WHEREAS, the position of Supervisor for the Town of Clarkstown has been a full-time position for more than 20 years, with a salary commensurate with those full-time duties, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board in adopting the 1982 Budget, recognized the full-time nature of the position at \$39,900.00, and

WHEREAS, the present Supervisor has returned as a full-time teacher in the Clarkstown Central School District and therefore will not be able to devote his full time to the duties of the Supervisor,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that effective and retroactive to January 1, 1982, the annual salary for the position of Supervisor is \$20,000.00 for the year 1982, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the 1982 Salary Schedule reflect \$20,000.00 for the position of Supervisor, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$19,900.00 be transferred from Account #1220 0110 to the Contingency Account # 1990 0505.

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Councilman Lettre asked the question of the Town Attorney that once an elected official's salary has been printed and public hearing been held on the budget can it be changed? Mr. Costa stated that it was his opinion that the salary has not as yet been established as there has not been a vote on the salary schedule. Section 27 of the Town Law authorizes the Town Board to fix the salaries of officers and officials of the Town. That section precludes raising the salaries of certain elected officials but does not preclude a deduction of those salaries. There is an opinion of the Office of the State Comptroller which is consistent with the view that I am expressing that a salary of a town official may be reduced by the Town Board if that is the pleasure of the Board.

Councilman Lettre said whether that is correct or not he is not sure but the thrust of the resolution is that since the position of Supervisor is no longer a full-time position that that is the reason for the reduction in salary. Is that correct?

Councilman Holbrook answered that he is not saying that it is no longer a full-time position. It is a full-time position. If he cannot perform that function then it is self-explanatory.

Councilman Lettre stated that he believed there was an opinion handed down from Audit and Control to the Town Attorney's office which stated that the Town Board can fix a supervisor's position to be a full-time position but cannot dictate the hours of service that the supervisor performs. I believe that the Deputy Town Attorney Philip Fogel has that decision today. The thrust of this resolution is stating that whereas the present supervisor has returned as a full-time school teacher in the Clarkstown School District and therefore will not be able to devote his full-time to the duties of supervisor which is stating that the present supervisor will not be able to fulfill his duties in a full-time position. Is that correct, Mr. Holbrook? Is that what you say? The opinion that was handed down by Audit and Control is that the Town Board can fix it to be a full-time position but can not dictate the hours that a supervisor must perform those duties. Based upon that I believe that this resolution is incorrect and illegal.

Supervisor Dusanenko stated that it is his every intention of continuing as a full-time supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown in addition to being a full-time teacher in the Clarkstown School System. I have every intention of spending forty hours or more per week, not counting the social amenities that go hand in hand with the job, during the next two years. I would like to apprise you gentlemen of that prior to your action. Second of all, I believe it is incorrect and illegal to tamper with an elected official's salary in so far as during that term of office. I would like to apprise you of the fact that I was sworn in earlier and that a salary was set at a legal public hearing. I would like to bring that matter to your attention at this time. I have no other further comments at this time and I would request that we don't delay the meeting unless anyone has any questions of me at this time or the Town Board we will proceed with the vote.

Councilman Lettre said that since this was an illegal resolution he would abstain at this time.

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Supervisor Dusanenko stated that he would like to point out for the record and the general public the following. There are hand-written notes disseminated by a coalition of both Republicans, unfortunately, and Democrats. I would like to have this on file with the Town Clerk's office the following resolutions because these elected officials who are elected by the people of the Town of Clarkstown to uphold the laws and be free thinking have a script in fact, written so that they don't have to exercise their own thoughts but can follow a script. On this resolution just given to me by Councilman Holbrook - motion which was made by Mr. Holbrook, second made by Mr. Carey which in fact did happen and then "NOTE If Longo - Vote - If No Name - Vote - If Someone Besides Longo - Don't Vote". Now I, for the record at this time believe that this person is being persecuted for their political affiliations which is a deprivation of their civil rights because the position is in fact needed. I also remind my colleagues on this Town Board that that is a position which is the sole discretion of the Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown under the town law. I would like to have a copy of this on file with the Town Clerk because I am sure in the very near future this will be a matter of litigation so that Clarkstown can be in the Journal News as a nice harmonious and tranquil place to live as the litigation is pursued further. I would like to point that all out for the record for the benefit of all my learned colleagues who serve on the Clarkstown Town Board.

Supervisor Dusanenko asked if anyone had any misinterpretation of my remarks in regard to that. If not, I am sure you will have an opportunity to explain it in a court of law sometime in the near future so you can exercise your malice and continue to do such at this time. I would suggest that we proceed.

Supervisor Dusanenko stated that he had known Mrs. Ries for some time and that she is a dedicated Town employee. She has unfortunately been ill for some time and has not returned to her full-time services as an employee of the Building Department. During the last several months it has come to my attention that many sensitive matters involving the ZBA were leaving the premises of the Town Hall of the Town of Clarkstown and that secretarial work was being performed at home rather than within the building. Also we had debates, if not debates, suggestions from the floor during several meetings by newly elected Councilman Carey stating that this was a travesty because I was insisting - number one - that the records of this Town Hall not be removed from this building, number two - that people be cross-trained so that one person does not have all of the knowledge of that particular commission at their disposal only and, since this person is a full-time employee of the Town and to the best of my knowledge has not returned

to their full-time job in the Building Department they should not have additional physical strain for themselves. I, for one, upon receipt of a doctor's note stating that Mrs. Ries is physically capable of meeting her full-time duties as a full-time employee of the Building Department and can handle the several hours necessary in addition to that in so far as the ZBA, I would be most happy to return her to her function. But how can one be receiving extra compensation if they are not meeting their normal obligations as a full-time employee. I raise that question.

Councilman Carey stated that his understanding was that Mrs. Ries is well enough to come back to her position and I think that some of the points alluded to as far as one of the reasons why I was removed from my job as Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals at that particular time had nothing to do with the removal of records from a Town office but rather was motivated because I had the temerity to ask that a Democrat be appointed as the Secretary in her stead - a woman who is eminently qualified to do the job and I think she was turned down and my Chairmanship was terminated because you play politics, Sir.

Supervisor Dusanenko stated that he would like to respectfully suggest that the Zoning Board of Appeals is meeting this evening and that a pro-rated portion - I would suggest that Mrs. Kathy Kolka, who has been performing in that function for some time that you reconsider your motion so that she be paid retroactively because this resolution as stated here says that effective January 1st Mrs. Ries will be resuming her position. Right now, at the present hour, Mrs. Kolka is performing that function and in doing such you'll have two people on the payroll at the same time for the same job, which is not unique in this Town.


