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Supervisor Dusanenko then read the following proclamation:

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Supervisor Dusanenko stated that on November 23rd Student Government Day will take place in the Town of Clarkstown. There will be representatives from Clarkstown North High School, Clarkstown South High School, Nanuet High School and Albertus Magnus High School. These students will participate with elected officials, appointed officials and employees of the Town of Clarkstown to learn first-hand how government works.

Supervisor Dusanenko asked if there was anyone wishing to be heard at this point.

Mr. Lodico spoke regarding the position of Superintendent of Highways. He said if the Town Board was considering making this position an appointed one, he was opposed to it and felt it should stay as an elected position. He said he was putting his name forward for the position and he would present a resume at the appropriate time. He urged the Board to make an early decision in order to allow time for a period of adjustment.

Appearance: Mr. Nicholas Longo
Pondview Drive
Congers, New York

Mr. Longo spoke regarding his position as Confidential Secretary to the Supervisor. He stated that he worked in excess of forty hours and was doing a competent job. He wanted to know why the Board wished to cut his salary in half.

Councilman Carey stated that Mr. Longo was not working for a full-time supervisor.

Mr. Longo said he was not here to question the Supervisor's position. He said that the Supervisor's position in no way takes away from the position of Confidential Secretary. The Confidential Secretary puts in so many hours a week and should be reimbursed for that many hours. Mr. Longo said FOR THE RECORD: From 1970 the Confidential Secretary then Mrs. Goodyear received \$7,000.00 for that year. She left in 1973 and she was making \$11,000.00. Mr. Alan Freedman then took over and he was making \$12,500.00 and in 1976 he left with a salary of \$14,000.00. Mr. Aufenanger took over in 1976. He started with \$12,000.00 and he wound up with \$17,600.00. In 1980 Mrs. Fogel had that position. She started with \$12,000.00 and in 1981 she left that position with \$14,300.00. The 1982 salary schedule before you cut it down to less than half was \$15,730.00. I just want to put that into the record and ask you again why? I cannot, Mr. Carey, accept the analogy that I am not working for a full-time supervisor.

Councilman Holbrook said that this was the prerogative of the Town Board.

Mr. Longo said that it is the first time in the history of the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown that politics has been brought into an office in the Town of Clarkstown.

Councilman Holbrook said this was a unique situation. Mr. Longo said the uniqueness was not on his part but on Councilman Holbrook's.

Appearance: Mr. Jack Cuff

Mr. Cuff mentioned the adoption of the 1983 Budget as amended. He said he hoped the time and effort put in by himself and others to come to Town Hall at previous meetings to speak in regard to the budget and some recommendations made by citizens - that this was all considered before you decided to adopt the budget for 1983. He wanted the Town Board to make every effort to save money for the Clarkstown taxpayers. He also stated that he thought the decision regarding the Supervisor's and the Confidential Secretary's salary should be a question for the electorate of Clarkstown to decide. He thought if the Town Board had a problem with Mr. Dusanenko's performance it should be brought out in public and the Town Board should not act as judge and jury. He said the judge and the jury will answer Mr. Dusanenko next November.

Appearance: Mr. Joel Karp

Mr. Karp thanked the Town Board and the Highway Superintendent for fixing the sidewalks in New City on Main Street. He hoped this was part of a continuing program to upgrade New City. He also inquired what was being done about additional parking in the New City area.

Supervisor Dusanenko said that the Town Attorney had been instructed to hire an appraiser to look into obtaining sites for additional parking in New City. In so far as improvements he felt it would be best to hold off on making commitments due to the change expected in the Superintendent of Highway's Office.

Appearance: Mr. Gerald Dusanenko

Supervisor Dusanenko is being persecuted for holding more than one job. He said that he, himself, is presently running three companies effortlessly. He mentioned that Councilman Holbrook at one time or another was Councilmen, teacher, coach, farmer and caretaker of a housing complex in Clarkstown. He said Councilman Maloney was a Councilman, has

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Clarkstown be and she hereby is authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this resolution to be duly recorded in the Office of the Clerk of Rockland County in which said fire protection district is located, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this resolution in the Office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York, within ten (10) days of the adoption of this resolution, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is authorized and directed to send a certified copy of this resolution to the Supervisor of the Town of Orangetown and to the Fire Commissioners of the Central Nyack Fire District.

Councilman Holbrook asked the basis for this resolution and Supervisor Dusanenko stated that when he filed the Tentative Budget and in the last few years, the Supervisor's Budget, we anticipated a much larger increase in revenue from the six villages from the Town of Greenburgh. Some of those villages have indicated that if we use those figures they would no longer use the Sanitary Landfill and we would have less revenue. To keep this rate comparable with that of the Westchester facility and there is also a clause that if the rates increase in the Westchester facility ours will also increase.

Before the vote the Supervisor read the following statement
FOR THE RECORD:

"Gentlemen, once again you are prepared to demonstrate your political vindictiveness.

I would be remiss if I did not bring the following facts to your attention. You have attempted to justify these and previous actions by stating that I am not a full time supervisor. Councilman Holbrook was quoted in the Journal News on Friday, November 5th saying "You can't function in Town Hall from 3 to 5." His statement is untrue and a distortion to say the least. The fact is that I am actively involved as your Supervisor in this building from 32 to 52 hours a week. When school is not in session many additional hours are spent serving the taxpayers of Clarkstown.

All of the supervisors in Clarkstown who have preceded me have maintained other jobs or businesses and were never penalized. Mr. Mundt was an active real estate broker in addition to having business interests in the Nanuet Mall. Mr. Vines still maintained a real estate business and insurance practice as well as managing commercial and farm properties. Mr. Gerber ran around New York State as an employee of the N.Y.S. Commission of Real Property Tax and even had paid state staff located in the supervisor's office. Where was your criticism then?

In conversation with school board members this past summer, I was told that they were led to believe that I was going to resign my position last January thus making my request for an unpaid leave not necessary. Councilman Holbrook stated on November 5th 'the circumstances haven't changed.' I wonder how much Mr. Holbrook, his associates and political leaders of both major parties have been involved to make sure that these circumstances do not change?

Gentlemen I am very proud of my accomplishments during these last three years I have been serving as Supervisor. During this last year what has happened to our Town's detriment that I have not been able to handle? NOT ONE THING!

Despite the obstacles you have placed in my path I have been able to

- 1) Reduce town debt almost \$5,000,000;
- 2) Administer a growing town with almost 100 fewer full time employees;
- 3) Started to replace our antiquated highway fleet;
- 4) Reduce total insurance costs by almost \$1,000,000 per year;
- 5) Worked with Senator Winikow on necessary highway and bridge programs such as 5th Avenue Bridge, improvements to Route 59, Middletown Road and others;
- 6) Resurface and replace many miles of broken town highways, curbs and sidewalks;
- 7) Fathered the creation of the Clarkstown Youth Court which is receiving national and soon, international, acclaim. This was in spite of the Town Board not funding 50% of the first year's cost. I was forced to raise over \$12,000.00 from friends, businessmen and citizens who do give a damn.

This list goes on and on and on.

As long as I am Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown, I will continue to surmount the obstacles placed in my path by you and your associates. Despite your efforts good government will prevail.

Councilman Holbrook said the question does not have to do with what happened years ago - it has to do with right now. Last year the Town Board raised the Supervisor's salary almost \$7,000.00. We were all in agreement on that because we felt it was a full time position. When he was elected the people of Clarkstown felt he was going to be a full time supervisor, certainly the Town Board thought so. We do not have a full time supervisor and the and leadership in this Town has suffered as a result. The Town functions despite the fact that the Supervisor is not there. It functions due to the fact that we have good employees in this Town. Town business is supposed to be conducted during the hours of 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. not 3 P.M. to 5 P.M.

Councilman Maloney said that it was ludicrous to equate the Supervisor's two full time and one part time jobs to his own situation. He said the Councilman's job is a part time job and he does have a full time job in addition to that. He does not have two full time and one part time jobs and neither does Mr. Holbrook nor many other residents in the Town of Clarkstown. When the present Supervisor was elected the people expected that he would be a full time supervisor. This is not a candy store operation. This is a \$24,000,000.00 business. You cannot run a \$24,000,000.00 business by coming in here at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

People expect to be served at the regular time that business is conducted. The Supervisor says we don't give a damn. I think we do give a damn and that is why we intend to do something about it. There were many people who asked us last year can't we have a recall - can't we do something about having a full time supervisor? We said that we couldn't but what we could do was the next best thing and that was to see that the man got paid for doing a part time job. I'd love to have a part time job that pays \$20,000.00 and that is what the man is getting. If he decides to become a full time supervisor - not only will we give him the \$39,000.00 but we will give him a raise because the job is that important. Right now we don't need just good government we need the best government that we can get.

Supervisor Dusanenko said the first time he sought a leave of absence was almost one year prior to his seeking office. He was told by his employers on the Clarkstown School Board not to embarrass them - it was premature - not to ask for it at this time. Whatever their reasons were they granted that full time unpaid leave just prior to the electorate's decision. I was told by several board members on that school board never to embarrass them or to ask for something before it was needed. It is for those reasons that he did not approach the school board until immediately after a successful 1981 supervisor's campaign. He was overwhelmingly elected to continue the programs which he had started two years earlier. Erroneous information was given to the school board which he did not know until many months later that he had no intention of ever returning to school and that made the request for the leave totally unnecessary. He said he was available to the public - that he was exposed to the public in every aspect of his life. He said he would serve the public of Clarkstown in spite of whatever obstacles you and your associates create. He said he would abstain on this since there is pending litigation. He did not want this to be construed as a conflict of interest.

Supervisor Dusanenko said FOR THE RECORD: My Confidential Secretary serves this Town forty hours or more. Other persons, many years ago before inflation, served at much larger rates of compensation. It was stated unofficially that since this person cannot type fifty words a minute that that was the rationale for it. I go on the record once again and remind my colleagues that I was told I would not have the support of my third republican on this Town Board unless I fired Mrs. Mary Loeffler from the Personnel Office - unless I went along with a total moratorium of any zone changes within the Town of Clarkstown and also if I were to continue any relationship or have Mr. Longo act in my exempt position as Confidential Secretary. I bring those factors to your attention again. Regardless of the politics of the person - if a person

is performing - like in my instance there are right now full time employees who work fewer hours than I do. There are almost 200 full time employees who make more than the Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown without even any consideration of overtime. I just bring these facts to your attention in the hope that it may shed some light.

Councilman Carey said he would like to direct a remark to Mr. Longo. He mentioned a judge and a jury before and Mr. Dusanenko just mentioned, although there is no jury, there is a judge. There is still litigation and the judge will decide - so I vote "Yes."

Councilman Lettre said he was trying to take politics out of this issue which might be very difficult at times but all of us sitting up here want to be truly fair and honest with ourselves. We have here a gentlemen who is working hard and is doing the job. He is doing the best he can for the people of the Town of Clarkstown. Mr. Lettre said he thought it was unfair to persecute him for his political affiliation or because of his working for a supervisor who some people say is working part time. Mr. Longo puts in more than 40 hours a week at his job and is doing a good job. Mr. Carey said the judge will decide and I'm sure he will decide in Mr. Longo's favor. I hope that at that time things will get back to normal in this Town and we can stop running things on a political level and I vote "No."

Supervisor Dusanenko said that this town had funds in the Town Attorney's Budget this year for a word processing machine. The County of Rockland, the County Attorney's office and the Legislature has purchased word processing machines to alleviate the need for extra staff within the office. It can do mundane functions very rapidly. During this year there has been no strong attempt to purchase a word processing machine for the Town Attorney's office. There will be funds to purchase a word processor for the Supervisor's office and for the Town Attorney's office. Rather than adding personnel we should look to using sophisticated business machinery. I look toward giving departments additional functions rather than additional staff and I vote "No."

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Supervisor Dusanenko asked if there were any more amendments to the Preliminary Budget before voting on the Budget as amended.

Councilman Holbrook said before we consider adoption of the Budget he would like to get some figures on what the budget now would reflect. Mrs. Erard said the total is \$24,881,155.00 which is an increase of \$9,463.00 over the Preliminary Budget. Supervisor said we are still in the area of a 5.2% increase in Town taxes and in the New City Fire District there would be an increase of approximately 5.7%. Is that correct? Mrs. Erard replied in the affirmative.

Mr. Ghiazza said that all bathing facilities must apply to the State Health Department to be administered by Rockland County whether you operate a public bathing facility as the Town of Clarkstown does or whether you operate a private one. You are asking them to reclassify. The Town had a lot of problems with Lake Nanuet and a lot of work was done in order to qualify under the State Code for the health and safety of the community and he felt that what was contemplated would downgrade what had been accomplished. Even if approval is granted it would be unsafe. He did not recommend that the Town Board go along with it.

Councilman Lettre said that he wanted to thank the Congers Civic Association for their work in the Hamlet of Congers and specifically for the job they have done on the northwest corner of Route 303 and Lake Road.

Supervisor Dusanenko stated that his office had been inundated with phone calls regarding the leaves that are accumulated on public streets throughout the Town. He said they could not advertise in the newspaper because they had not heard from the Highway Department. Some people have stated that they have been told no leaves will be picked up unless they are bagged. Others are having them picked up whether they are bagged or not. There should have been an established policy but the Supervisor stated that he had no response to his written request. He stated that the Highway Department has leaf vacuums and he has requested that they be prepared and operational before the leaf season. He did not know what condition that equipment was in. Mr. Ghiazza has loaned the Park Department's vacuum to the Highway Department. Whether leaves are bagged or not it is important for health, safety and welfare to have them picked up. He asked Mr. Seeger what he was doing in that regard and what assistance, if any, was needed from the Town Board.

Mr. Seeger said since early in October he had been picking up bagged leaves. He said that in the brochure sent out by the Town Board it was stated that all leaves must be bagged. Many people got that brochure and bagged the leaves. He said it had always been his belief that those who pay and break their backs bagging leaves should get first consideration. The leaf machines will go out. This will be done after the bagged leaves are picked up. This has always been our policy and unless the Town Board wishes to change it that is what we will do.

Supervisor Dusanenko said for those who are waiting, whether the leaves are bagged or not, Mr. Seeger made a suggestion which he also endorsed - making a compost heap in the backyard. He said there is another agency in the County which could supply you with information on how to compost and that is the Cooperative Extension. For those who do not want to do that you can receive, if you are a Town resident, a permit to utilize the Sanitary Landfill.

Mr. Seeger mentioned that he had heard comments that the Town of Ramapo picks up every week. According to their Highway Superintendent, Mr. George Conklin, it costs the taxpayers of Ramapo \$4,000,000.00 a year.
