Supervisor Gerber called Town Board Meeting to order; assemblage saluted the Flag.

(1977-796) Co. Holbrook offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that based upon the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Environmental Control, the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown hereby accepts proposals from Orange & Rockland Utilities, Inc. for street lighting at the following locations:

PHILLIPS HILL MANOR SUBDIVISION, New City

Seconded by Co. Maloney.

All voted Aye.

(1977-797) Co. D'Antoni offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on December 31, 1977, various accounts of the Town of Clarkstown contain unexpended balances of appropriations;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 112 of the Town Law, the Comptroller of the Town of Clarkstown is hereby authorized to transfer unexpended balances of appropriations among various accounts in order to equalize the accounts.

Seconded by Co. Maloney.

(1977-798) Co. Holbrook offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that in accordance with Article XIX Section 1 of the Clarkstown Labor Agreement of January 1, 1975, Judy A. Magnetti, 3 Theresa Drive, West Nyack, New York is hereby granted an extension of Leave of Absence, without pay, to expire on April 10, 1978.

Seconded by Co. Piacentile.

(1977-799) Co. Maloney offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, a petition for Interest Arbitration was filed by the Rockland County Patrolmen's Benevolent Association, Inc. Clarkstown Police Organization, and

WHEREAS, the Arbitration Panel consists of three members, one of whom shall be selected as an employer representative;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that Harold J. Peterson be and hereby is designated as the employer representative.

Seconded by Co. Piacentile. All voted Aye.

(1977-780) Co. Piacentile offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Rockland County Drainage Agency desires to proceed with the Nauraushaun Brook Improvement from Townline Road to Lake Nanuet Drive through property owned by the Town of Clarkstown, and

WHEREAS, the Director of Environmental Control recommends that the necessary easements be granted to the County of Rockland by the Town of Clarkstown;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that easements in a form satisfactory to the Town Attorney and with the approval of the Director of Environmental Control be granted to the County of Rockland.

Seconded by Co. Holbrook. All voted Aye.

Supervisor Gerber noted this is the last meeting of the present Town Board and expressed thanks to all the members of the Town Board and well wishes to outgoing Town Board member Anthony D'Antoni. He stated that he and Councilman D'Antoni started out together four years ago and have had some differences of opinion but have learned to respect these differences. Supervisor Gerber noted that in a way we are all a family and he wished everyone attending the meeting the best of the New Year, and looks forward to a successful administration with all Town employees helping.

Councilman Holbrook wished Councilman D'Antoni well and outgoing Town Clerk, John R. Bradley. It's been a pleasure serving with both of these men, and both will be missed.

Councilman Piacentile noted that when he joined the Town Board Councilman D'Antoni was a stabilizing force and all were able to work together, not for one individual party but for the betterment of the Town of Clarkstown. Councilman D'Antoni will be missed and also John R. Bradley as Town Clerk. Best wishes to them both and Happy New Year to all.

He expressed delight in serving at least four more years for the Town as Receiver of Taxes, and indicated that the public can expect the same courtesy from him in his new position as they have for the past eight years in his position as Councilman. Councilman D'Antoni thanked Supervisor Gerber and the rest of the Town Board for their cooperation, and pledged to continue to work in the best interest of the Town of Clarkstown.
