Supervisor declared Organizational Meeting open.
Assemblage saluted the Flag.

Rabbi David F. Fass of Temple Beth Sholom gave the invocation

Supervisor Holbrook called upon the Democrat Chairman, Paul Adler to introduce some of the elected officials and have the Oath of Office administered.

Ann Marie Smith as Town Councilwoman was sworn in by Arthur Smith. Councilwoman Smith delivered the following statement: Thank you. I sincerely appreciate your support for re-election to the Town Board and for coming out tonight to witness and share with us the beginning of another term.

During this past campaign, the main issues brought to the public were the prudent planning and continuing progress in the Town of Clarkstown.

With accomplishments of securing 75% of the funds for the closing of the landfill; completion of the widening of Route 59; receiving \$500,000.00 from the sale of recyclables, improving sewer and leachate collection system; restoring Lake Lucille; providing the desired services of the Mini Trans, the Dare program, and outstanding recreational programs, we were still able to stabilize town taxes and maintain an "A" rating as reported in the most recent December 14th, Moody's Municipal Credit Report.

Overall the report is extremely positive about Clarkstown. When it speaks of our population makeup, we have a higher percentage of median age in Clarkstown than other NYC suburbs, NY State and overall United States. Our town has a higher percentage of school age residents which speaks well for our schools and we provide a higher working age population than the other three categories. Our median family income as well as our per capita income exceeds all the comparisons.

There is one statistic, however, that is disturbing. According to the most recent census, we have the lowest percentage of age 65 and over population than other NYC suburbs, NY State and the United States.

A certain percentage of "for sale" signs occur everywhere due to employment relocation and retirement. At retirement there is also a desire for relocation to warmer temperatures. These are personal choices for leaving Clarkstown. It's the other than personal reasons of the age 65 and older group that we must be concerned about.

Sixty cents of every tax dollar goes towards education. Every school administrator is striving to maintain expenses and most recently two school districts have settled contracts at an all time low. This is laudatory but it is not the answer for the age 65 and over population that sadly hangs out the "for sale" sign because their retirement income cannot support the taxes. It is not enough to say give the seniors a discount, because first-time home owners and the home owners of college age students cannot afford to pick up the difference.

During the campaign when I would espouse encouraging other than the property tax as the sole funding for education, the media although they are somewhat in agreement with the philosophy, they would respond to me by saying, "that is not a local issue". I strongly disagree with their statement.

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Residents feel very free to bring all their suggestions and complaints to elected officials on the local level. Since we also issue the tax bills, many of them believe we also set the school tax rate and they do not hesitate to share their financial situations with us.

Numerous communities and several states throughout the United States have started a sincere study of alternatives to property tax as the sole funding to education.

The Town of Clarkstown has a history of "firsts" in dealing with important issues. I believe funding for education is a most important issue and if there is any progress to be made, it will happen because of input on the local level.

The challenge for all of us is to move forward and find a solution to the current burden of sixty cents tax of every dollar for education. If progress is to be made, let it begin where all progress begins, let it begin in Clarkstown.

Louis Profenna as Town Councilman was sworn in by Honorable William Sherwood, Supreme Court Justice. Councilman Profenna thanked everyone for their support. This is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Councilman for the next four years.

Paul Adler recognized the following elected party and government officials in the audience: Judge William Sherwood, Judge Victor Alfieri of the Town Court; Nicholas Longo, Chairman of Rockland County Conservative Party; Tom Morahan, County Legislature from the Town of Clarkstown; Mary Loeffler, Town Chairwoman of the Clarkstown Conservative Party; Vinny Reda, Chairman of the Rockland County Republican Party; Cliff Fetter, Chairman of the Town Republican Party; Ken Zebrowski, Legislator Elect; Marie Geronimo, Receiver of Taxes; John Lodico, former Councilman and Steve Kunis, former Councilman

Paul Adler called on Joel Flick, Town Justice to be sworn in by Judge Victor Alfieri. Judge Flick thanked everyone for coming. He said that he will do the best that he can for the Town. He wished everyone a happy and healthy New Year and congratulated everyone else who has been re-elected or elected.

Superintendent of Highways, John F. Mauro, was sworn in by Judge Joel Flick. Mr. Mauro thanked everyone who supported him for the past several years. He thanked his wife and family for their support.

Patricia Sheridan, Town Clerk, was sworn in by Judge William Sherwood. Patricia Sheridan thanked everyone for being here. She also thanked her family. She said that she will continue to serve humbly, efficiently and effectively.

Paul Adler called on Judge William Nelson to swear in Councilmen Mandia and Maloney as Members of the Clarkstown Police Commission.

Paul Adler stated that it is appropriate to mention that Supervisor Charles Holbrook has not only set a course for this Town and maintained fiscal responsibility, but has created an air in this Town that Clarkstown is the place to live in in Rockland County. Clarkstown has moved forward and Clarkstown has continued to do things and to make things happen when others have stayed stymied and unable to move out of their own way. The Town of Clarkstown's leadership on a day to day basis is doing great with Charlie's hands on manner and style. Mr. Adler is very proud that Charles Holbrook has served as Supervisor, as Chairman of our Legislature and as a County

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Legislator. Paul Adler Called on Judge Victor Alfieri to swear in Supervisor Holbrook.

Supervisor Holbrook thanked everyone and stated that it is a pleasure and privilege to be back and serve as Supervisor for the next two years. The Supervisor then told of another Supervisor whose name was Ray Brinkerhoff who came from Rockland Lake. He served as Supervisor from 1906 to 1933 with one interruption for two years. A few years ago when Charlie Maneri was our Maintenance Supervisor he found two bronze plaques made in 1936. One was to Raymond Brinkerhoff, Supervisor and the other was to Judge Arthur Thompkins who was a State Supreme Court Justice who came from the Town of Clarkstown. There were holes in the four corners and they looked like they were to be have been mounted in a building. There was no Town Hall until 1958 or 1959. These plaques must have gotten lost and Charlie Maneri brought them up to my office and asked me what I wanted done with the plaques. I told Charlie to leave them in my office and we would keep an eye on them. About two years ago, there was an obituary in the paper of a Mrs. Brinkerhoff. She had died in Florida. She was 93 years old. She happened to be the wife of the Supervisor who had died in 1933. She had been his widow for 60 years. The Supervisor said he did not believe it at first so he called up George Farber from McGowan's in Congers and told him about the bronze plaque. The Supervisor suggested that Mr. Farber offer the bronze plaque to the family and the family said they wanted the plaque. The plaque was then returned to the Brinkerhoff family. Supervisor Brinkerhoff was the longest serving Supervisor and Supervisor Holbrook believes he is the second. Clarkstown indeed is, in Supervisor Holbrook's view, the center of Rockland County, the center of business, the center of government. It is the Town to live in. It is the Town where things are happening. We have a vibrant Town Board. No Supervisor can operate without the support of the Town Board and I have had that support regardless of the political affiliations of the people that serve. I know each and every person here and I know their qualities. They are excellent. We are indeed fortunate to have people here like that. In addition, we are fortunate to have the people working for the people of Clarkstown in Town Hall. Certainly, if you want to know the quality of an administration, take a look at the people that work for that administration. I am not the fountain head of all knowledge nor the progenitor of all ideas. A lot of those ideas and suggestions come from the people who work in this building. If you measure us against some of the things that are going on in other towns, we have been well served by their counsel and advice over the years. We should all be proud of the Town that we are in. I am certainly proud to serve as Supervisor. My family is proud to be associated with the Town of Clarkstown for so many years. I look forward to the next two years. To moving Clarkstown forward towards the 21st century in keeping Clarkstown vibrant, keeping the problems under control, to find solutions and not try to place blame and find fault. We have a lot of that today. Everybody is quick to find fault, but not so quick to find the solution to the problems. We have a big problem coming up and that is County-wide reassessment. Supervisor Holbrook's said it is in his view the most important issue that Rockland County will face in the next few years. Everybody talks about taxes. If you want to do something about it, you have to support County-wide reassessment. Clarkstown has been in the forefront of this issue as Clarkstown has been on many, many other issues. The Supervisor thanked everyone and stated that he appreciated the support and the confidence of the citizens of Clarkstown and looks forward to serving as Supervisor for the next two years.

- (h) Cranes and derricks;
- (i) Forklifts;
- (j) Cement Mixers;
- (k) Dump trucks (including garbage trucks);
- (l) Refrigerated trucks;
- (m) Tractors;
- (n) Combines;
- (o) School buses used as such;
- (p) Qualified moving vans;
- (q) Qualified specialized utility repair trucks;
- (r) Officially authorized use of unmarked vehicles by law enforcement officers.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN
NEW YORK, ADOPTED JANUARY 2, 1996, AUTHORIZING
THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS EQUIPMENT FOR USE

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RESOLUTION NO. (17-1996) Continued

BY THE TOWN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$1,000,000 APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,000,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID TOWN TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Clarkstown, in the County of Rockland, New York (Herein called "Town"), is hereby authorized to acquire various equipment for use by the Town Highway Department. The estimated maximum cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$1,000,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$1,000,000 serial bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$1,000,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

(a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which the serial bonds authorized pursuant to this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 28. of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

(b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

(c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five years.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocable pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.


