Deputy Supervisor called Town Board Meeting to order at 8:00 P.M.

(748) Councilman Brenner offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that minutes of three (3) public hearings and regular Town Board meeting held on 11/15/67; and minutes of Joint Public Hearings held on 11/20/67 are hereby approved and accepted as submitted by the Town Clerk.

Seconded by Councilman Damiani.

All voted Aye.

Mr. George Suttie, Consulting Engineer, appeared before Town Board in connection with requested report of cost and time estimate to develop drainage study of Saievas and adjacent properties. He stated that his 3/29 report indicated recommendations on what could and should be done in area. Mr. Suttie indicated in this report that best way to drain would be to the south. He was requested by Deputy Supervisor Holbrook to expand on his 3/29 recommendations. Mr. Suttie to have additional report on the 20th.

Mrs. Krantz, 134 Strawtown Road, West Nyack appeared before the Town Board re re-routing of trucks from residential areas. After considerable discussion, Police Chief Ernest F. Wiebicke was asked to make recommendation.

Mr. John Mackey, Strawtown Road suggested that town should also look into portions of Nanuet and New City, where thru-trucking has become a problem. He mentioned cars being parked in "NO PARKING" zones. Police Chief requested to check out.

Residents of Wedgewood Hills Subdivision, Nanuet appeared before Town Board re construction of Little League Field in what they were led to believe by the developer was to remain park area. Objected to cutting down of trees; requested delay until more discussion and possibly recommendations can be made by residents. Town Engineer informed residents that in clearing and filling, drainage problem existing (land swampy) is being eliminated and that 40' buffer will remain. Deputy Supervisor informed residents that area already town park; clearing of land cannot be suspended. After considerable discussion, it was determined that Town Engineer ask Mr. Jerry Gerber, developer, to stop cutting - Town Engineer to meet with all involved on the weekend to discuss further.

Mr. Sherman of Wedgewood also brought to the attention of Town Board drain pipe in rear of his property which was left open. Requested it be closed or capped. Town Engineer will look into and handle matter.

Mr. Sherman also brought up matter of Tennyson Road (private road) which is muddy and fullied. Highway Superintendent informed Mr. Sherman that top should not be put until next spring until sewers are installed. Re presence of pot-holes, Highway Superintendent Messrs. Goldstein and Gerber, developers were supposed to fix; he will call developers (or Mr. Donelly of Ward Pavement) to take care of pot-holes and black-top manholes.

(4) will adversely affect the character of, or property values in the area;

(5) Will otherwise impair the public health, safety, morals, convenience, comfort, prosperity, and other aspects of the general welfare of the Town;

(6) will not comply with all other requirements applicable to such use;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that a special permit for a gas filling station pursuant to said application is hereby DENIED and the reasons for denying such special permit are that the proposed use of the premises will not be for the convenience, comfort, prosperity, and general welfare of the community; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the within Special Findings and Resolution setting forth the reasons for denying such special permit shall constitute a written report to be filed with the Town Clerk pursuant to Section 8.333 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Clarkstown.

WHEREAS, George S. Gerber of Valley Cottage, New York was thereby appointed to fill the position of Administrative Assistant effective February 1, 1964 to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 1965, an eligible list was established by the Rockland County Personnel Office and thereafter the eligible list was exhausted and there was less than three available names on the list, and

WHEREAS, On June 11, 1965, the Rockland County Personnel Office advised that a second provisional appointment could be made to this position, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney of the Town of Clarkstown is directed to prepare said contract, and be it

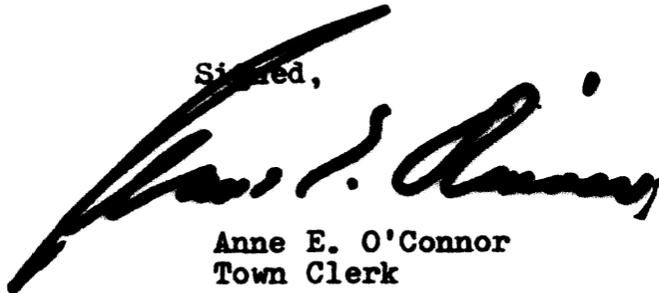
