(DAYS OF OPERATION) OF CHAPTER 63 OF THE TOWN CODE -
(LANDFILLS)

On motion of Councilman Maloney, seconded by Councilman Smith and unanimously adopted, the Public Hearing was declared open. Town Clerk read notice calling Public Hearing and testified as to proper posting and publication.

Town Attorney said the affidavit of publication is on file in the Town Attorney's Office. The Town Attorney said that this changes the existing section, if adopted, 63.5 to authorize the Town Board by resolution to establish a schedule of public holidays when the landfill shall be open. Previously the local law called for the landfill to be closed on all public holidays and it presented a bit of a problem on some occasions.

Supervisor asked Mr. Bollman if he had any comment on this law.

Mr. Bollman said no problem with it other than it has been the request of many of the carters that they might determine the minor holidays in which they work. We have no objection to that. We hope that you would ask for a proviso that it is only for those licensed refuse trucks and not for residents.

The Town Attorney said that the proposed local law reads that the resolution authorizing the opening would be to accept solid waste from other than fee exempt persons.

Supervisor asked if there was anyone wishing to be heard positive or negative.

No one appeared.

There being no one wishing to be heard, on motion of Councilman Maloney, seconded by Councilwoman Smith and unanimously adopted, the Public Hearing was declared closed, RESOLUTION ADOPTED, time: 12:25 P.M.

Town Clerk stated that there was on file in the Town Clerk's Office an affidavit from the Deputy Director of the Department of Environmental Control testifying as to the benefit to surrounding property owners of this proposed extension.

Supervisor asked if there was anyone present wishing to speak in favor of the proposed extension.

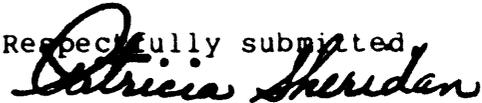
No one appeared.
