Supervisor declared the Town Board meeting open. Assemblage saluted the Flag.

Judge Victor Alfieri administered the Oath of Office to Supervisor Charles E. Holbrook

Supervisor Holbrook stated the following: We all survived the Y2K problem. As it turned out, there were no problems in Clarkstown, and few elsewhere, but that doesn't mean that there was no potential for problems. What it means is that people prepared for Y2K. They anticipated what difficulties might arise and they planned and worked to eliminate any chance of them occurring. Had there been any emergencies, the Town of Clarkstown was ready to handle them. The Police Department had an updated plan that included all departments in the Town. We were, as always, well prepared.

This attention to preparation was best demonstrated back in September when there was a natural disaster in the form of Hurricane Floyd. The Police Department, the Highway Department, the Department of Environmental Control and other departments throughout the Town acted in concert to swiftly mitigate the damages. They were there to assist the residents of Clarkstown so there was no panic. At this time I would like to mention once again the efforts of Greg Tobin, the Town's Emergency Coordinator. He did an outstanding job during and following that storm.

As we make the transition from the 1900s to the year 2000 and beyond, we can look back with satisfaction, and we can look forward with confidence. The Town is in fine financial shape with a bond rating of A1, which demonstrates that stability. The Police Department is well trained and outfitted, our roads and other infrastructure are in good condition or already in the process of being updated, and we have employees who know their jobs and take their responsibilities seriously.

With all those essential conditions already in place, the Town can move ahead by continuing plans for comprehensive planning that will include beautification, hamlet revitalization, historic preservation and the protection and acquisition of open space. These are issues that there can be no disagreement on and you can expect that all the Town Board members will work together to accomplish these objectives. Let's consider each of these objectives separately

1. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 1999. It is a blueprint for the future of Clarkstown, but while that plan is excellent, it needs additional attention so that it can be implemented and not just put on a shelf to gather dust. I pledge to turn the goals of the Comprehensive Plan into realities.

2 BEAUTIFICATION

The beautification of our community is of utmost importance. It affects the quality of our lives. Our Highway Department, under the very able direction of Highway Superintendent Wayne Ballard will continue to work with the Keep Rockland Beautiful organization to fight litter and improve the scenery along the roadsides. We need the cooperation of everyone. We must spread the word that a clean and litter-free Clarkstown enhances the pride we already have in our homes and our community.

3 HAMLET REVITALIZATION

The need for hamlet revitalization has become increasingly apparent as shopping malls have taken the place of downtown areas. Therefore, we have already begun to

work with civic groups, Chambers of Commerce and others who have an interest in enhancing the uniqueness of each hamlet. Their ideas must be formulated into plans that will put new life into the hamlet centers. (New City, Congers, Valley Cottage, etc.)

4 HISTORIC PRESERVATION

The protection and acquisition of open space seems to now be in the forefront of everyone's minds. At the same time, there seems to be a misconception that there is nothing left to protect. That is far from the truth. The most sensitive areas are still undeveloped and we need to work to protect them - the mountain tops (Tilcon), the wetlands and the views that we tend to take for granted. The Town Board recently acquired two of these areas: property adjacent to Heaton's Pond and a wetlands area in the West Nyack hamlet center. We hope to have cooperation from county officials to protect and acquire additional properties in the years to come.

Clarkstown has planned and progressed with the times. This town is the best in Rockland County and the best in New York State. Together we will strive to protect and enhance it for the generations that follow.

Arthur Smith administered the Oath of Office to Councilwoman Ann Marie Smith

Councilwoman Smith stated the following: As the year 1999 came to an end, the whole world was apprehensive about Y2K. What would happen, how bad would it be, should I leave my home? No disasters occurred. In fact, minutes after midnight FAA Chief, Jane Garvey, reported to the President the same message the pioneer Wright Brothers sent nearly 100 years ago. Success....stop. Inform press....stop.

Tonight, I am happy to inform you that Clarkstown is up and running safely and efficiently as we begin the Year 2000. Clarkstown is the New Zealand of the County, the first to see and implement new programs and technology to better serve our residents. We are once again at double zeros with the opportunity to build and even better Clarkstown.

Can we improve? Of course, we can. I pledge to continue to work with the Town Board and all the citizens of this town to ensure an environment that we can be proud of and a quality of life that will allow grandchildren to say, "I'm glad my grandparents made Clarkstown our home."

Let's be proud of the accomplishments that have been made in past years. Let's look at the good things in this town and build a future upon all that is wholesome and positive. Let's continue to keep Clarkstown one of the safest places in the nation. Let's keep our Police Department trained to be second to none. Let our Park and Recreation programs remain the envy of many communities. Let's improve our transportation. Let our Comprehensive Plan design the balance of our available land.

Just as dire predictions did not come true on January 1, 2000, dire predictions about Clarkstown will never come true because an extraordinary number of individuals are always working for positive results. Let's continue to do that work together. Thank you for your support. Happy New Year to you and your families.

Her goal is to make sure that the citizens of Clarkstown's voices are heard. There is still a lot of open space in Clarkstown and we have to, in the next six months during the moratorium, make sure an open space referendum is crafted and the people get a chance to vote on what open space they would like to preserve. Another thing we have to do is revitalize the hamlets and have an on going program where we all work together as a community and enforce the

- (l) Refrigerated trucks;
- (m) Tractors;
- (n) Combines;
- (o) School buses used as such;
- (p) Qualified moving vans;
- (q) Qualified specialized utility repair trucks;
- (r) Officially authorized use of unmarked vehicles by law enforcement officers.

AMEND §290-3. Definitions, to add the following definition of "Child Day Care Center"

"CHILD DAY CARE CENTER - A facility licensed by New York State pursuant to the Social Services Law that provides care for seven (7) or more children, for more than three (3) and less than twenty-four (24) hours per day, in premises other than the residence of a care provider, and for children between the ages of 6 weeks to 12 years of age."

Amend Table 10, Table of General Use Regulations for LS District, Column 3, Item B, by adding new item B "2" to read as follows:

"B-2. Child Day Care Center, subject to site plan approval by the Planning Board, which approved site plan shall accompany the application for special permit."

Amend §290-17. Additional requirements for certain special permit uses, by adding article "Z" as follows:

"Z. Child Day Care Centers, subject to the following conditions:

1. Licensing. The Child Day Care Center must be licensed under the provisions of the NYS Social Services Law or successor agency.

2. Application Narrative. The special use permit application shall be accompanied by a narrative description of the anticipated occupancy of the facility by age group, i.e., infant, toddler, and school age, the hours of operation of the facility, staffing, food service and sanitary provisions.

3. Floor Plan. A preliminary floor plan of the child day care center shall be submitted.

RESOLUTION NO. (65-2000) Continued

4. **Parking.** One parking space shall be provided for each 350 square feet of gross floor area, exclusive of exterior play areas. Additional parking spaces shall be provided for drop-off and pick-up of children at a rate of one (1) parking space per thirty (30) children. Said spaces shall be provided directly in front of the facility along an internal driveway or in an approved parking area. The most appropriate location for drop-off parking shall include a consideration of emergency access, and shall be determined by the Planning Board during site plan review. The drop off location shall be clearly posted with appropriate signage or pavement markings. Fire lanes shall not be used for drop-off areas. Staff shall have separate parking; one space for every two at peak time.

5. **Outdoor play area.** A minimum outdoor play area of one hundred twenty-five (125) square feet per child under three (3) years of age, or per child three and over, whichever is greater, shall be provided. Outdoor play areas shall be located a minimum distance of twenty-five (25) feet from any lot line or from any parking area, and fifty (50) feet from any public right-of-way, provided, however, that the Planning Board may vary this requirement on a case-by-case basis to ensure that play areas are adequately screened and buffered from vehicular areas. Outdoor play areas shall be directly accessible from the principal structure, and shall not require crossing any street, driveway, or parking area for access. The Planning Board may, as part of site plan review and in consultation with the prospective operator, modify the area requirement to apply only to the largest age group enrollment scheduled to use the outdoor play area at one time.

6. **Minimum indoor play area.** A minimum indoor play area of thirty-five (35) square feet per child shall be provided in accordance with the New York State Social Services Law regulating child day care centers. Areas used for large motor activity, staff lounges, storage spaces, halls, bathrooms, kitchens and offices shall not be included in the calculation of the thirty-five (35) square feet per child requirement.

7. **Noise and Visual Screening.** Operation of a child day care center shall be conducted in a manner which minimizes any impacts to adjoining residential uses or residential zoning districts. In particular, noise shall be minimized and visual screening shall be provided. Outdoor play areas shall not be located in any required buffer area. The Planning Board shall determine the appropriate combination of materials to buffer and screen the center, which may include a combination of berm, fence and landscape materials. Consideration shall be given to situating the building on the site to attenuate and block noise generated by traffic and the outdoor play area.

8. **Ingress and Egress.** Said facility shall provide a minimum of two (2) exits.

9. **Other Standards.** Child day care centers shall adhere to the requirements of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code, as well as all other applicable sanitation, health and traffic safety code requirements.

10. **Multi-Story Buildings.** If the child day care facility is part of a multi-story building, any floor being used that is part of a multi-story building, shall have ground level entry.

11. **Hallways** with a length of twenty (20) feet or greater between the building exterior and the child day care center shall be prohibited.

12. **Traffic Considerations.** Due to the special occupancy of a child day care center, a center shall be situated on properties which afford safe internal and external traffic circulation. In order for the Planning Board to make this determination, a traffic impact study may be required with the special use permit application and shall include, but not be limited to: a traffic capacity analysis, sight distance calculations, study of internal traffic circulation. The study shall include the submission of traffic data from existing comparable facilities. The Planning Board may impose reasonable conditions, including but not limited to restrictions on traffic flow and direction into and out of the center, based on the results of the traffic impact study.

13. Security. A child day care center may be developed in a location where it abuts office or retail space that is transient in nature. To ensure adequate safety to the occupants of the child day care center, the applicant shall demonstrate that reasonable measures may be implemented to secure the center from entry by persons other than employees, children being cared for, and their parents or guardians. Security measures may include, but are not limited to, appropriate locations for lighting, and internal security systems."
