that was a reduction in the salary for the Town Clerk of \$5,345.00.

Councilman Longo inquired as to whether that gave her a  
raise at all.

Supervisor Dusanenko said "Yes" it gave her a raise of \$1,000.00, the same as for Receiver of Taxes.

Councilman Longo said that in light of what was brought to his attention today he wanted to call for the Town Attorney to make a full investigation of this matter and would like to further reduce it to its 1980 salary and I am being generous. In 1978 this Board passed a resolution and that resolution made Pat Sheridan the Registrar of Vital Statistics - presented by Councilman Maloney, seconded by Councilman Piacentile and they all voted Aye and it said that she would serve without compensation. In 1979 a similar resolution was offered by myself and seconded by Councilman Holbrook in 1980 and there is one for 1979 and in each one of these years there are vouchers for the Registrar of Vital Statistics - Pat Sheridan, - checks cashed and I offer them for your perusal if you care to take a look at them - one in the amount for 1978 of \$372.00; one in the amount of \$351.50 for 1979 and one in the amount of \$466.00. What troubles me even more is that part of this is for abortions registered. And this is a woman who ran on the Right-to-Life line. Here for your perusal, folks! I would like that amended down to her regular salary and I would ask the Town Attorney to conduct a full investigation before the year is out whether these monies should be returned.

Councilman Maloney remarked that there was still a motion on the floor.

Councilman Holbrook inquired if we were voting now on the budget.

Supervisor Dusanenko mentioned to Councilman Longo that there was a motion made by Councilman Lettre, seconded by Councilman Longo to adopt the two pages of budget amendments. Is it your pleasure at this time to amend that resolution?

Councilman Longo replied "Yes, it is."

Supervisor Dusanenko asked in what fashion he wished to amend it.
