RE: PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION & INSTALLATION OF SANITARY SEWERS & SEWER CROSSINGS IN THE RIGHT OF WAY OF STATE HIGHWAY ROUTE 304 IN THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN:

Supervisor called public hearing to order. Town Clerk read notice of public hearing.

Town Clerk sworn in by Supervisor and testified as to proper posting and publication of notice of public hearing.

Mr. George Suttie of the firm of Charles Velzy Associates, Inc. appeared before the Town Board and stated the following:

They would like to put the pipeline in now, instead of holding off; town to pay expense. 3200 lineal feet of pipeline to Ludvigh Road. Cost of improvements - \$75,000.00.

Would be in public interest; pipeline would be put in at earlier date and at a much lower overall expenditure. Also, pavement would not have to be ripped up again.

Sewer lines going in first along Route 304 where the sidewalks would go, and as a temporary expedient, crushed stone would be put in. When sewer line goes in, actual sidewalks would be installed.

Re sewer line; we can do all the engineering work and let bid out for actual expense. Work could be done before the heavy snow. Construction will take a month. The sewer lines will be in by no later than the middle of December.

In answer to question put by Mrs. Crudo of Bardonia; it was stated that walk would be put in by sewer contractor - crushed stone.

Councilman Damiani stated that because of critical area, sidewalks or bypasses be made because it is a hazardous area for youngsters. (temporary sidewalks).

Re question on elimination of raw sewerage existing at bungalow colony; Councilman Bolander stated he is on top of situation. Mr. Hillsen is owner, has already be contacted. Police have been contacted. Someone has been sent down re the debris. Mr. Hillsen is in contact with someone as far as the flow on to the state road is concerned. Councilman Bolander will keep on top of situation.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town hereby appropriates the amount of \$75,000.00 for the construction and installation of sanitary sewers and sewer crossings in State Highway Route 304, in the Town, including original equipment, machinery and apparatus, pursuant to the plans and specifications heretofore prepared by Charles R. Velzy Associates, Inc., P.E., consulting engineers, and the resolution and order adopted by the Town Board of the Town on October 2, 1968, hereinabove referred to in the Recital hereof. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$75,000 and the plan of financing is the issuance of serial bonds of the Town, in the principal amount of \$75,000 to finance said appropriation and the assessment, levy and collection of the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon

in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges, provided, however, that the Town may authorize the use of such improvements by any sewer district or extension thereof hereafter established in the Town and said improvements shall become a part of such district or districts or extension thereof and the entire cost of such improvement shall be a charge against such district or districts or extension thereof and shall be assessed, levied and collected in the same manner as other charges against such district or districts or extensions thereof.

Section 2. To finance the said appropriation, serial bonds of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$75,000, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law").

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

(a) The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose for which the bonds authorized by this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a 4 of the Law, is thirty (30) years, but the maturity of the bonds herein authorized shall not exceed fifteen (15) years.

(b) Current funds are not required by the Law to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution, or any notes in anticipation thereof pursuant to Section 107.00 d 4 of the Law.

(c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution may exceed five (5) years.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes in anticipation thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by #52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such a year.

Section 5. Pursuant to the provisions of this resolution and pursuant to the provisions of #30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of ##56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals thereof, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution may be contested only if:

(a) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or  
(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, are not substantially complied with

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

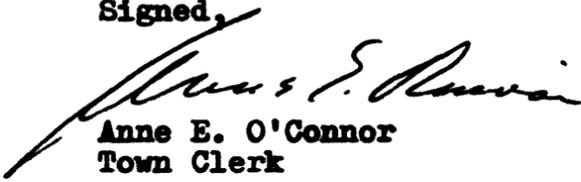
