RE: PROPOSED LOCAL LAW RE: COMMUTER PARKING LOTS

On motion of Councilman Lettre, seconded by Councilman Maloney and unanimously adopted, the Public Hearing was declared open. Town Clerk read notice calling Public Hearing and Town Attorney testified as to proper posting and publication.

Town Attorney gave a brief synopsis of the proposed local law. The Town would create the authority to regulate commuter parking areas. It would be unlawful to park without a permit issued by the Town Clerk. There would be a charge for this permit.

Supervisor asked if there was anyone wishing to speak.

He said he commuted to the city daily and was concerned about the long term facilities available for commuters. He remarked about using the old Theatre-Go-Round and stated that it was not a very safe area. He asked what future plans the Town Board had to provide some safety for bus commuters?

Supervisor stated there was a problem getting the Red & Tan Bus Lines into the Theatre-Go-Round property. He stated that we need a law to enforce our commuter parking as there have been problems in the past with the owners of property leased for this purpose.

Permanent parking is essential. He thought it unwise to charge commuters for their commuter parking. He felt the issue should be addressed by the County. In Clarkstown there is not sufficient parking and we have to address that problem immediately.

Mr. Martin Schaeffer asked what happens if we loose the Theatre-Go-Round and Supervisor said the commuters would be hurting. We do not have sufficient spaces. We must find someone who has the land and is willing to sell. We might have condemnation procedures but we would still have to find such property along bus routes.

Councilman Carey asked Mr. Schaeffer how many buses we have originating from the Theatre-Go-Round in the morning and Mr. Schaeffer said five.

On motion of Councilman Lettre, seconded by Councilman Maloney and unanimously adopted, thue Public Hearing was declared closed, RESOLUTION ADOPTED, time: 1:20 A.M. (January 23, 1985).
