RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE TERMS, FORM AND DETAILS  
OF ISSUANCE OF \$12,670,000 VARIOUS SEWER DISTRICTS AND GENERAL  
PURPOSES SERIAL BONDS-1971 OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE  
COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR SALE.

Recitals

WHEREAS, the Town of Clarkstown (herein called "Town"), in the County of Rockland, New York, has heretofore duly authorized, sold and issued its bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of \$14,109,160 in anticipation of the sale of the \$13,867,597.41 unredeemed balances of aggregate authorizations of \$14,833,378.41 serial bonds heretofore duly authorized for various sewer districts and other general purposes improvements, as hereinafter more fully described, and said bond anticipations notes have been renewed and portions thereof have been redeemed and redemption thereof provided therefor from sources other than the proceeds of said bonds, from time to time, all pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town now deems it to be in the public interest and desirable to proceed with the sale and issuance of said serial bonds or portions thereof, to the extent that payment of said bond anticipation notes from sources other than the proceeds of said bonds has not been heretofore made or provided for, pursuant to the Law;  
now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Of the \$258,884.75 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted December 13, 1965 and amended April 30, 1969, appropriating \$258,884.75 for the

construction of a lateral sewer system in Extension No. 6 of Sewer District No. 8, in the Town of Clarkstown and authorizing the issuance of \$258,884.75 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

duly adopted and amended by the Town Board on the dates therein referred to, \$191,000 serial bonds shall be issued, being part of the \$242,884.75 unredeemed balance of said bonds, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$207,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$16,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$4,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1976, inclusive, \$5,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1977 to 1985, inclusive, and \$6,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1986 to 2006, inclusive.

Section 2. Of the \$526,260 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted September 25, 1961, authorizing the construction of a sewer system in New City Sewer District of the Town of Clarkstown, stating the estimated maximum cost thereof is \$526,260, appropriating said amount therefor and authorizing the issuance of \$526,260 serial bonds of said Town to finance the appropriation," [Sewer District No. 10]

duly adopted by the Town Board on the date therein referred to, \$420,000 serial bonds shall be issued, being part of the \$421,260 unredeemed balance of said bonds, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$525,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$105,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$15,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1975, inclusive, and \$20,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1976 to 1993, inclusive.

Section 3. Of the \$2,150,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted May 24, 1965 and amended June 18, 1969, authorizing \$2,150,000 for the construction

of a lateral sewer system in Sewer District No. 16, in the Town of Clarkstown and authorizing the issuance of \$2, 150, 000 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

duly adopted and amended by the Town Board on the dates therein referred to, \$1, 320, 000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series A"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series A, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$1, 426, 000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$106, 000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$35, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1995, inclusive, and \$40, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 1996 to 2007, inclusive.

Section 4. Of said \$2, 150, 000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, as amended, hereinabove cited in Section 3 hereof, \$352, 000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series B"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series B, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$360, 000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$8, 000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$8, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1980, inclusive, \$10, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 1981 to 1984, inclusive, \$11, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 1985 to 2002, inclusive, \$12, 000 on February 1, 2003 and \$10, 000 on February 1 in each of the years 2004 to 2006. After giving effect to the issuance of said Series A and said Series B bonds, hereinabove referred to in Section 3 and this Section 4, an amount of \$364, 000 will remain authorized and unissued of said \$2, 150, 000 bonds.

Section 5. Of the \$1,475,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted September 14, 1964 and amended June 18, 1969, authorizing \$1,475,000 for the construction of a lateral sewer system in Sewer District No. 17, in the Town of Clarkstown and authorizing the issuance of \$1,475,000 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

duly adopted and amended by the Town Board on the dates therein referred to, \$764,000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series A"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series A, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$828,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$64,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$18,000 on February 1, 1972, \$17,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1973 to 1977, inclusive, \$22,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1978 to 1980, inclusive, \$20,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1981 to 1984, inclusive, \$24,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1985 to 2002, inclusive, \$23,000 on February 1, 2003 and \$20,000 on February 1 in each of the years 2004 to 2006, inclusive. After giving effect to the issuance of said Series A bonds, there will remain a \$633,000 unredeemed balance of said \$1,475,000 bonds, additional bond anticipation notes aggregating \$485,000 having been heretofore issued and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$14,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds.

Section 6. Of the \$1,695,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted March 8, 1965, amended on June 19, 1968 and further amended on December 22, 1969, authorizing \$1,695,000 for the construction of a lateral sewer system in Sewer District No. 20, in said Town and authorizing the issuance of \$1,695,000 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

duly adopted and amended by the Town Board on the dates therein referred to,

\$980,000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series A"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series A, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$1,058,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$78,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$25,000 on February 1, 1972, \$24,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1973 to 1977, inclusive, \$25,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1978 to 1991, inclusive, \$30,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1992 to 2002, inclusive, \$31,500 on February 1 in each of the years 2003 to 2005, inclusive, \$30,500 on February 1, 2006 and \$30,000 on February 1, 2007.

Section 7. Of said \$1,695,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, as amended, hereinabove cited in Section 6 hereof, \$468,000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series B"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series B, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$492,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$24,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$10,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1988, inclusive, \$14,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1989 and 1990 and \$15,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1991 to 2008, inclusive.

Section 8. Of said \$1,695,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, as amended, hereinabove cited in Section 6 hereof, \$145,000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series C") and shall mature in the principal amount of \$3,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1974, inclusive, and \$4,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1975 to 2008, inclusive.

Section 9. Of the \$828,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted August 4, 1965,\* appropriating \$828,000 for the construction of a lateral sewer system in Sewer District No. 21 in the Town of Clarkstown and authorizing the issuance of \$828,000 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

\* and amended July 3, 1968,

duly adopted by the Town Board on the date therein referred to, \$770,000 serial bonds shall be issued, being the unredeemed balance of said bonds, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$828,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided therefor to the extent of \$58,000 from a source other than the proceeds of said bonds, and shall mature in the principal amount of \$20,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1972 to 1977, inclusive, \$19,000 on February 1, 1978, \$20,000 on February 1 in each of the years 1979 to 1994, inclusive, \$19,000 on February 1, 1995, \$20,000 on February 1, 1996, \$19,000 on February 1, 1997, \$22,000 on February 1, 1998, \$23,000 on February 1, 1999, \$25,000 on February 1 in each of the years 2000 to 2002, inclusive, \$27,000 on February 1 in each of the years 2003 to 2006, inclusive, and \$25,000 on February 1, 2007.

Section 10. Of the \$1,325,000 serial bonds of the Town, authorized pursuant to the bond resolution, entitled:

"Bond Resolution of the Town of Clarkstown, New York, adopted August 4, 1965 and amended November 26, 1969, authorizing \$1,325,000 for the construction of a lateral sewer system in Sewer District No. 22, in the Town of Clarkstown and authorizing the issuance of \$1,325,000 serial bonds of said Town to finance said appropriation,"

duly adopted and amended by the Town Board on the dates therein referred to, \$744,000 serial bonds shall be issued (heretofore and herein designated "Series A"), being the unredeemed balance of said Series A, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$780,000 having been heretofore issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and redemption thereof provided


