent, Pres. and Mr. Benjamin Sherman to attend this meeting.

(250) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on February 28, 1967, the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown authorized the First Deputy Town Attorney, Murray N. Jacobson, to contact the County Treasurer's Office regarding the purchase of tax liens in premises, Map 16, Block A, Lot 26.63 which adjoins the Sewer District No. 8 plant, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined from the County Treasurer's Office and the Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Clarkstown that the delinquency in taxes amounts to \$159.50,

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that Murray N. Jacobson, First Deputy Town Attorney, is hereby authorized to make an offer to the County Treasurer for the purchase of said tax lot and is hereby authorized to enclose a check to the County Treasurer in the amount of \$159.50, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the amount of \$159.50 shall be transferred from Current Surplus-General to Recreation-Parks(Purchase of) Account.

WHEREAS, the Town Deems it in the best interest of its citizens, and in order to promote health, safety and general welfare, and to guide and regulate the orderly growth, development and redevelopment of the Town of Clarkstown, and in furtherance of that objective, the services of Manuel S. Emanuel Associates will be beneficial;

NOW THEFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is authorized to execute a contract with Manuel S. Emanuel Associates in accordance with terms and conditions contained therein as prepared by the Town Attorney of the Town of Clarkstown, the financial remuneration of said contract to be \$3500.00.

Police Chief instructed to check out signs area of Woodglen near Moreland, New City, Dangerous area.

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Town Engineer informed Board that in connection with Pole #55, Orange & Rockland Utilities, who is to replace pole, wants no responsibility - underground service to resident. Thinks home-owners should assume expense. Councilman Brenner stated that since this is home-owner's alternative option, they should assume responsibility.

Re Forest Glen Homes septic problem(mrs Schilling); Town Engineer and Mr. McCoy will be present at meeting tomorrow morning - Twpn Attorney to be available. Supervisor will contact Health Department to representative present.

Appointment of West Nyack Hamlet Development Board - held for 4/28 meeting.

Town Engineer reported that Election District Map will be ready 4/28.

(255) Councilman Frohling offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Town Highway Superintendent is hereby authorized to erect "NO PARKING" signs on the south side of West Nyack Road, between Demarest Mill Road and Old Route 304, Nanuet.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

(256) Councilman Frohling offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Town Welfare Office was transferred to the County of Rockland as of March 31, 1967,

AND WHEREAS, in accordance with Town of Clarkstown Attendance Rules for Officers and Employees, FRANK W. KEMMER, Town Welfare Office for the Town of Clarkstown, is entitled to 26 1/2 days' accumulated vacation credit,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that said Frank W. Kemmer be paid for 26 1/2 days' vacation pay at the rate of \$36.85 per day, based on his 1967 annual salary of \$9,582.30, making a total of \$967.31.

(257) Councilman Holbrook offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Town Data Processing Department was transferred to the County of Rockland as of March 31, 1967,

AND WHEREAS, in accordance with Town of Clarkstown Attendance Rules for Officers and Employees, JOHN P. MOODY, Tabulating Machine Manager for the Town of Clarkstown, is entitled to 30 days accumulated vacation credit,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that John P. Moody be paid for 30 days' vacation pay at the rate of \$36.54 per day, based on his 1967 salary of \$9,500 per annum, making a total of \$1,096.54.

Re burning ban: (for unincorporated areas): Roads being littered - re suggestions - call 6617 for removal of leaves and debris-Orangetown

picks up at point designated by Highway Department for one month. Highway Superintendent reported that he had two trucks out continuously in April (Clean-Up Month). Matter will be discussed further.

Supervisor inquired of Town Attorney if he has looked into Mr. Strauss' suggestions on safety. Town Attorney has not finalized - does not look too hopeful.

Councilman Damiani: Received letter from Mr. Segal - Eberling Drive - drainage problem - water in basement. (74 to 80 Eberling Drive) Town Engineer will present report to Councilman Damiani (Has surveyed and drawn up, but final solution is not self-evident.)

Councilman Frohling - re Schriever Lane; Complaints of intersection with Main St., trucks parking close to corner, etc. Town Board instructed Chief of Police to make investigation of this intersection and make recommendation to Town Board as to parking situation, the hazard at intersection, etc., to see if we can resolve whatever problems exist at this intersection.

Councilman Frohling: Re hazardous condition on Pinetree Road (leading into Chromoloy Plant) - Access very narrow. Plant enlargement - more employees. School children have to cross road to get school bus - over the tracks. This is private road and town cannot improve. Suggests that Supervisor call Chromoloy people to see if we can come to some agreement where they agree where they would construct blacktop footpath over railroad tracks for children crossing same. (Supervisor will set up meeting).

Councilman Holbrook: Park by railroad station in Congers, unsightly. (Town Clerk note: A Mr. James Summer, Highway Avenue, Congers, New York was appointed on 4/5/67 to position of Custodian of Wells Park, Congers to commence May 1st, 1967 and terminate October 31, 1967.)

Councilman Holbrook also reported drainage problem existent easterly side of Pine Avenue in Congers - Town Engineer to check out.

Councilman Brenner: Requested net price for three streets for street improvement. Town Engineer stated Highway Superintendent has figure - he will get together with Councilman Brenner. Also requested, was figure for Tore Marcussen.

Re traffic situation on Route 59 (Grant Pulley): Letter from Department of Public Works stated they had no difficulty with Grant - Pulley - Grant Pulley informed us otherwise. (Read letter from Grant Pulley stating Department of Public Works did not discuss with officers of their firm.) 10-20 minute delay in leaving plant - blind hump in road 200 yards away. Request traffic light immediately. Supervisor suggested letter be sent to proper state official, with copy of Grant Pulley letter, requesting that their people come down to meet with Councilman Frohling and Police Chief, Supervisor stated he will write to Burch McMoran in this connection. (Town Clerk will document whole matter to Supervisor).

(259) Councilman Damiani offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police make recommendation to the Town Board as to whether a "YIELD" sign or "STOP" sign be placed at Second Street and Lawrence Street, Spring Valley.

Seconded by Councilman Holbrook.

All voted Aye.

Supervisor Mundt stated that meeting has been arranged with H.U.D. in Washington D.C. for next Wednesday to attempt to get additional matching funds for the New City and Congers lateral sewer districts as was done for Nanuet, Central Nyack and Nyack.

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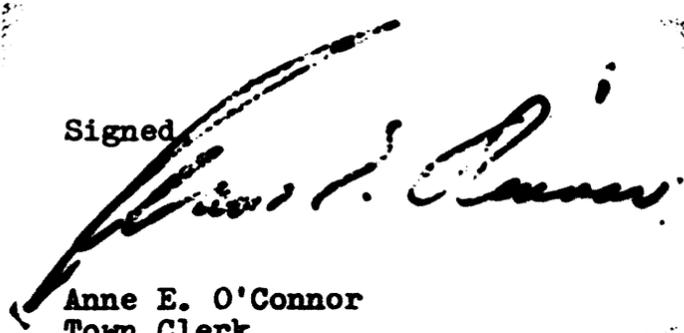
