Supervisor Holbrook declared meeting open. Assemblage saluted the Flag.

Supervisor welcomed everyone present on behalf of the Town Board to the annual Reorganizational Meeting and stated that the first order of business was the swearing in of new Councilwoman Ann Marie Smith. Mrs. Smith was then sworn in by her husband.

Councilwoman Ann Marie Smith read the following:

"It is with a deep sense of pride, accompanied by a feeling of humility that I take my seat as a member of our Town Board. The voters of Clarkstown have entrusted me with a great responsibility and I am determined to show concern for all the residents of our town by living up to the trust placed in me.

I can promise all of you tonight that I will work tirelessly on your behalf and that I will work very closely with my colleagues on the Town Board to achieve positive results for Clarkstown. I shall strive always to place public interest above personal interest.

During my 5 years on the Planning Board, I have shown that I can work cooperatively with others representing diverse backgrounds and opinions. Above all, I have learned to listen, study and evaluate before I act. I will continue to do this as a member of the Town Board.

What would I like to see accomplished during the next 48 weeks or so -- (I like that number 48...)

It would be foolish to tell you that I am going to perform miracles or solve all the problems confronting our town. I would hope, though, that we as a Town Board, along with the planners, will seriously address the housing situations facing the young, the single parent and the elderly.

I feel strongly about attracting clean rateables to our town and I would hope that we carefully examine uses for the remaining land available to us. And above all, in this coming year, I desire to work with my colleagues on the Town Board to expand communications between all the agencies and residents of our town.

I have no magic wand and I have no axes to grind. However, I do have high hopes, enthusiasm and energy to enable me to work with all of you for the place that is so important a part of all of us, Clarkstown. Thank you.

Supervisor Holbrook then recognized Dr. Mark Masch, Chairman of the Clarkstown Democratic Party, for the purpose of a presentation.

Dr. Masch stated that he had the pleasure of honoring Mrs. Smith and presented a plaque to her on behalf of the Clarkstown Democratic Party stating that she was the first woman to be elected to the Clarkstown Town Board.

Supervisor Holbrook then recognized Kenneth Zebrowski, Chairman of the Rockland County Legislature.

Mr. Zebrowski presented a proclamation of the Rockland County Legislature to Mrs. Smith declaring Tuesday, January 6, 1987 as Ann Marie Smith Day.

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Mr. Zebrowski then asked Legislator Harriet Cornell to present a Distinguished Service Award to Mrs. Smith in recognition of her years on the Planning Board. Legislator Cornell then made the presentation.

Supervisor Holbrook announced that there were many dignitaries present this evening and he introduced Sheriff of Rockland County Thomas Goldrick, Mr. Vincent Monte, Chairman of the Rockland County Democratic Party, Marie Geronimo, Clarkstown Receiver of Taxes, Theodore Dusanenko, former Supervisor of the Town of Clarkstown and former Senator Linda Winikow.

Supervisor Holbrook then gave his State of the Town message.

"STATE OF THE TOWN"

Dear Citizens of Clarkstown:

For the past year, it has been my privilege to serve you as Supervisor. It has also been my pleasure to work with an outstanding and dedicated Town Board. Last January, one of my goals was to put an end to political strife. While politics can never be totally eliminated from Town government, I believe that, during the course of this past year, the bipartisan effort of this Town Board has been most commendable. When there is progressive government, government is able to plan to serve the public and provide direction for the future.

Throughout the course of 1986, the Town Board demonstrated how well bipartisan government can function. It is my hope that we can continue the same cooperation throughout 1987, and I have no doubt that we will.

The achievements that the Town Board accomplished during 1986 are numerous. I would like to mention a few of them here. These are by no means personal accomplishments, but are accomplishments of the entire Town Board:

- 1) Most important was the rededication of this Town Board to enforce our zoning codes and declare war upon suburban blight. Our numerous Chapter 79 Hearings conducted throughout 1986 served notice on those who wantonly deface the landscape of this Town. Let it be known to everyone that Clarkstown residents will not tolerate public nuisances or eyesores and that this Town Board will continue to pursue code violators with greater vigor and bring them to justice in 1987.
- 2) The second issue this Town Board resolved during 1986 was the long debated Tunnel Bypass. Discussed for fifteen years, it will finally become reality in 1987. This accomplishment is an example of a Town Board working in harmony.
- 3) Another important achievement this Town Board has accomplished is to provide better coordinated highway services. We have paved numerous roads in this Town. We have added compactors for cleanups. We have dedicated ourselves to clearing our highways of junk and debris and, every weekend, we have located dumpsters in our hamlets so that debris which formerly had remained on our

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roads for months at a time is now placed in proper receptacles. This has been a tremendous saving to our taxpayers and has permitted our Highway employees to perform more work related to our highways. Finally, we have recently finished our most successful leaf cleanup in many years. While these achievements might appear mundane, they are the very services Clarkstown citizens expect their government to provide. As I have said before, this Town Board has dedicated itself to seeing that these services are provided.

- 4) This Town Board has addressed itself to the ever increasing traffic problems that plague our Town. This past year, we have upgraded traffic signalization and have erected traffic signs in every hamlet in this Town. Additionally, we have provided for another radar unit to better enforce our traffic laws. This Town Board has done more than any Town Board toward improving traffic safety.
- 5) The fifth thing I would like to bring to your attention is the computerization of Town Hall. Started years ago, this move is now near completion and 1987 will see numerous Town offices go on computer for the first time.
- 6) Another accomplishment of the Town Board was the successful negotiation of the CSEA contract. The settlement of the contract demonstrates that a satisfactory agreement can be granted to employees without excessively burdening the taxpayer.
- 7) Although we have had problems with our Police Department this past year, it was this Town Board's intention that corruption not be "swept under the rug." This Town Board faced the problems in our Police Department head on, sought viable solutions and proceeded to implement them. A politically divided Town Board would never have been able to do this.
- 8) The Town Board fulfilled its commitment to our Drug Awareness Program by the final remodeling of our Counseling Center. There is much discussion today about the drug problem that is so pervasive in our society. With the completion of our Counseling Center, the Town of Clarkstown has given more than "lip service" to the drug problems in our community. It is an example of our commitment to provide better drug awareness for our youth.
- 9) During the course of 1986, this Board has made a concerted effort to prevent illegal dumping at our Landfill. We have given notice to all carters that illegal dumping at our Landfill will not be tolerated. Again, this is an example of the cooperation

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between our Police Department, Sanitation Commission and Town Board.

- 10) Our Town Board has acted in a fiscally, prudent manner. The Town is in excellent financial shape. Through foresight and careful management, we have averted the insurance crisis faced by many municipalities. We will continue to dedicate ourselves to providing the best Town services, at the lowest possible cost.

In conclusion, I feel satisfied with my first year in office. There is much that has been achieved. There is still more that must be done. I recognize that achievements can be attained only with the cooperation of my colleagues on the Town Board. With their help and support, I look forward to improving upon our 1986 achievements in 1987."


