Supervisor Dusanenko opened the Town Board Meeting; assemblage saluted the Flag.

Supervisor Dusanenko announced that there was a box of water flow restrictors supplied by Spring Valley Water Company to cut down on water usage.

Supervisor Dusanenko then read the following:

STATE OF THE TOWN ADDRESS - 1981

My Fellow Clarkstowners and Friends, let us pause for a moment to evaluate our goals and accomplishments -- to review our past so that we can plan the present and ensure a more solid future.

My first year as Clarkstown's Supervisor and my eleventh as a Rockland County Legislator has recently come to an end. It was a year of learning, listening and considering many views, and, as a result, the principles that have guided my decisions remain more steadfast than ever.

The people of Clarkstown have a right to demand efficient and effective service from their local government. Neither residents nor this administration want to see money wasted, especially during these difficult days where inflation has played havoc with all levels of our economy. The fiscal situation we are facing in these inflationary times is one which requires tough and sometimes unpopular decisions on the part of the Town Board. In order to reduce spending we cannot grant every request for street lights, additional bulk pick-up or increases in other services.

New mortgages in Rockland County have decreased by 26 per cent but Clarkstown has not stopped growing. Clarkstown remains the fastest growing town in Rockland. In the past year, since the start of my administration, Clarkstown has attracted desirable ratables such as Seiki, Lazzaroni and Freihofer. These ratables are a definite asset to our community both as a help in paying taxes and in creating more jobs.

During my first year as Supervisor, the Town of Clarkstown was able to deliver effective services in spite of a reduction of over 100 federally funded full-time employees. My experience as a County Legislator has allowed our town to enjoy many on-going government services instead of merely a change of administrations. We have tighter control of cash flow, more realistic budgets, improved cost allocations of departmental expenses and have completed a long overdue fixed assets inventory.

The Town's overall debt has been reduced by \$600,000 even in these difficult times. A five-year plan has been initiated to continue to reduce the Town's long-term debts. We shall not continue to "spread it out," but learn to pay as we go to preserve our future.

We were able to add some \$30,000,000 in assessed valuation to bring in additional tax revenue, as well.

I shall continue to insist that payroll expenses be reduced. We are now taking steps to reorganize unnecessary manpower and expenses and see that productivity be increased.

To give a better understanding of what has been accomplished, let me list some of our Town's departmental achievements during this year:

#### Assessor's Office

- Received \$44,000 state grants for updating and perfecting assessment roll and billing procedures.
- Succeeded in an appeal to the State Board of Equalization and Assessment to increase our equalization rate. It was set at 90.98 rather than the State's figure of about 88%. This saved tax dollars.

#### Comptroller

- Completed Fixed Asset Inventory of all Town property and equipment valued over \$100. First time this was ever done.
- Worked under great hardship with an outdated and outmoded manual system.
- Changed system of payment of Town's bills to ensure budgeted amounts are not exceeded. Under the previous system department heads bought items and then presented bills. Now, Comptroller approves bills prior to purchase.
- Prepared cash flow and surplus analysis which was verified by State Comptroller's Department as correct in an audit and resulted in 1.26 million tax anticipation note to cover 27th payroll and initial expenses of 1981.

#### Counseling Center

- Received grant of \$54,008 from Division of Substance Abuse Services for drug prevention programs.
- Received grant of \$7,160 from NYS Division for Youth for Youth Booth at Nanuet Mall.
- Clarkstown Counseling Center became a fully licensed outpatient drug free center after a year-long evaluation by State agencies.

#### Department of Environmental Control

- Completed sewers:
  - Lake Lucille - South Mountain Road area
  - Old Haverstraw Road
  - Buena Vista Road
- Completed Klein Avenue drainage project
- Began various projects with drainage bond
  - Demarest Kill improvements
  - Spur Drive, Nanuet
- Entered into inter-municipal agreements to reduce some local sewer maintenance costs

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Highway Department

- Rebuilt sidewalks at West Nyack Road, Sickletown Road, Church St. (Nanuet), Renfrew Drive (New City)

- Renovated Congers Lake Park
- Constructed playground at Tennyson Park
- Received Approval for new senior citizen nutrition center at Central Nyack Community Center
- Received \$40,806 in grants from NYS Division for Youth

Personnel Department

- Intern Program provides college students to work for Town at no cost
- Summer Youth Employment Program provides jobs for many needy adolescents at no cost for the Town during the summer
- instituted new Affirmative Action Program

Planning Department

- Participated in application for energy grant under which Town will receive about \$5000 in 1981
- Assisted in the completion of Monterey Gardens and broke ground for Squadron Gardens senior citizen housing projects. Together the two projects will add over 200 new units of senior citizen housing.
- Assisted with Town Hall Community Development Program for removal of architectural barriers that will expand

#### Town Clerk

Despite a decline in staff and an increased workload the personnel in the Town Clerk's Office has continued to serve the public efficiently and cheerfully.

This is just the beginning in our overall plan in bringing better government and services to our Town. With your help we can pursue these objectives:

- Additional reorganization of Town government in order to further reduce cumbersome red tape, manpower and expense.
- To provide a viable and working master plan for the future of Clarkstown rather than the haphazard zone changes of the past. This plan has been in creation for five years but we must insist on having it completed this year.

A comprehensive program has been established and funded to remedy many long neglected drainage and maintenance problems throughout the Town.

I would hope that this entire Town Board will recognize forever after that we must embark on a new course of systematically purchasing needed highway equipment on a pay-as-we-go basis. This is a must if we are to maintain and plow our roads and collect trash and leaves in a more timely and efficient manner. To continue purchasing via bonding means substantial interest payments which, when totalled, could have been better applied toward the purchase of additional pieces of needed equipment.

Another area of concern has been our youth. Clarkstown has the largest youth population in the County. With the creation of the first Town Youth Commission in this County and the possible creation of a Town Youth Bureau, such projects as a Youth Court, Government Days, better Youth Employment Service and many other youth-oriented projects can make Clarkstown a community that is proud of its youth.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone in this Town regardless of political affiliations for supporting my programs and hope in 1981, good government will prevail over political interests.

To best summarize my feelings, I share with you a quote from Lt. Governor Cuomo, "The goal is simple, we must reduce waste. And, this goal transcends political partisanship. There is no Republican or Democratic way to collect garbage or police streets, or process building permits or business licenses, or put out fires, or salt streets, or fix potholes. These are basic services which transcend political considerations."

I am pledged to a better Clarkstown in 1981. I am sure this Town Board will join me in that pledge and I hope that you, the residents of our Town will comply with our laws, take pride in our Town and show your support for our community through your volunteer activities. A better Clarkstown is up to all of us.

WHEREAS, Councilman Edward Lettre has moved and Councilman Nicholas A. Longo has seconded this resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that each member of the Town Board select one member of a five member screening committee to study and review the current legal requirements and ramifications of appointing a permanent Building Inspector, and be it

Councilman Longo said he did not recognize that there was a vacancy in the Building Inspector's Office since the Deputy has assumed all responsibility and is acting in place of the Building Inspector. He stated he was glad that this action would take this problem out of the political arena.

Councilman Maloney said he was happy to see that the problem would be resolved.

Supervisor Dusanenko requested that the Town Board members send in to the Supervisor's Office the names of its representative to form this screening committee. They would have to take up the legal ramifications before they can even consider screening applicants.

This program of yours would need additional funds for administration and Clarkstown does not want to create another level of beauracracy by initiating a Housing Administration Department.


