Supervisor Holbrook declared the Town Board Meeting open. Assemblage saluted the Flag.

Judge Victor Alfieri administered the Oath of Office to Supervisor Charles E. Holbrook.

Supervisor delivered the following State of the Town address:

Good evening.

It's a little hard for me to believe that I am beginning my tenth term as Clarkstown Supervisor and beginning my twenty-ninth year on the Clarkstown Town Board.

I am proud, and yet also humbled, by the confidence the people of Clarkstown have shown in me.

While I have been in office for a long time, each term has been a little different than the one before it. And each term has presented new challenges. Some of those started as environmental concerns, such as those that led to the implementation of a town-wide recycling program, the closure of the town's landfill, and the construction of the town's transfer station.

Others have been necessitated by the town's growth, such as the need for the "new" – although now ten-year-old – police and courts building. Still other challenges have been brought about by residents who demanded more in the way of recreational facilities and programs. In response, Zukor Park, the Pascack Community Center, and other facilities and ball fields were developed, new senior clubs were formed, and activities were expanded for residents of all ages.

Progress can be expensive, however, and it requires balancing the fulfillment of residents' desires with the budgetary consequences that follow. Therefore, I have worked to set a pace for accomplishing these goals in a way that has avoided more than gradual tax increases throughout the years.

It was those financial realities that were again foremost on my mind when contemplating the town's Comprehensive Plan that was adopted in 1999. That plan, while not written in stone, provides for controlled growth – the kind that allows for future development, but not the kind of development that would permit massive increases in population and the subsequent additional financial burdens that would fall to all town taxpayers.

Likewise, taxpayers were foremost in my mind when the town's Open Space Acquisition Program was designed. It not only provides more parkland and protects environmentally sensitive areas and views, but it is also a way to simply remove some properties from development. For, in the long run, taxpayers save money when more properties remain in their natural state.

The future will bring more acquisitions of open-space properties. This is an on-going project that requires identifying, negotiating for, and purchasing the properties that will best meet the objectives of the program. Some of these properties require environmental

reviews for various reasons, including verifying the appraisals. All this takes time. It will take several more years to complete this project.

Meanwhile, there is no end to the other issues that must be addressed. Just about everything in our society is more complex these days, and this is the wave of the future. For example, security measures – well beyond what could have been anticipated a few years ago – are ever being increased.

And while, our town has been rated by Morgan Quitno Press as one of the safest communities in the nation, and while our Police Department is exceptionally well trained and equipped to cope with just about any emergency, I fervently hope there will be no need to put that training and equipment to use.

Another matter that is changing with the times deals with liability concerns.

Lawsuits are ever more common. At the same time, insurance policies are more difficult to secure, they have more exclusions, and they have become more expensive. There is virtually no competition in this field. The truth is that insurance companies are reluctant to insure municipalities anymore, and when they do, they offer insurance that is less comprehensive than what was offered in the past. This has led to the town self insuring smaller claims and handling them "in house." We now have an Insurance and Claims Manager on staff to process those claims, and he works with our attorneys to fight frivolous lawsuits.

Additionally, there are other types of litigation against the town that are more and more frequent. These arise when property owners sue the town when they disagree with decisions of the Town Board, the Zoning Board, or the Planning Board. These lawsuits can take months or even years to defend. Common sense and logical judgment are no longer adequate when boards make decisions. Instead, every decision of every board and commission must be reviewed in advance and often reworded by attorneys in anticipation of court challenges.

Using this same line of concern, we are planning tonight to replace the position of Director of Purchasing with an attorney. This appointment will not only save the town money, but it will ensure that all our bidding procedures, bid awards, and vendors' contracts are legally sufficient to protect the town's interests.

These precautions help to avoid litigation, and therefore protect the town's excellent financial status: Clarkstown is rated "Aa3" by Moody's and rated "AA" by Standard and Poors. I personally worked to earn these high ratings for the town, and I will personally work to keep them from ever falling.

In 2004 the town will see the implementation of many improvements to the infrastructure of our hamlet centers. Projects in Congers, Valley Cottage, West Nyack, and New City will make our hamlets more pedestrian friendly, and they will encourage businesspeople to invest in improving and upgrading their properties.

There are also improvements that must be made to the roads surrounding Palisades Center. Our Highway Superintendent has outlined a course of action that will identify ones that are needed for long-term safety, as well as for convenient ingress to and egress from the mall. These improvements, once carefully identified, need to be completed by the owners of Palisades Center and not by Clarkstown taxpayers, and I will continue to work with Wayne Ballard to assure that they become a reality.

During my terms of office, a lot has been accomplished, but there is always more to be done. On this past Election Day, voters determined that they have come to expect more of a bipartisan approach to protecting the best things about Clarkstown, while continually improving areas that need more attention. And I believe this Town Board will unite in an unprecedented way to accomplish these goals.

However, we cannot think of everything.

In this regard, I continue to welcome new ideas from residents who see government from a perspective that comes from outside of Town Hall. Likewise, I encourage all town employees to submit their suggestions to make government more efficient and cost effective in ways that they are uniquely qualified to identify.

Meanwhile, in return for the support I have been shown, I pledge to continue my efforts to keep our town – Clarkstown – the best town in Rockland County and the best town in New York State.

Judge Victor Alfieri administered the oath of office to Co. Shirley Lasker. Co. Lasker thanked the voters for their support and her parents for the fine example they set for her.

Judge Craig Johns administered the oath of office to Co. Catherine Nowicki. Co. Nowicki stated that this Town Board intends to live up to their promises and said she was honored to serve the Town.

Judge Craig Johns administered the oath of office to Patricia Sheridan, Town Clerk. Mrs. Sheridan thanked her family and the voters of Clarkstown for their continued support. She promised continue to serve the people of Clarkstown.

Judge William Kelly administered the oath of office to Town Justice Joel J. Flick. Judge Flick stated that he loved his job because he can make a difference. He thanked his family, all of his supporters and the people of the Town.

Judge William Kelly administered the oath of office to Wayne T. Ballard, Superintendent of Highways. Mr. Ballard thanked his family and his supporters. He thanked the people for giving him the opportunity to serve them for another two years.
