Councilman Longo read a statement assuring all present that although there were differences of opinion as to appointments it in no way indicated that the Town Board Members would not work together. He felt that there would be little, if any, disagreement on issues of importance facing the Town. He stated that if there were differences among Board members the differences would be between the Democrats and the Republican Conservatives.

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Councilman Lettre stated he had learned much in the past few months and expected to learn more while serving on the Board. He said he was committed to making Clarkstown a better place in which to live. He stated that the electorate had voted himself, Supervisor Dusanenko and Councilman Longo (already a Board member) to be the new majority in Clarkstown and that they would work together for the betterment of the Town.

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Councilman Holbrook stated that we have on the Town Board five individuals who are interested in the Town of Clarkstown. He felt each and every issue is decided not by party but by each person in his own conscience. Party loyalty should not determine issues. He stated that he looked forward to working with the new Board and while there might be differences they would be differences based on their own opinions. The only master to be served in the Town of Clarkstown is the people of Clarkstown.

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Councilman Maloney stated that he had served the people of Clarkstown for the past six years and would continue to serve them. He felt labels belong on bottles, not on people and he would continue to look at the qualifications of individuals and vote the way he felt was in the best interests of the Town. He looked forward to working with the new Board.

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Supervisor Dusanenko made the following statement:

"I am honored and privileged to be here tonight because this is the dawn, not only of a new decade but the beginning of a change in political philosophy in Clarkstown. Some asked why did I seek this office. Some consider the position of Supervisor a step backward for a man already serving the legislature on the County level. The simple answer is I want to serve and lead the community in which I am proud to live.

The Journal News recently made a comment that the Town of Clarkstown is a town that is never at ease with itself or its leaders. Such a condition is not incurable. I may add that there was a lot of bi-partisan voting here this evening in what this Town Board believes to be the best answers to the direction we're going to be going in the future. And one of the reasons I am here is to do all that I personally can to bring fair, open, effective, efficient government to our town.

I sought this office, this right to serve you, all of the people of Clarkstown because of my deep desire to exhaust my energies in helping to change the direction and role of your government during a difficult time marked by recession, inflation, over-spending and inadequate budgets.

I do not pretend to know all the answers. No one individual can hope to solve all the world's problems let alone those of the Town. I will need the assistance, encouragement and devotion of all those who share my hopes and aspirations for the Town of Clarkstown. As the holiday season drifts slowly behind us we enter the hard working months ahead. There are a number of specific areas that need immediate attention.

I am not here to scorn or condemn previous administrations. I did not do so during my campaign and do not intend to start now. I am here, however, to learn from the mistakes of previous administrations as well as to build upon some of the strengths that have been bestowed upon us. This, my fellow Clarkstowners, is your administration. This Town Hall in which we spend this evening is your Town Hall. You, the people of Clarkstown, have simply entrusted me with the responsibility and honor of guiding our town through these difficult times.

As Supervisor, I ask for the cooperation and personal commitment of all Town employees. We are all here as public servants and there is no room for anything but the use of our best efforts to serve the residents of the Town of Clarkstown."

At this point Councilman Nicholas A. Longo was appointed Deputy Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown.

Mr. John McLoughlin was appointed Director of Finance.


