Supervisor declared Town Board Meeting open. Assemblage saluted the Flag. Town Clerk called the roll. Supervisor welcomed everyone present to this Reorganizational Meeting. He introduced the Rev. William Reynolds of St. Anthony's Church in Nanuet who gave the invocation.

Supervisor then called for the swearing in of the elected officials. Ralph Mandia was sworn in as Councilman by his wife.

Councilman Mandia said he was proud and delighted to be working with the men and women who work for the Town of Clarkstown as part of their team. He said he wanted to express that he is here to serve. He said he felt that this job is a serious one and he is going to treat it accordingly. He said he wants most of all to contribute to the effectiveness of his colleagues and to the other men and women who work for this Town to make it a better town for everyone. He also wanted to thank the people who made it possible for him to be here. It was an interesting experience for himself and his family. He stated that they had learned a lot both times when he ran for public office before. He said he now has a chance to make his family and his town and those people who supported him proud and he intends to do just that. He thanked everyone for being here tonight and said he was looking forward to working and serving everyone.

John R. Maloney was sworn in as Councilman by his wife.

Councilman Maloney said he wanted to thank his wife, Joan, and his family for putting up with his crazy schedule for the past sixteen years and to thank his wife for, hopefully, putting up with it for the next four. He said he was grateful for the trust and confidence the voters of Clarkstown have placed in him by returning him to the Town Board for the fifth time. He said he promised that he would not betray that trust and he will do all in his power to serve all of the people of the Town of Clarkstown. He said he promised that their concerns would be his concerns. He looked forward to working with Supervisor Holbrook and the other members of the Town Board as we move into the '90s. He said there are serious problems that have to be solved and he felt confident that all of us, citizens of the Town and members of the Town Board, if all of us work together and put aside our differences, we can and we must make changes and we must make this Town a better place to live in for you, for your children, and for our grandchildren.

Supervisor said that Councilman Maloney's election for the fifth time is a record since the position of Councilman was created back in the '30s. He said he did not think that any elected official of this Town has been in office that long.

Town Justices Victor Alfieri, Harry Waitzman and William Wray were sworn in by County Court Justice William Kelly.

Town Justice William Wray stated that he was more interested in justice now than he ever was before and he said he thought that would be seen in his performance over the next four years.

Town Justice Harry Waitzman extended his thanks to his wife and others who aided in his reelection and said it was not an easy job to be reelected. He discussed the amount of work involved in being a Town Justice. He stated that in effect the County Court

Judges are only handling criminal cases. Essentially, County Court of Rockland County has been stripped of all civil jurisdiction and all the cases are remanded to Justice Court. He discussed the proposed new Hall of Justice and said he would try to provide to the people of Clarkstown some informed estimate of a blueprint of what the Justice Court will look like ten or twenty years from now. He said they would have to decide whether there will be six part-time judges or four full-time judges. He reiterated that this was a side job he has undertaken and he will report to the other Town Judges and then they will report to the Supervisor.

Town Justice Alfieri thanked his wife Maria and the members of the Town Board. He also thanked the many people who worked on his campaign and the voters of the Town of Clarkstown. He pledged that whether we have a new courthouse or whether we are holding court in the back of a trailer somewhere behind the present courthouse he intended to work hard, be there, and work diligently on behalf of the people of the Town of Clarkstown.

Town Clerk Patricia Sheridan was sworn in by County Court Judge William Kelly. Mrs. Sheridan said she was very proud to have been endorsed by all of the major parties this year. She said she could not be sworn in by her husband, Arthur, as he suffered a minor heart attack on December 12th but he is doing fine and they have a lot to be grateful for in 1990.

Receiver of Taxes Marie Geronimo was sworn in by her son, V. J. Mrs. Geronimo said she is starting to serve her sixth year and would like to thank everyone. She stated that her office is open to the public and they are happy to serve anyone who needs their help. She said if they can be of any assistance they can be called at any time.

Superintendent of Highways John Mauro was sworn in by Town Justice Victor Alfieri. Mr. Mauro thanked his wife for her love, understanding and cooperation during the campaign. He also thanked the rest of his family who were present. He thanked the many people who worked with him on the campaign and who did so very much to make this event take place. He said he felt we have one of the finest highway departments in the State of New York and if it isn't the finest it surely will be by the end of two years.

Supervisor Holbrook then introduced former Councilman William J. Carey; former Councilman and Conservative Party Chairman, Nicholas Longo; Paul Adler, Town Democratic Chairman; Vincent Reda, Town Republican Chairman; former Councilman Edward J. Lettre; former County Court Judge Harry Edelstein; former Councilman John Lodico; and former Councilman Vincent Pizzutello.

Mr. Lodico wished all well in their new terms of office. He said he was appearing on behalf of the Independent Contractors Association of Rockland County. He presented new Councilman Ralph F. Mandia with a Town Legislative Guide which when he completes reading it and understanding it he is entitled to a Doctorate of Government. In cooperation with Cornell University he said it would save Mr. Mandia a lot of hours of research.

Supervisor then introduced Paul Adler, Chairman of the Democratic Party, for the purpose of making presentations. Mr. Adler said it was a pleasure and an honor to be present on behalf of the majority party. He said the people of the Town of Clarkstown have demonstrated that time and time again they are the party that cares. He asked Supervisor Holbrook, Councilman Maloney, Superintendent of Highways John Mauro, Judges Waitzman and Alfieri and the lady who is not a member of the party but who wins on their party line all the time, and even wins in Democratic primaries, Town Clerk Patricia Sheridan.

Mr. Adler then said he was happy to see so many members of the Clarkstown Democratic Committee Members and Executive Board

members here this evening. He presented awards to Supervisor Holbrook, Councilman Maloney, Judges Waitzman and Alfieri, Town Clerk Patricia Sheridan. He noted that the plaque to Mrs. Sheridan came not only with warm wishes but with an open invitation.

He presented an award to an underdog, Superintendent of Highways John Mauro, who, he stated, did a super job in this campaign. Mr. Adler invited each and every person present this evening to come upstairs to the Andrew Jackson Room after the Town Board Meeting for a light collation and socializing.

Supervisor Holbrook asked his wife to join him and Judge William Kelly swore him in as Supervisor. He thanked everyone who was in attendance this evening. He congratulated the newly elected councilman and all of the newly elected officials in the Town of Clarkstown. He said it is indeed an honor and he knew that all of their families were very proud of them.

Supervisor then gave the following address:

Dear Citizens of Clarkstown & Town Board Members:

"Today, the Town of Clarkstown officially enters the decade of the 1990's. The town is also on the verge of celebrating its 200th year of existence, which will take place in 1991. The 1990's will prove to be a most interesting decade. There are many challenges ahead, many problems to solve and it will take the commitment of our town government and the cooperation of our residents to meet all these challenges.

Probably, the most pressing issue at hand is that of solid waste. We are all aware that the town landfill must close some time in 1990. Fortunately, the Town Board of Clarkstown has prepared for this eventuality and the past year-and-a-half has seen the implementation of an effective recycling program which, as of yesterday, has been expanded to include all metal cans and by the end of this month include plastics. Recycling will be the key word or key phrase of the 1990's.

On Friday, December 29, 1989, the town made an important decision in approving a proposal to construct and operate a town transfer station. I believe that this facility will be the only solid waste facility constructed in Rockland County in the 1990's. It will provide for the disposal of solid waste for Clarkstown residents and Orangetown residents at least for the next decade, if not beyond. There is no doubt that the cost of transporting garbage to locations out of state will cost more. Already, this is reflected in the tax bills that went out last week. However, expanded recycling and reduction of our waste stream can limit a considerable portion of that expense and thereby reduce a good percentage of the tax burden. A major goal of this Town Board in 1990 will be to establish a minimum homeowner garbage rate per can so as to provide an economic incentive in order to maximize recycling and reduce costs for those who recycle more. The principle will be simple, reducing waste will reduce homeowner garbage costs. All of us must remember that the solid waste crisis did not come upon us overnight. There is no quick panacea. All we can do is move forward in a deliberate fashion to provide the methodology with which to safely dispose of solid waste in the years ahead. Already, the Town Board has had the foresight to do this and I look forward to improving the composting and recycling programs that we have already implemented these past years.

I mentioned earlier about our bicentennial. We are already preparing for this event. Just today, an article appeared concerning a publication sponsored by our Bicentennial Commission and funded by the town entitled, "So That All May Be Remembered," which recounts the history of cemeteries in the Town of Clarkstown. The town is indeed fortunate to have the cooperation and dedication

of those on the Bicentennial Commission who are now working diligently to insure that all residents of the Town of Clarkstown will indeed remember the past and preserve our heritage for generations to come.

In addition to our bicentennial activities, this year will see the expansion of town recreational facilities at Zukor Park in New City. The town has already completed lighted ballfield facilities at Germonds Park, and Zukor Park will be constructed along the same lines. In addition, Street School will be refurbished for our senior citizens and will enable our senior programs to be further expanded. 1990 will also see the completion of the Heaton's Pond Dam Project and the initiation of a similar project at Congers Lake. These projects are necessary not only for safety purposes but for their aesthetic value and the enhancement of our extensive park system.

At the present time, the town is also working to improve space here at Town Hall. Almost twenty years ago we moved into this building. For the first time, Clarkstown had all its offices under one roof. A generation has passed since then and the town has grown to the extent that expansion again is necessary. With the cooperation of the Town Board, we will see the initiation of a project to build a new police facility and Justice Court which will provide enhanced police and judicial services for a new generation of Clarkstown residents and, in addition, will free space here in Town Hall to better serve our departments and our public.

On a day-to-day basis, 1990 will see a rededication of the Town of Clarkstown to improve the appearance of our community. We have made progress in this endeavor in fits and starts over the past four years. However, with the revamping of our Building Department, we will see better coordination among our Code Inspectors, town officials and our Litter Control Bureau in bringing violators into compliance with town laws.

Probably the greatest thing we can look at with pride is that our town is still a town. It is not divided by a host of villages but is a governmental entity that is intact and, therefore, has the capability of dealing with issues on an effective basis. Our government serves 85,000 people. There is no question that there is strength in numbers. 1990 is the year for Clarkstown residents to be counted in the upcoming census. Individual participation in the census will insure that Clarkstown receives its fair share of attention from the state and federal government.

Finally, the highest goal of government is to represent their constituency with integrity and honesty. If we live by this rule, the problems of the 1990's, and there will be many, will not appear so difficult to solve. Clarkstown is unique in Rockland County because of its diversity and its beauty. It is our responsibility as elected officials to protect these qualities and pass them on for future generations of Clarkstown residents."

At this point Supervisor Holbrook announced that Councilman John Maloney would be the Deputy Supervisor and Mr. Martin Cohen would be the Town Historian.


