Co. Smith offered and Co. Maloney seconded

RESOLVED, that the salaries of all Town Officials and employees be fixed as per the attached Town of Clarkstown 1993 Salary Schedule, in accordance with the Budget adopted for the Year 1993, subject only to contract negotiations, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Town employees be paid on a bi-weekly basis to commence January 1, 1993, the first payroll to be paid on January 14, 1993, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the salary schedule hereby adopted as amended may be changed in accordance with law as determined to be appropriate by the Town Board.

Councilman Dusanenko stated that people in this Town have served for varying years but rules change when it involves different personalities. In his administration some of his colleagues bestowed pay cuts upon him. When new people come in of different political persuasions, of different spheres of influence in the Town, they are elevated. He said he could recollect when Mr. D'Antoni, performed extra services for which he was never compensated. There was also a situation where, when I was elected as Supervisor of the Town I filled out all of the necessary and proper forms for employment from the then Personnel Director and I was not even involved in the insurance program of this Town of Clarkstown until August of that first year. If I or my family had any medical catastrophe I would be bankrupt, because of my desire to serve the Town of Clarkstown, from either incompetence or people putting politics first. I, as a newly elected Supervisor of the Town, asked the then officials of the Town as well as the head of personnel,

and it wasn't Mrs. Loeffler because I supported her position way back then, to remove a lot of these inequities. I never, as an incoming Supervisor, received a salary schedule which I just received five minutes ago. I never received a list of any employees of the Town of Clarkstown and I was the CFO and still had to run a Town despite all kinds of personal and political constraints. Mr. D'Antoni was not rewarded with extra compensation. Also another person in this Town, and she will not scream on her own behalf, was also given incorrect information from the same employees of the same politically stacked personnel office and was not told that after time she would be able to be a Tier 1 or Tier 2 employee and that person has grieved but it would cost this Town about \$44,000.00 of extra compensation to return those funds to her to reduce that inequity and we can't do that because that person doesn't control much political muscle or is not in the right camp. There are people who have not received extra compensation. There are people who do the same job as others, if not harder, but when the sentiments are right we have to remove injustices for some people and for others they can whistle Dixie in any foreign language backwards and be on their hands and knees and they would still be slaughtered. I want no part of being part of shams, trade-offs or whatever and I am going to vote no.

Councilman Maloney said it doesn't make much difference whether a person received a dollar or five dollars because some people feel that person shouldn't get any increase in salary. The salary that was going to be appropriated two weeks ago, or a week ago if we had voted, was in excess of what the salary is now so in that last week due to negotiations the amount of money that Mr. Lettre is going to receive is about \$5,000.00 less than the amount he would have had if we had voted last week. The increase that everybody is getting is 8% based on the salary that they have as of January 1st. The reason for the additional \$4,500.00 is for the additional work, for the additional responsibility that Mr. Lettre is undertaking and also, as Mr. Holbrook mentioned and we found out just recently, he will be responsible for implementing the rules and regulations of the American Disabilities Act which is required by law. These are all being done in addition to his other responsibilities. The other people, the Town Board Members and the Supervisor, have not taken an increase for the last two years and we don't intend to. But there are people who do work in Town that I feel are entitled to receive the increase that has been recommended. You can believe what you want; you will probably do it anyway. I don't care what the person's political background is and I'm on the Board for twenty years - I voted increases for those from other political persuasions and I'll say it right now for the record: I don't care whether I get the Conservative endorsement or not because I haven't made up my mind whether I'm running or not. There is only once, in all the times that I've run, that I had Conservative endorsement because it was offered to me. Times before that I ran on a one party line. I never ran with Liberal endorsement. If I decide to run and if I have to run it may well be that I will run on one line but that is a decision that I have to make. A person's party has never mattered to me in the twenty years I am on this Board because I have appointed people to boards and commissions that I respect because of their integrity, because of what they have to offer to this Town and Mr. Dusanenko knows that. When I served with him we appointed people regardless of what political persuasion they were provided they wanted to work for the Town and were dedicated. That is how I feel and I vote in the affirmative.
