Assemblage saluted the Flag.

Supervisor declared Public Portion open.

He spoke with regard to his opposition to the IDA funding Pyramid.

Mr. Tracy stated that he is the attorney for Pyramid and he spoke regarding a misunderstanding that he has heard and read about in the press. He also spoke regarding the appropriateness of the IDA funding Pyramid and this being a pilot program.

Mrs. Cornell spoke regarding lack of information regarding the IDA and questioned the IDA's legal right to issue bonds for Pyramid. She also presented a statement regarding this which is on file in the Town Clerk's office.

Mr. Halpern spoke regarding Pyramid. He said that he was a bond salesman and spoke regarding how an improper perception can effect the bond rating.

She stated that the IDA funding of Pyramid was conceived subrosa and was an affront to people's sensibilities. She questioned the worth of the project.

Ms. Glynn also spoke in opposition to the \$145,000,000.00 funding of Pyramid and presented pie charts and graphs to illustrate her comments.

Mr. Rogish spoke regarding his garbage fee on his tax bill. He states he does not use a common carter. He asked the Town Board to reevaluate.

Mr. Dusanenko was there to protest his tax bill. He feels that it is illegal to collect money for the carters.

Ms. Fleisher spoke regarding the Planning Board appointment and recommended Alan Anderson.

Mr. Jerris said that he supported all the people who spoke in opposition to Pyramid and he too was opposed to the IDA funding.

Mr. Broadley spoke in favor of the reappointment of Joseph Centra and he spoke in opposition to the IDA funding and said the problems were just starting.

Mr. Bosco spoke in support of Joseph Centra's reappointment because he represents West Nyack. He questioned the handling of the garbage pick-up and billing. He asked about the Hackensack River Project and said he wants answers to his questions regarding IDA and also the widening of Route 59.

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Supervisor Holbrook gave the following State of the Town message:

"A year ago, the Town of Clarkstown made a decision to hire a firm for the construction of the solid waste transfer station. I am happy to report today that this station, located at our landfill, has received an operating permit and Clarkstown refuse is now being collected there and transported to permitted land fill sites in Pennsylvania. While we all know that the exportation of garbage out of state is not the ultimate solution to our solid waste problem, this new transfer station affords the Town of Clarkstown the ability to meet its solid waste needs for the next decade and beyond.

There is no question that other communities, especially in Rockland County, will need to avail themselves of our transfer station. Our station will be there to help those communities and, in turn, revenue generated from these communities will help to limit or reduce Clarkstown residence garbage costs in the future.

Throughout the construction of our transfer station last year, the Town of Clarkstown successfully negotiated two extensions to our land fill. These extensions, negotiated with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, enabled the Town to substantially complete the station so that it could operate on January 2, 1991. This negotiated extension saved the Town 1.2 million in sanitation costs for 1990; provided hundreds of thousands of dollars of additional revenue for the Town during the first four months of 1990; and enabled the Town to secure almost \$5,000,000. for the closing and remediation of the Clarkstown Landfill in the future.

It is estimated that the cost of closing the landfill could be in excess of \$30-million. The \$5-million that we have put in reserve will substantially reduce the 25% share of the cost of closing the landfill that the Clarkstown taxpayer will have to make up in the future. Additionally, most Clarkstown residents awakened on January 2nd and did not realize that garbage was being transported to Pennsylvania. Furthermore, they did not see any disruption or change in their garbage service. There was no garbage crisis on January 2nd, but rather a smooth transition from an unpermitted landfill facility to a new permitted transfer station.

History will prove that the course of action taken by the Town in regard to the landfill and the transfer station in 1990 was the responsible course to take.

At the end of 1990, there was another event that took place and that was the servicing by the Clarkstown Police Department of the portion of the Village of Nyack which is in the Town of Clarkstown. The addition of six police officers by our Police Department was smooth, supported by the Town Board, and will provide better service, both to our Nyack residents and our Clarkstown residents in general.

The issues mentioned above occurred in 1990, but what does the future hold for Clarkstown residents in 1991?

There is no question that there are serious problems with the economy here in New York State. It is up to this Town Board to carefully monitor expenses to avoid the financial problems that are plaguing many municipalities in our region. This will not be an easy task. With the slow down of the economy, there will be less revenue available. We are already aware that the State is attempting to resolve its financial problems at the expense of local government. However, I feel that this Town Board will be able to meet that challenge, as we have every other challenge in the past.

I am pleased to state that our financial situation is good, our infrastructure has been improved, we have provided for our

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garbage disposal and we look forward in 1991 to celebrate the two hundred birthday of our Town.

Oftentimes, I have been accused of looking at things through rose colored glasses, but one must be an optimist.

I foresee that 1991 will bring further expansion and improvement of our recycling efforts. With garbage being transported out of state, it is more important than ever to reduce our waste stream. In fact, we soon will be sending a letter to all Clarkstown residents setting forth a plan for solid waste collection system which will provide an economic incentive for those who reduce their waste. This is the first such plan in Rockland County and probably one of the first in New York State.

I see the Town Board, in 1991, looking to continue to improve our recreation facilities, particularly at Zukor Park. I also foresee the Town Board continuing their efforts to improve facilities here at Town Hall and a new police station for our Police Department. I foresee an expanding commitment by our Town Board to continue to improve our road network, which now approaches 400 miles of roads.

It will be a great year for Clarkstown -- 200 years of history, that dates Clarkstown to the earliest years of our republic. Our town today is 80,000 people strong (according to the census??) and growing. It is the business and governmental center of Rockland County. I am proud to be Supervisor of such a wonderful community and I know this Town Board can be proud of its achievements and will work to expand upon them in the year to come."

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Supervisor read a resolution regarding IDA funding for the Pyramid Mall.

Councilman Mandia said while he supports the resolution in principle he thinks the one big hole in it seems to be the \$725,000.00. He said if that is satisfied and they come up with the \$725,000.00 and insure that back to the Town that negates the resolution. He said it is a lot more than money we are talking about here. There is a big principle involved and if we are to rely upon the advice we have gotten so far from legal opinion and if we rely upon the advice given us by the counsel he said he did not think it was fair to debate the wisdom of whether the mall should be here or not. That was at another time for other people.

Councilman Mandia went on to say that the thing that needs to be considered by the Board now is whether or not we are acting in the peoples' best interests to recommend to the County whether or not this IDA funding should take place. He said he believes that the resolution should be amended to make sure that every single step that has been the concern of many people, and has been stated by the Pyramid people and their attorney, that we shouldn't worry about these things. They should guarantee there would be no loss in the mortgage tax. They should guarantee there will be no loss in the real property tax from the Town, from the villages, from the school districts and no risk of assumption of any losses on the bonding by the taxpayers of Rockland County and if the project defaults, an absolute guarantee that there will be no assumption of risks by the taxpayers in this County. As to no limiting effort by the IDA for future bonding. Will it or will it not? He said he gets conflicting opinions and that is why he is saying this resolution should include all of this. Will it limit their ability to fund in the future? Based upon testimony he heard tonight, he said he would like to make sure that the taxpayers of Rockland County never in fact take ownership of that property and assume risks that an ownership might bring with it. He recommended to his fellow Board members that if this Resolution could be so

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altered this evening, he would certainly move to pass it. He does not think that what they have is heavy enough to fully address the issue. The \$725,000.00 - is that solved? What does that mean? Does it mean that we now approve the funding?

Supervisor Holbrook stated that the resolution was basically self explanatory. Councilman Maloney said that he would agree with Mr. Mandia in terms of the fact that there are many many questions unanswered and certainly all of us here want to do what is best for the people of the Town of Clarkstown. He said there are so many diversions of opinions, you can't believe everything you read in the Journal News. You have to take every statement that was given here tonight with probably a lot of truth on both sides and he said that it would be premature to vote on this tonight and that is why last week we asked that this be tabled until we could discuss it at a workshop and we have not discussed at a workshop yet. He said there is lots of information that he would like.

Councilman Maloney said he would like to see some of the answers to the questions that Mr. Mandia raised. Councilman Maloney stated that we have heard statements from the people representing Pyramid and even Harriet Cornell had indicated that this has raised many legal questions and she would want our attorneys to really check on this. He said he wholeheartedly agreed with that and before he would vote on anything tonight, he would like to table as we had indicated last week until it can be discussed fully at a workshop and get all the information from all the experts, legal and otherwise, before we commit ourselves to voting on a resolution. He said he would vote to table it until a workshop.

Councilman Mandia said he was fully prepared and ready to vote for this resolution as it is right now. I would recommend to the Board, however, if it possible that it be expanded this evening to include these items.

Supervisor Holbrook said he would move it and Councilman Mandia could second it and then we could discuss those items.

Councilwoman Smith echoed a comment of Mr. Bruce Broadley "That he is glad that this happened." She thinks that they are all glad that this IDA came out because up until this point nobody on this Town Board knew that in projects past, we lost \$103,000.00 in mortgage tax that we would necessarily not have had to lose. She said that the overall theme tonight is that Clarkstown should not lose one tax dollar on any project because it is so desperately needed. She said that Mrs. Mittiga said something about IDA funding about \$90,000,000.00 for the County. Councilwoman Smith said she had asked for a list of what they had funded in Clarkstown and they have funded 20.6 million dollars in ten projects that she had listed, 70% of which are not new projects, but they were here and they were either for expansions or machinery.

Councilwoman Smith said she thinks the whole idea of IDA funding has to be understood totally and she would like to see a resolution passed that said in essence whatever project the IDA decides to fund, when it effects the Town of Clarkstown, we should know what the applications are, the amounts of them and they should not be granted until the Town of Clarkstown is satisfied that they will receive all their Town taxes and the mortgage tax due them. On the ten projects that she listed, \$206,000.00 was the total mortgage tax. We would have gotten 50% of that and she wonders why we never knew we could have had some of it. She said that the strongest resolution that should be sent over is that any project coming to us does not get passed by the IDA, which is ultimately their decision to pass it or not to pass it, without the satisfaction that the Town of Clarkstown receives every dollar it should have gotten.

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Councilwoman Smith said that Mr. Broadly brought up another point that maybe the IDA should not be in the funding business because it is only taking care of a few companies. She did not vote for the tax abatement to be reinstated because the most essential part of a company coming any place is location. Tax abatement does not bring them. If the market is there, they come. She said that she thinks we have a good region. We access major roads. We have a labor force. We have a lot of pluses here in Rockland County and in particular in Clarkstown. So, maybe the State should be looking at the overall tax structure to reduce the burden on both residents and commercials. She said she would like to proceed with the fact that we said we would discuss this fully at workshop. We invited the IDA to come and anybody else who has an opinion on this should also come. She said if they are to do a resolution tonight, then she would like to offer that it is for any application now or in the future that involves the Town of Clarkstown.

Councilman Kunis said that the key words here are fiscal responsibility and inducement. He said that one of the purposes of the tax abatement that this Board voted to reinstate some four or five months ago was based on the economic conditions of the national economy, the county economy and the Town's economy to induce corporate business to come to the Town. Induce them with the means of a 50% tax deduction over a period of ten years. When one reads this resolution, the key word is induce and again, there are no inducements necessary in this particular instance. The fiscal responsibility, one must base his decision on the economic climate nationally and countywise. What is fiscally responsible today? That is the decision that each Board member has to make. The decision that the IDA has to make and apparently they have made their decision and he said he thinks the Board has to decide and if Mr. Mandia or Mrs. Smith, if they have any kind of stronger language do you want to add to this resolution and you want to add it this evening and we can go over it because he said he has no problem with that.

Councilman Mandia said as he understood the content of the regulation or law or whatever it is he thinks the towns and the villages have the opportunity to vote to accept or reject one of these funding propositions if it in fact affects their tax collection and he said that is what scares him. If they can work out something where the mortgage tax is paid and make sure the schools and villages, etc. remain whole that is okay and it is taxes we wouldn't have anyway. The issue is are the taxpayers accepting the responsibility that if the project fails, are the taxpayers saddled with the responsibility? He said he was further concerned with comments made earlier about whether or not the responsibility for the property that is under it, whether it is a toxic waste dump or whatever, where does that lie? That is what concerns him the most - to protect the taxpayers in the county from owning that property in any way, shape or form or becoming responsible for the bonds. Those two issues alone he believed need to be in any resolution we pass.

Supervisor said he would move the resolution and asked for a second. Councilman Maloney asked as it is written right now? Supervisor said as it is written right now. Councilwoman Smith said not as it is written right now as things need to be answered. Councilman Maloney said not as it is written right now because certainly Mr. Mandia has raised a lot of questions and we have in terms of clarification. Maybe the type of resolution might be more inclusive and give more protection than this one here does and that is why he agrees with Mr. Mandia that it takes some time to incorporate some of the things that we all have concerns about and to come up with a better kind of resolution if that is what we want to do when we have all the facts. We are all concerned about protecting the people of the Town of Clarkstown, the taxpayers, with what Mr. Mandia has and with what some of us have. If that will do

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it, fine but we won't know that until we sit down and try to add to this or flesh this out and that is why he said he is not disagreeing with the fact that there should be a resolution but he said we should sit down and do it at a workshop where we have all the facts and we can look at this and see what order in which they should be written and which is priority and get answers to some of the questions that have been raised here tonight and even been raised by Mr. Mandia as he has just been talking. He said it would make sense to table it and discuss it at a workshop and then come out and vote on it where we fully have all the information and maybe come up with something that is even broader than this and certainly more inclusive than this and offers more protection than this does.

Councilman Kunis said he was prepared to vote tonight and he thinks his feelings have been made public in the newspaper. If we are going to have this - and I sent the Board a letter - I sent the Supervisor a letter - asking that representatives of the IDA come (Ms. Rivet) and we plan a special workshop meeting, set a date and get answers and vote on it.

Councilman Maloney said that makes sense. Councilman Kunis said based on what he hears from different board members he has to get answers. He said he has heard a lot of public comment tonight. He heard comments from the representatives of Pyramid. He said he is not against the zone change. He voted for the zone change. He has a problem with the arrangement that has been worked out with the IDA. He thinks the Board here certainly should have been consulted by the IDA and he just doesn't like the way the IDA handled the entire proposed funding of this project and he said we need answers. He said he was not saying that it is going to be too premature to vote on it tonight but there are many questions that each Board member has that have to be answered. He said he has a lot of questions too. He said he wants them answered within a certain time period.

Councilman Maloney said the next workshop is next week. Councilman Kunis said he wants to be sure that Miss Rivet is going to be at this meeting as she apparently is the attorney handling this and she apparently put this arrangement together. He said the taxpayers of Clarkstown in a fiscally responsible manner have to know how we are making our decision and we have to know not three or four weeks from now.

Councilman Maloney said he thinks the next workshop meeting is January 14th and there is no reason why we can't get the experts there to thrash it out and be prepared to vote on it once and for all.

Supervisor said then the resolution fails for lack of a second.

Councilman Mandia said he would second that resolution but he thinks it should be made stronger and we don't need ten weeks to do that.

Councilman Maloney said we are going to table it to make it stronger and that is the whole point. Not to table it to do away with it but to table it.

WHEREAS, the Rockland County Industrial Development Agency (I.D.A.) proposes to fund the Pyramid Project in West Nyack, New York, by the use of I.D.A. bonds, and

WHEREAS, such I.D.A. funding will result in the loss of an estimated \$725,000.00 in mortgage tax revenue to the Town of Clarkstown, and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose of I.D.A. funding is to induce businesses to locate to Rockland County, and the Pyramid Company needs no such inducement since they have already begun to establish their retail mall in West Nyack,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Clarkstown hereby goes on record as being opposed to the I.D.A. funding of the Pyramid Project.

Councilman Kunis said he was going to vote yes on this based on the fact that he still wants further investigation. He wants Ms. Rivet at a workshop meeting and if Councilman Mandia proposes that it be made stronger then of course we can review it and make it stronger in a week or so whenever Ms. Rivet comes.

Councilman Maloney said he was abstaining on this particular motion because it may not go far enough. It doesn't say anything and it doesn't offer the protection that he thinks we need. He said he would certainly want to discuss it with all the people including the people here and the experts from IDA before he votes on this because this may not be strong enough.

Councilwoman Smith said she was abstaining because it was not comprehensive enough.






