RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING
SUPERVISOR TO ENTER INTO
CONTRACT WITH TOWN OF
GREENBURGH FOR USE OF
CLARKSTOWN SANITARY
LANDFILL

Co. Piacentile offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Town of Greenburgh for use of the Clarkstown Sanitary Landfill by the Town of Greenburgh upon the payment of \$50,000.00 per year, together with One Dollar and Eighty-five Cents (\$1.85) a cubic yard or \$7.50 per ton for 1980, \$7.60 per ton for 1981, \$7.70 per ton for 1982 and \$7.80 per ton for 1983 for all garbage and/or refuse deposited in the Clarkstown Sanitary Landfill.

Supervisor Gerber clarified the payments and also mentioned that this was the first time the \$50,000.00 payment was to be received. He also mentioned the sixty day cancellation clause.

Supervisor-elect Dusanenko raised the question of whether it was ever taken into consideration what the Town of Greenburgh was paying prior to the execution of a contract with the Town of Clarkstown. Supervisor Gerber explained that we now get 30¢ per cubic yard from all the local scavengers.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE
TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN
ADOPTED NOVEMBER 19, 1979
(RECONSTRUCTION OF PART
OF THE OLD TOWN HALL
BUILDING)

Co. Maloney offered the following resolution:

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Clarkstown (herein called "Town"), in the County of Rockland, New York, is hereby authorized to reconstruct, in part, the old Town Hall building, in the Town, which includes the construction of a bridge across an upper level connecting the old Town Hall to the new Town Hall, elevators, office space, sanitary facilities, and corridors and also including acquisition of original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus required for the purpose for which said Town Hall is to be used. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$345,000 and the said amount is hereby appropriated therefor, including a grant of \$145,000 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. The plan of financing

includes the expenditure of said grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the issuance of \$200,000 serial bonds of the Town to finance the balance of said appropriation and the levy of a tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$200,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance the balance of said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

(a) The building is of Class "A" construction as defined by Section 11.00 a. 11 (a) of the Law and the period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 12 (a) (1) of the Law, is twenty (20) years, but the maturity of the bonds shall not exceed five (5) years.

(b) Current funds are not required by the Law to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof pursuant to the provisions of Section 107.00 d. 4 of the Law.

Section 4. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes, or, the renewals of said Notes and of Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or

- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

BOND RESOLUTION OF
THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN,
NEW YORK (PURCHASE OF
TWO NEW TRANSIT TYPE
MINI-BUSES)

Co. Holbrook offered the following resolution:

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Clarkstown (herein called "Town"), in the County of Rockland, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase two (2) new transit type mini-buses at an estimated maximum cost of \$27,500 each. The estimated total cost of said mini-buses, being items of a single specific object or purpose, included preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$55,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$55,000 serial bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation and the levy of a tax upon all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$55,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law").

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

(a) The period of probable usefulness of each of said items of a specific object or purpose for which the bonds herein authorized by this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 29 of the Law, is five (5) years.

(b) Current funds are not required by the Law to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof pursuant to the provisions of Section 107.00 d. 5 of the Law.

(c) The maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued will not exceed five (5) years.

Section 4. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Supervisor Gerber noted that since the last time the Board met there have been a number of changes; certain appropriations have been restored; certain revenues have been changed; certain allocations have been increased or decreased - 5.8% is the general amount but will vary from household to household; from hamlet to hamlet and has no bearing on what the County budget to be adopted means. It depends on what fire district and what water district the person lives in.

We have gone over every line, have met with all department heads. Supervisor Gerber then asked if there were any comments.

Mr. Fred Seeger, Superintendent of Highways said that he felt the Board was doing a disservice to the residents of the Town. There is no provision for purchase of any equipment to the Town. Mr. Seeger mentioned that he had told his liaison that we were in bad shape with 8 trucks disabled. We can't even go out and buy a leaf loader to pick up the leaves. We need \$2,000.00 for that. I have no alternative but to accept it. In my fifteen years of highway experience this is the worst budget I have ever come across and am very disappointed.

Mr. Gerber remarked that so far as equipment was concerned the Town had bought equipment as part of its capital budget and I cannot see any reason why it cannot be done if there is any kind of an agreement to fund it that way.

Mrs. Mary Coughlin, Police Department, asked if in the 1980 salary schedule there was a Senior Typist position.

Mr. Harold Peterson, Town Comptroller, answered that all the positions that appear are filled positions and that there are no vacancies in the 1980 budget.

Mr. Gerber noted that the salary schedule is not included in the budget. The salary schedule is adopted at the organizational meeting in January, there is no relationship to the salary schedule in this instance to the budget. Only a lump sum amount is included in the budget. The salary schedule is adopted, by law, only at the meeting in January.

RESOLVED, that such Preliminary Budget, as amended, a copy of which is attached hereto, be and is hereby adopted as the Annual Budget of the Town of Clarkstown for the fiscal year beginning the 1st day of January, 1980, and that such Budget, as so adopted, be entered in detail in the proceedings of this Town Board, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Clarkstown shall prepare and certify, in duplicate, copies of such Annual Budget as adopted by this Town Board, together with the Assessment Rolls for benefit improvements, if any, adopted pursuant to Sec. 202-a, Subd. 2; Sec. 231, Subd. 2 of the Town Law and deliver two copies thereof to the Supervisor of this Town to be presented by him to the Legislature of Rockland County pursuant to Section 115 of the Town Law and other applicable sections of the Town Law.

Seconded by Piacentile

Before the roll call vote Mr. Theodore Dusanenko, Supervisor-elect of the Town of Clarkstown requested that he be provided with the two positions which had previously been filled by the Supervisor and that he be provided with these positions at this time rather than at the Organizational Meeting in January, which would allow me, as Supervisor-elect of the Town of Clarkstown to number one: perform recruitment; and number two, after recruitment, as a personal appointment of the Supervisor's office, where I could employ that person without pay during the month of December to make a transitional period for the Town of Clarkstown and I would like that request to be honored and voted upon at this time in an amendment form.

Supervisor Gerber stated that Mr. Dusanenko had raised this question outside the Town Board meeting and it was the view, I believe, of a majority of the Town Board that there were sufficient tools and finances in this budget to rearrange, to anyone's liking, after January 1st, the administrative functions of both the Supervisor's office and the Town of Clarkstown. While there were two positions for a period of almost two years either one or both of those positions have not been filled. While it is true they are the personal appointments of the Supervisor these positions have changed over the past six years and it was our view that the full discretion of the Town Board coming in on January 1st could be used without any diminution of the work load of the town and that the majority then serving on the Town Board could certainly make a commitment now to any recruitment drive presuming that they have those votes both now and on January 1st committed. It is not incumbent on this Town Board to prepare anything extraordinary and limit or bind the hands of any future Town Board.

At this point Councilman Longo requested an amendment be made to the resolution. Supervisor Gerber stated that an amendment could be made only if the mover or seconder of the present resolution accepted such amendment. Councilman Longo then made a formal request for amendment to the resolution adopting the budget specifically to fund the finance officer's position on Line 1310. He mentioned that he had made many suggestions last year to cut the budget; that this budget was a good one; that he was going to vote for it but that he never once suggested that the positions in question be cut out because they are important to the Town. He stated that he felt they were last year and remarked that the present Supervisor thought they were important for four years and he feels that the Supervisor-elect should have those tools so that he can do his job in the interest of the people of the Town of Clarkstown.

Supervisor asked if there was acceptance of this amendment by Councilman Piacentile or Councilman Holbrook. Neither offered to accept this amendment.

The amendment to the resolution was rejected. Supervisor Gerber requested Patricia Sheridan, Town Clerk, to call the roll.
