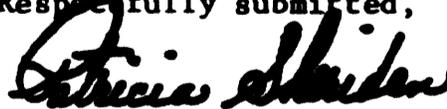

Town Clerk stated there was on file in the Town Clerk's Office an affidavit from the Director of the Department of Environmental Control testifying as to the benefit to surrounding property owners of this proposed extension.

Supervisor asked if there was anyone present wishing to speak in favor of this proposed extension.

No one appeared.

Supervisor asked if there was anyone present wishing to speak in opposition to this proposed extension.

No one appeared.

On motion of Councilman Maloney, seconded by Councilwoman Smith and unanimously adopted, the public hearing was declared closed, ORDER SIGNED, time: 8:51 P.M.
