(1976-728) Co. D'Antoni offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Appellate Division has determined, in the matter of THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND v. THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, that summary judgment be granted in favor of the County of Rockland;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be and is hereby authorized to take all appropriate steps to have the Court of Appeals review this matter.

(1976-729) Co. D'Antoni offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Councilman D'Antoni, a member of the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown, has introduced a proposed local law entitled, "AMENDMENT TO LOCAL LAW NO. 6-1973, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED, 'A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING TOWN OWNED PARKS AND FACILITIES'" which law is designated in the Code of the Town of Clarkstown as Chapter 72. Said amendment is as follows:

Amend Section 72.1 to read as follows:

Section 72.1. Use of Park Property within the Town of Clarkstown.

A. The use of pools, parks, lakes and immediate adjacent areas under the control of the Clarkstown Parks Board and Recreation Commission shall be deemed a privilege and shall be opened solely and exclusively to the residents of the Town of Clarkstown and their guests. Residents of the Town of Clarkstown shall be required to exhibit identification as may be required by the Clarkstown Parks Board and Recreation Commission, and no nonresident guests may enter the facilities or areas of the Clarkstown Parks Board and Recreation Commission unless accompanied by an adult resident of the Town of Clarkstown bearing proper identification.

B. The use of the property known as the Charles B. Davenport Preserve shall be opened to the citizens of the Town of Clarkstown, County of Rockland, State of New York, and the United States of America.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that a public hearing pursuant to Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law be held at the Auditorium of the Town Hall, 10 Maple Avenue, New City, New York, on the 3rd day of November, 1976, at 8:30 P.M., relative to such proposed local law, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that notice of the time, place and purpose of such hearing shall be published in the Journal News, and posted in the manner provided by law, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney prepare notice of such hearing and that the Town Clerk cause the same to be published and posted as aforesaid and file proof thereof in the Office of the said Clerk.
