Co. Longo offered the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the position of labor relations specialist, part-time, non-competitive, for one year commencing April 29, 1980 be established according to Rockland County Personnel Office specifications, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Francis X. Mascola be employed as labor relations specialist, part-time, commencing April 29, 1980 for one year at an annual salary of \$12,000.00 to perform the duties of chief negotiator for all Town negotiation teams, technical assistance, handling of grievances, initiate and develop counter-proposals on behalf of Town Board, represent the Town through mediation, fact finding legislative hearings before the Public Employees Relations Board and all matters pertaining to labor relations on behalf of the Town of Clarkstown, including providing legal matters pertaining to labor relations, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that \$8,100.00 be transferred from Account No. A 1990-505 to Account No. A 1220-114.

Co. Longo offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Everett J. Johns, Town Attorney and Philip B. Fogel, 1st Deputy Town Attorney, are hereby authorized to attend a law forum on "Municipal Personnel Management and Discipline," on May 16, 1980 at the Westchester County Courthouse, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the registration fee of \$10.00 per person, tolls and mileage shall be proper town charges.

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Councilman Holbrook noted that he had been prepared to make a resolution that the Town withdraw the Article 78 proceedings against Venture Inn but that after consultation with members of that organization during which time they requested that I not put a motion of this type forward lest it further enflame the community I will not put this motion on the floor tonight.

He stated that his feelings about the case still remain the same. He felt the Town acted hastily. He stated he had learned a lesson and in the future would consider things a little more carefully. It has personally been an embarrassment and more importantly it has been embarrassing to the Town of Clarkstown.

Councilman Maloney concurred with Councilman Holbrook and stated he would not even consider an appeal if such were the case.

Supervisor Dusanenko stated that as far as he was concerned he had supported group homes, etc. for approximately ten years. He had recently voted, as a legislator, for additional funds for Venture on the county-wide community development fund. He felt the original questions raised were in order. The contempt charge and the restraining order were thrown out of court. They are dead issues. Hopefully, all agencies and all Town officials will be able to work in a spirit of cooperation and in an open manner in the Town of Clarkstown.

There being no further business to come before the Special Town Board Meeting and no one wishing to be heard, the Special Town Board Meeting was adjourned, time: 11:17 P.M.
