

ORGANIZATIONAL TOWN BOARD MEETING

Town Hall

January 5, 1972

Supervisor Vines called Organization^l Town Board Meeting to order; assemblage saluted the Flag.

Judge Theodore Kelly swore in all members present at the Board table.

Supervisor Vines gave the following State of the Town message:

"As we sit here today and reflect over the past two years, and look forward to our next two years, we must take cognizance that we live in a world of constant change.

In two short years we have acquired more open space and parklands than did all the previous administrations in 180 years, secured a ready-made swimming facility at Nanuet Lake, transformed an old highway barn into useful Town offices, saving \$40,000 per year in rents, consolidated some 40 sewer districts into one benefited area. In addition, our short term notes for sewer construction are being retired at a fixed interest rate with serial bonds.

We initiated the first program in the County against drug addiction. So outstanding is our drug program that the Narcotic Addiction Control Commission, State of New York, has called upon our people to lend assistance in advising a Middletown group (Orange Co.) because Clarkstown's program is considered to be a very successful model, rendering excellent service to young people in the abatement of drug abuse.

Work is well underway on the Congers Lake Casino which will be the second recreation center for our young people. And so it goes; as Clarkstown continues to grow and change, we continue to meet these challenges. We could go on and on about our accomplishments, but we believe the people of the Town are well aware of the job this Administration has been doing reflected by the mandate of November 3, 1971.

Now let us turn our attention to the future of Our Town of Clarkstown. What are some of the things we expect to achieve.

First, we look to the completion of Clarkstown's first Senior Citizen's Complex, the first of the many units needed for Clarkstown's finest and most deserving, which is expected to be ready in 1972.

Secondly, we hope to have Congers Lake Pool, Traphagen Pool as well as Nanuet Lake in full operation for this coming summer.

Third, Clarkstown's Police Force will be expanded, with special attention given to the Juvenile Aid Bureau. The new Clarkstown Traffic Law will bring additional revenues to the Town, instead of to the State.

Fourth, we have begun and will continue to move forward on correcting the serious drainage problems affecting our Town. Top priority will be the establishment of a Town-wide Drainage District.

Fifth, there is no doubt in my mind for the need of an addition to the Town Hall. Police Headquarters need to be expanded, as do the Court operations. I would hope that this too will be of primary concern this year.

Sixth, I fully believe that the Town of Clarkstown should address itself to a full value reassessment.

Seventh, you have often heard me use the words "Progress Through Planning". To achieve this, we plan to introduce a Local Law establishing a Department of Planning.

Eighth, we hope to consolidate some departments into one agency, as was recommended by the Government Operations Committee. We will elaborate on this a little further at a future date. However, I might say, the end result will be to try to use existing personnel and avoid the need of additional help.

Ninth, we will continue to handle the many complaints which all of our Town Offices receive as expeditiously as possible.

Tenth, a Switchboard will be installed soon, which will place a better control and a monetary savings on telephone costs.

Eleventh, I will shortly recommend to the Town Board the re-constitution of the Traffic Advisory and Safety Committee, which will include the Fire Inspector, Building Inspector and Chief of Police, in order to effect better safety programs in the construction of new subdivisions, as well as shopping areas. This is long overdue.

I would be most remiss if I did not call attention to the Re-assessment Program which we effected in 1971; and although some self-appointed "Financial Experts" shouted loudly that it would cost the taxpayers one million dollars in extra taxes in 1972, we find, in fact, we have saved the taxpayers of Clarkstown nearly three-quarters of a million dollars by our reassessment program and by the adoption of the Advisory Equalization Rates, thus cutting the tax rates in the Town and County by about 20% per hundred. It is in times like these that I am most grateful to be wearing two hats -- that of the Supervisor, and that of a County Legislator. There is no doubt that my position on the County Legislature has brought about this tremendous savings to the taxpayers of Clarkstown. Our reassessment program was only a beginning, and we know

full well that there are gross inequities, however, we will direct our attention to correcting this situation.

Twelfth, we will propose an amendment to our Building Code requiring all public buildings and all multiple dwelling units, park and recreation facilities to be constructed in a manner which will accommodate all handicapped -- this takes in veterans, senior citizens and any others who might be in this situation for life or just a period of time. In addition to proposing this legislation on the Town level, I will also recommend it on the County level, at the next session of the County Legislature.

The years 1970 and 71 were years of harassment to this Administration, but we have moved forward, and as we look forward to 1972 and 1973 with a Town Board unified for and in the best interest of the community, and we welcome sincere and constructive criticism, we see better days ahead.

In conclusion, I would like to borrow a few words from the late Dag Hammarskjold:

".....No matter how deep the shadows may be, how sharp the conflicts, how tense the mistrust reflected in this hall and in this house, we are not permitted to forget that we have too much in common, too great in sharing of interests and too much that we might lose together, for ourselves and for succeeding generations, ever to weaken our efforts to surmount the difficulties and not to turn the simple human values, which are our common heritage, into the firm foundation on which we may unite our strength and live together in peace."


